'Krishi Sakhi / CRP Training' Program

- **♦** Why in News?
- Recently, a five-day 'Krishak Sakhi/CRP Training' program was organized by the Rajasthan Agriculture Department under the National Natural Farming Mission at Shri Karan Narendra Agricultural University, Johner.

Main Point

National Natural Farming Mission:

- On November 25, 2024, the Union Cabinet approved the launch of 'National Mission on Natural Farming' (NMNF) as a standalone centrally sponsored scheme under the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare.
- Natural Farming: It is an agricultural method in which farming is done without using chemical fertilizers, pesticides or other artificial chemicals. In this method, the fertility of the land is maintained using natural resources and traditional agricultural techniques.
- Objective of the scheme: To promote natural farming and sustainable agriculture in mission mode across the country and reduce the use of chemical fertilizers.
- **Associated Ministry:** Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare.
- Under this mission, farmers will be made aware to do natural farming as chemical free farming through traditional knowledge, which will include local livestock, integrated natural farming methods and diverse crop systems etc.
- This mission will be implemented in 15 thousand clusters of all the willing **Gram Panchayats of the country.**
- Under the scheme, about 2000 natural farming models will be established at Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVK), Agricultural Universities (AU) and agricultural lands.

- Main Point
- The Vice President submitted his resignation to President Draupadi Murmu under Article 67 (A) of the Constitution.
- Jagdeep Dhankhar was born on May 18, 1951 in a Jat family in Kithana village of Jhunjhunu district.
- College Education: Maharaja College, Jaipur.
- LLB (1978-1979) from Rajasthan University.
- **Year 2019 Appointed Governor of West Bengal.**
- August 11, 2022 Sworn in as the 14th Vice President of India.

National Cooperative Policy 2025

- **♦** Why in News?
- On July 24, 2025, the Union Home and Cooperative Minister unveiled the 'National Cooperative Policy 2025' in New Delhi.



- **→** Main Point
- Policy Draft: A 48-member national level committee headed by former Union Minister Suresh Prabhakar Prabhu prepared the new National Cooperative Policy.

Objective:

- To revive and modernize the cooperative sector as well as to realize the vision of 'Prosperity through Cooperation' by creating a roadmap at the grassroots level.
- To make cooperative institutions inclusive as well as to manage them in a professional manner.
- To create employment and livelihood opportunities.
- This policy will replace the country's first National Cooperative Policy 2002.
- The new cooperative policy will strengthen the cooperative movement of India for the next two decades i.e. from 2025 to 2045.

Important Provisions:

- The new policy aims to establish at least one cooperative society in every panchayat.
- Emphasis has been laid on promoting professional management by making the country's 8.42 lakh cooperative institutions competitive and transparent.

- It covers inclusion in sectors such as banking, investment, insurance, post and pension.
- Its purpose is to measure the extent of financial inclusion in India.

 - 0 value means Complete Financial Exclusion
 - 100 value means Fully Included
- No Base Year: This index is prepared without any base year.

■ Recently, the 'Henley Passport Index 2025' was published by global citizenship and residency consulting firm Henley & Partners.



Main Point

- India is ranked 77th in the Henley Passport Index 2025, as against 85th in 2024.
- Now people holding Indian passports can travel to 59 countries without a visa, or can get a visa after reaching those countries.
 - o 19 countries in Africa.
 - 18 countries in Asia.
 - 10 countries in North America.
 - 10 countries in the Oceania region.
 - 1 country in South America.
- Improvement in Pakistan's ranking:
 - Pakistan is now ranked 96th.
 - Last year (2024) its ranking was 101st.



- According to the Tiruvalangadu copper plates, the lake was the 'Victory Pillar of Water', built by Rajendra Chola I.

The country's first Hornbill Conservation Center

○ Why in News?

The Tamil Nadu government recently announced the setting up of the country's first Hornbill Conservation Centre of Excellence at the Anamalai Tiger Reserve in Coimbatore district.



Main Point

- Hornbills, called 'farmers of the forest' due to their seed dispersing ability, play a vital role in the ecological balance of forests.
- However, the species is endangered as a result of deforestation, habitat loss and climate change.
- The newly established centre will strive to conserve four hornbill species found in the Western Ghats the Great Hornbill, the Malabar Grey Hornbill, the Malabar Pied Hornbill and the Indian Grey Hornbill.

The Great Hornbill:

- **■** Found in the Western Ghats and Himalayan region.
- **IUCN conservation status: Vulnerable**
- **In CITES Appendix I.**
- In Schedule I of the Wildlife Protection Act 1972.

Malabar Grey Hornbill:

- It is mainly found in the Western Ghats.
- **IUCN Conservation Status: Vulnerable**

Malabar Pied Hornbill:

- It is found in the evergreen forests and moist-deciduous forests of India and Sri Lanka.
- **IUCN Status Endangered**

Indian Grey Hornbill:

- It is found in the foothills of the Himalayas.
- **IUCN Status Least Concern**

Facts for Prelims: *

Hornbill Bird:

- It is a bird of the Bucerotidae family, which is found in the tropical and subtropical regions of Asia and Africa.
- There are 9 species of it found in India, which are found in the Himalayas, Northeast and Western Ghats as well as the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.
- Hornbill is the state bird of Kerala.
- Hornbill Festival is celebrated in Nagaland.

- It has a length of about 0.57 kilometres and a maximum width of 0.28 kilometres.
- The island is surrounded by a large lagoon of about 45.61 square kilometres.
- According to the 2011 census, Bitra has a population of 271.
- Most of the people depend on fishing and coconut cultivation.
- It will support the INS Dweeprakasak (Kavaratti) and INS Jatayu (Minicoy) naval bases.
