### Rajasthan's performance in Swachh Survekshan Award 2024-25

- **○** Why in News?
- On July 17, 2025, President Draupadi Murmu honored Dungarpur with the "Super Swachhata League" and Jaipur with the "Promising Clean City" award at the national stage at the Swachh Bharat Mission 2.0 award distribution ceremony held at Vigyan Bhavan in New Delhi.

#### **Main Point**

- For the first time, three cities of Rajasthan, Udaipur, Jaipur Greater and Jaipur Heritage have been included in the top 20 clean cities, in which Jaipur Greater was ranked 16th and Jaipur Heritage 20th.
  - This time both the corporations have jumped 151 ranks as compared to last year. Last year, Heritage Corporation was ranked 171st and Greater was ranked 173rd.
  - Both the municipal corporations of the capital were given this honor in the category of cities with a population of more than 10 lakh.
  - Certificate has also been awarded in Jaipur Greater Water Plus.
- 12 cities of Rajasthan Udaipur, Jaipur Greater and Jaipur Heritage, Bikaner, Bhilwara, Alwar, Jodhpur North and South, Kota North and South, Ajmer and Sikar have been included in the top 100 clean cities of the country.
- Four cities of Rajasthan Udaipur, Rajakheda, Jaipur Greater and Heritage have also received GFC (Garbage Free City) three star rating.
- Under the Amrit Yojana, Dhelawas, Jaipur STP has been selected as the best practice under the Urban Ministerial Conference.
- With this, the number of ODF cities in Rajasthan has increased from 17 to 38 i.e. almost doubled.

### **Ranthambore Tiger Reserve**

- **♦** Why in News?
- Recently, the Government of India is building the first major animal overpass under the Bharatmala project on the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway.



- Main Point
- This overpass has been built for the safe movement of wildlife in the buffer zone of the Ranthambore Tiger Reserve.
- Vegetation and sound barriers have been planted on the overpass to reduce noise pollution.
- This will ensure that the vehicle sound does not affect the natural behavior of animals.

#### Ranthambhore Tiger Reserve (RTR):

- Ranthambore Tiger Reserve is located in Sawai Madhopur district of Rajasthan.
- This reserve is spread between the Aravalli and Vindhya mountain ranges.
- RTR includes Ranthambore National Park, Sawai Madhopur Sanctuary, Keladevi Sanctuary and National Chambal Gharial Sanctuary.
- It is named after the historic Ranthambore Fort.
- This fort is a UNESCO World Heritage Site located in the reserve area.
- Banas River flows in the north of RTR and Chambal River in the south.
- The reserve area has major lakes like Padam Talab, Raj Bagh Talab and Malik Talab.
- The vegetation here is dominated by dry deciduous forest and tropical thorn scrub.
- Major fauna includes Royal Bengal Tiger, leopard, caracal, sambar, chital, chinkara and wild boar.
- Birds include species like Sarus Crane, Serpent Eagle and Painted Spurfowl.
- As per the 2023 tiger census, RTR has 71 tigers and their cubs.
- It is the third highest tiger density reserve in India after Corbett and Kaziranga.
- The main vegetation of the area is the Dhok tree. Other important trees include Babul, Gurjan, Gum and Khair.

- **♦** This award was given for the outstanding contribution in research and extension (innovation and technology) work in the agricultural sector.





#### Swachh Survekshan Award 2024-25

- **○** Why in News?
- On July 17, 2025, President Draupadi Murmu presented the Swachh Survekshan 2024-25 Awards for Urban Sanitation at a national function organized by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs at Vigyan Bhavan in New Delhi.

#### **Main Point**

- Swachh Survekshan 2024-25 is the world's largest urban sanitation survey and is a key part of the Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban (SBM-U).
- This year the awards were given in four main categories Super Swachh League (SSL) cities, top three clean cities in five different population categories, special categories such as Ganga Towns, Cantonment Boards, Safai Mitra Suraksha and Maha Kumbh and State-level awards for emerging clean cities of States/UTs.
- A total of 78 awards were given during the function.
- Swachh Survekshan 2024-25 adopts a structured, technology-driven methodology based on 10 parameters and 54 indicators.
- For the first time, cities have been classified into five categories based on population for more fair evaluation - very small cities (population less than 20,000), small cities (20,000-50,000), medium cities (50,000-3 lakh), large cities (3-10 lakh), and cities with population more than one million.

- Best Safai Mitra Safe City: Visakhapatnam has been given the title of Best Safai Mitra Safe City.
- Special Award to Mahakumbh: Uttar Pradesh Government, Prayagraj Mela Officer and Municipal Corporation were given special awards for excellent waste management during Mahakumbh 2024.

#### **Communication satellite Dror-1**

- **○** Why in News?
- On July 13, 2025, Israel successfully launched the most advanced communication satellite 'Dror-1', communication satellite ever from Cape Canaveral, US with the help of SpaceX's Falcon-9 rocket.



- **Main Point**
- Purpose: This satellite will provide secure communication services for military, government and civilian use for the next 15 years.
- Satellite developed by: Israel Aerospace Industries (IAI).
- It is Israel's most advanced communication satellite.

- **Key Features of Dror-1** 
  - Main Antennas: Two (each 2.8 meters wide) Equipped with the largest Israeli satellite antennas ever, which will facilitate fast and high data transmission over a large area.
  - Launch Orbit: This satellite will be installed in a geostationary orbit of about 36,000 kilometers from the Earth's surface.

#### **Akash Prime Missile**

#### **○** Why in News?

■ Recently, the indigenous seeker-equipped Akash Prime missile was successfully tested at high altitude in Ladakh.



#### Main Point

- The Akash Prime missile, designed for high altitude areas, was successfully tested in Ladakh.
- This missile is capable of destroying aerial high-speed unmanned targets with precision.
- The original Akash missile has a range of 27–30 km and an altitude of up to 18 km.
- Akash Prime has an indigenous active radio frequency seeker added to it, which has increased accuracy.

- This system has been made capable of operating at altitudes above 4,500 metres.
- In the 1980s, the development of the Akash missile was started by DRDO.
- Its initial tests were conducted in the 1990s and 2000s.
- The name "Akash" is derived from the Sanskrit word, which signifies resistance in the air.
- It is designed to protect vital installations.
- This system can attack multiple targets simultaneously.
- It includes features like ECCM (Electronic Counter-Counter Measures).
- These techniques provide protection against systems that deceive the detection system.

#### **Important Days**

### **World Day of International Justice 2025**

- **○** Why in News?
- Every year on 17 July, World International Justice Day is celebrated.



- Main Point
- This day is celebrated to promote international criminal justice and to honor the fight against impunity for serious crimes affecting the global community.

### **Objective:**

- **■** To establish global justice against international crimes.
- To provide justice to war victims, displaced people and those who have suffered atrocities.
- **■** To protect human rights and strengthen legal institutions.
- To promote peace and stability by ensuring accountability of the culprits.

#### **History:**

- On 17 July 1998, the "Rome Treaty" was adopted in Rome, paving the way for the establishment of the ICC.
- In 2010, it was decided in Kampala, Uganda that 17 July would be celebrated as International Justice Day.

#### **International Criminal Court (ICC):**

- The world's first permanent, independent and international tribunal.
- It prosecutes four serious crimes: genocide, war crimes, crimes against humanity, and crimes related to aggression.
- It is headquartered in The Hague, Netherlands; began operating in July 2002.

  India's position:
- India has not signed the Treaty of Rome, so it is not a member of the ICC.
- India argues that some sections of the ICC may interfere with its national sovereignty, military operations and internal security.
- India also fears that the influence of UN Security Council veto countries on the ICC may affect the impartiality of justice.

### Sanjay Kaul

- **○** Why in News?
- Recently, Sanjay Kaul, a 2001 batch Kerala cadre IAS officer has been appointed as the new MD and CEO of GIFT City Company Limited, Gandhinagar.



- Main Point
- He is currently working as Joint Secretary in the Ministry of Culture, Government of India, where he is looking after international cultural affairs, UNESCO, intangible cultural heritage and cultural institutions.
- He has extensive experience in the administrative field; he has previously been the MD of Gujarat Tourism Corporation Limited and Gujarat Informatics Limited.
- GIFT City is India's first international financial services focused smart city, where he will be responsible for its management and development as CEO.
- Gujarat General Administration Department (GAD) has issued an official notification in this regard. The current CEO Tapan Ray will continue in his post till Sanjay Kaul takes over.

### The country in discussion is Eswatini

- Why in News?
- Recently, the United States deported five foreign nationals convicted of serious crimes to Eswatini, the last monarchical country on the African continent.

#### **Main Point**

- These deportees include citizens of Vietnam, Jamaica, Cuba, Yemen and Laos. Their native countries were not willing to take them back, due to which they were sent to Eswatini under a third country deportation agreement.
- This deportation is part of the US's broader strategy, which was adopted during President Trump's reign to promote deportation to third countries. In July 2025 itself, the US deported eight deportees to South Sudan, of whom only one person was a citizen of that country.

#### **About Eswatini:**

- Eswatini is a landlocked country, surrounded by South Africa and Mozambique.
- Eswatini, which gained independence from British rule in 1968, was formerly known as Swaziland.
- In 2018, it changed its name to Eswatini.
- It is one of the few countries in the world and the only country in Africa that has an absolute monarchy.
- King Mswati III, who has been in power since 1986, exercises full control over all functions of government.
- Political parties are not allowed to participate in the electoral process, and individuals who stand for public office must seek the approval of traditional leaders.

- Despite its small size, Eswatini faces deep social and economic challenges.

  According to the World Bank, more than half of its population of 1.2 million live on less than \$4 a day.
- The country has one of the highest rates of HIV infection in the world, with about 26 percent of adults infected with the virus.
