- **Why in News?**
- Recently, the Union Education Minister has agreed to give ₹3200 crore to Rajasthan under the 'Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan'.



- **Solution Service Serv**
- with this amount received from the Center, various works will be done in Kasturba Gandhi Residential School, Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Residential School, construction and repair work in schools, vocational education, ICT and digital lab, Nipun Bharat, community mobility, innovation, various works related to monitoring of holistic education.
- The IT infrastructure of the state's government schools will be strengthened with an additional amount of ₹697.88 crore and students will be able to participate in new experiments and research by developing a scientific approach.

Other important points:

- Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan is a comprehensive program for the school education sector, which applies from pre-school to class 12.
- This Abhiyan is designed with the broad goal of improving school effectiveness in terms of equal opportunities and equitable learning outcomes.
- It comprises three schemes of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) and Teacher Education (TE) and was launched in the year 2018.

■ Veda Vidyalayas have been started in 4 divisions of Rajasthan; Jaipur, Ajmer, Jodhpur and Kota.

- In the year 2025, 40 students

 per school are being admitted in class 6 in the Veda Vidyalayas at Hathoj

 (Jaipur), Pushkar (Ajmer), Deoli Kalan, Chechat (Kota) and Taratara Math,

 Barmer (Jodhpur).
- In the budget for the financial year 2025-26, the Rajasthan government had announced the establishment of 'Vedic Gurukul and Vedic Tourism Centers' in Jaipur, Jodhpur and Udaipur.
- Earlier, in the Rajasthan State Budget 2024-25, it was announced that a Centre of Excellence (CoE) would be set up at the divisional level for running Veda Vidyalayas, studying and researching the scientific aspects of astrology and vastu.
- It is worth mentioning that the Rajasthan government is setting up Veda Vidyalayas to restart the Vedic study process, the abstract form of the Indian Vedic knowledge tradition, at the state level.

North India's first green hydrogen hub: Jodhpur

○ Why in News?

Taking a big step in the country's energy revolution, North India's first green hydrogen innovation cluster will be set up at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Jodhpur at a cost of about Rs 205 crore.



Solution Service Serv

- This cluster, to be built on the Public Private Partnership model, will produce about 350 tonnes of green hydrogen annually, the cost of which will be between 1 to 3 dollars per kilogram.
- This will be the fourth green hydrogen cluster in the country and the first green hydrogen cluster in North India. Apart from this, green hydrogen clusters are also being set up in Bhubaneswar (East), Pune (West) and Kerala (South).
- Under the MoU between Indian Institute of Technology Jodhpur and the Government of Rajasthan, work has already started towards hydrogen production from renewable energy in the campus.

Other important points:

National Green Hydrogen Mission:

- Approval: The Union Cabinet approved the National Green Hydrogen Mission with an outlay of ₹19,744 crore on January 4, 2023.
- Mission Objective: To make India a global hub for the production, use and export of green hydrogen and its derivatives, with a target of 5 million metric tonnes per annum of green hydrogen production by 2030.
- Green Hydrogen Cluster: A green hydrogen cluster is an interconnected network of industries and infrastructure in a specific geographic region that uses green hydrogen to decarbonise energy-intensive sectors such as steel, fertilizers and long-haul transport.


- More than 50% of the projects under mineral exploration by the Chhattisgarh government have been dedicated to critical and strategic minerals.
- This mineral deposit is spread over a 700 m long area in mafic-ultramafic rock formations.
- Geophysical data indicate the presence of sulphide mineralisation up to a depth of 300 m.
- The Geological Survey of India (GSI) had earlier carried out G4-level exploration of this block and identified potential mineralisation of nickel, chromium and PGI.
- Deccan Gold Mining Limited acquired this block in the auction process on March 6, 2023.

- Innocent civilians and security forces are the main victims.
- Backward and marginalized classes, especially tribals, have been most affected by this violence.
- Poverty, low literacy, poor health standards, lack of infrastructure and connectivity.

- The first phase will be a harbour phase in Colombo from 14 to 16 August 2025, while the second phase will be a sea exercise from 17 to 18 August.
- From the Sri Lankan Navy side, SLNS Gajabahu and Vijayabahu (both advanced offshore patrol vessels) will participate in the exercise.

- Target of implementation of "Anna-Chakra" technology under Public Distribution System (PDS): In 31 States/Union Territories.
- Out of 31 States/Union Territories, route optimization has been implemented in 30 states except Manipur.
- Benefits: Transportation cost is expected to be reduced, which is one of the potential benefits of using optimization techniques in the Public Distribution System. The estimated savings are Rs 250 crore per year.



■ Recently, 'pseudo-intelligence' was discovered in the immune protein TAK1 kinase by the Bose Institute, as published in the Journal of Chemical Information and Modelling.

■ Discovery: Proteins, crucial for immune response and cell survival, can exhibit behaviour resembling primitive intelligence.

- Such highly organised groups of atoms can, in some cases, develop pseudointelligence at a very basic level. This ability arises from the unique threedimensional surface of proteins, which generate electrostatic interactions that act like internal circuits.
- The discovery extends the long-standing biochemical principle of "sequence-structure-function-intelligence" to include "sequence-structure-function-intelligence" for specific molecules.



India becomes world's third largest solar energy producer

- **⇒** Why in News?
- According to recent reports, India has officially overtaken Japan to become the world's third largest solar energy producer.

Solution Service Serv

- According to the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA), India has generated 1,08,494 GWh of solar energy which is more than Japan (96,459 GWh).
- India's cumulative solar power capacity as of July 2025 was 119.02 GW. This includes 90.99 GW from ground-mounted solar plants, 19.88 GW from grid-connected rooftop systems, 3.06 GW from hybrid projects and 5.09 GW from off-grid solar installations.

Record growth in India's solar capacity:

- Location: India is located in the tropical region, where the Tropic of Cancer passes through many states. This has immense potential for solar power generation in the country.
- Growth: The total solar power capacity of the Indian continent is 748 GW.
- States: States/UTs like Rajasthan, Jammu and Kashmir, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Andhra Pradesh have the highest solar power capacity in the country.
- Total renewable energy capacity of the country: India's solar power capacity had increased by 4,000 percent by July 2025 and the country's total renewable energy capacity reached 227 GW. Palli village of Jammu and Kashmir, which emerged as India's first carbon-neutral panchayat due to running completely on solar energy.

- India's global solar leadership: ISA and OSOWOG
- by India and France at COP21 in 2015, is a global alliance of over 100 countries working to tackle climate change through solar energy. It aims to mobilise \$1 trillion in investment by 2030, reduce technology and financing costs, and promote affordable solar solutions.
- One Sun-One World-One Grid (OSOWOG): The 'One Sun, One World, One Grid' initiative, launched by India at the ISA Assembly in 2018, envisions a global solar grid under the idea that 'the sun never sets.' Led by ISA, it aims to connect solar resources across regions from South Asia to Africa and Europe.

- Biofuel (Ethanol) Blending: India is now the world's third-largest ethanol producer and consumer. Ethanol blending in petrol increased from 10 per cent in June 2022 to 17.98 per cent by February 2025. The government aims to achieve 20 per cent blending by 2025-26, ahead of the earlier target of 2030.
- National Green Hydrogen Mission: Launched by the Government of India to reduce carbon emissions and make India a global leader in green hydrogen.
- Target: By the year 2030, it aims to produce 5 million tonnes of green hydrogen per year.

India's first hydrogen train

- Why in News?
- Recently, Indian Railways launched the country's first hydrogen train under the project 'Hydrogen for Heritage' on Jind-Sonipat route in Haryana.



- **Key Points:**
- Manufactured: Manufactured by Integral Coach Factory (ICF), Chennai.
- Environment friendly: Powered by hydrogen fuel cell and emits water and heat as by-products, which will reduce carbon emissions and noise pollution.
- Engine capacity: 1,200 HP, making it the world's highest-capacity hydrogenpowered train.



- This part aims to provide assistance to first-time employees.
- Incentive Amount: The employee will be given an incentive amount of up to Rs 15,000, which will be given in two installments.
- Disbursement of installments:
 - o First installment, after 6 months of service.
 - o Second installment, after completing the financial literacy program and 12 months of service.

- Savings Incentive: A part of the incentive amount will be kept in a deposit account for a fixed period, which the employee can withdraw later.
- Beneficiaries: Around 1.92 crore first-time employees will benefit from this scheme.

Part B - Incentives for Employers:

- Incentives: Employers will get incentives up to Rs 3,000 per month for 2 years for new employees with salary up to Rs 1 lakh.
- Priority to Manufacturing Sector: Manufacturing sector in particular will be given incentives under this scheme.
- Beneficiaries: This part is expected to provide additional employment to around 2.60 crore people.

Payment Mechanism:

- Part A (for first-time employees): All payments will be made through Aadhaar Bridge Payment System (ABPS).
- Part B (for employers): Payments to employers will be made directly into their PAN-linked accounts.


