- Why in News?

- This peer review is being conducted as per the instructions of the Ministry of Women and Child Development.

Rajasthan receives an amount of ₹411.03 lakh under LHDCP

Why in News?

Recently, the Animal Husbandry Department of Rajasthan Government received an amount of ₹411.03 lakh under the Livestock Health Disease Control Programme (LHDCP) under the centrally sponsored scheme 'National Livestock Mission' of the Central Government.

Key Points:

- This amount will be used for Foot and Mouth Disease, Bursella Disease, PPR (Peste des Petits) Disease and Classical Swine Fever Disease in Rajasthan under the Livestock Health Disease Control Program (LHDCP).
- Along with this, a grant amount of Rs 4 crore 8 lakh 20 thousand 500 was also released for Rajasthan under the Entrepreneurship Development Program (NLM-EDP) under the National Livestock Mission by the Central Government.
- Animal Husbandry Minister of Rajasthan: Joraram Kumawat. **Other Important Points:**
- Recently, the Central Government has invited applications for the 'National Gopal Ratna Award', for which 53 breeds of cow and 20 breeds of buffalo have been included across the country.
- Out of the 53 registered breeds of cow, 9 breeds are found in Rajasthan, which include - Tharparkar, Rathi, Nagauri, Mewati, Kankrej, Haryanvi, Sahiwal, Nari and Sanchori. There is not a single registered breed of buffalo from Rajasthan.
- The 'Rashtriya Gopal Ratna Puraskar' is a prestigious award given in the livestock and dairy sector. This award, Rashtriya Gopal Ratna Puraskar, is given by the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, under the National Gokul Mission.

Solution Example 2 Rey Points:

Employment Generation: Over 3.5 crore.

- Objective: To promote employment generation, increase employability and social security across sectors, with special focus on the manufacturing sector.
- Target: To promote creation of over 3.5 crore jobs in the country over a period of two years.

New Rules under the Environment Protection Act

- **♦** Why in News?
- On August 18, 2025, the Union Minister of State for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, in a written reply to a question in the Lok Sabha, provided information regarding the new rules under the Environment Protection Act.

Environmental Protection (Management of Contaminated Sites) Rules, 2025:

- **Notified:** July 24, 2025
- Reason: The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has issued rules for identification and management of contaminated sites in the country.

Rules:

- A contaminated site is defined as an area or site affected by contaminants.
- A site is declared as a contaminated site by the State Pollution Control Board (SPCB)/Pollution Control Committee (PCC) if the contaminant is found to be higher than the prescribed threshold levels after completing a detailed site assessment.
- The local body or the District Administration, on its own initiative or on receipt of a complaint from the public, is mandated to identify the area affected by contaminants taking into account the information prescribed in the regulations and list all such areas as suspected contaminated sites in its jurisdiction on a centralized online portal.
- The SPCB/PCC is mandated to publish the list of contaminated sites on a centralized online portal inviting comments and suggestions from stakeholders likely to be affected within 60 days of such publication.
- SPCB has identified 103 contaminated sites across the country, out of which remedial activities have been initiated at 07 sites:
 - Mercury contaminated site at Ganjam, Odisha
 - Chromium contaminated site at Rania, Kanpur Dehat, Uttar Pradesh
 - Groundwater contamination at Lohia Nagar and Industrial Area, Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh due to untreated industrial effluents by various industries
 - BPCL oil contaminated site at Tondiarpet, Chennai, Tamil Nadu

- o Groundwater contamination at Effluent Channel Project (ECP), Vadodara, Gujarat

Other Important Points:

Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (EPA):

- Enacted: Enacted in the year 1972 under the "United Nations Conference on Human Environment" held at Stockholm in June, 1972 (Stockholm Conference).
- Constitutional Provisions: The EPA was enacted under Article 253 of the Indian Constitution, which provides for the making of laws to give effect to international agreements.

Other important articles related to environment:

- Article 48A: The State shall endeavour to protect and improve the environment and to safeguard the forests and wildlife of the country.
- Article 51A: Every citizen shall protect the environment.

Powers of the Centre:

- Power to plan and execute a nationwide programme for the prevention, control and abatement of environmental pollution.
- Power to lay down standards for the quality of environment in various aspects such as emission or discharge of environmental pollutants from various sources.

- Penalties under EPA: The violator can be punished with imprisonment up to 5 years or fine up to Rs 1,00,000 or both.
- In case of continuing such violation, an additional fine of up to Rs 5,000 per day can be imposed.

- The 22-year-old has won six titles on the ATP Tour this season, including four majors including his first Wimbledon trophy.
- In the year 2025, he has won three Masters 1000 titles in Monte-Carlo, Rome and Cincinnati, as well as a major trophy at Roland Garros.

■ India's Girish Gupta won the gold medal in the 10m air pistol men's youth event of the 16th Asian Shooting Championships being held in Shymkent, Kazakhstan.

- **Event:** Being held in Shymkent, Kazakhstan from August 18 to 29, 2025.
- The 17-year-old shooter scored 241.3 points in the final to beat compatriot Dev Pratap, who at the age of 14 scored 238.6 to win the silver medal.

Kapil Bainsala:

■ Kapil Bainsala of Haryana won the first gold for India by scoring 243.0 to top the 10m air pistol men's junior final. Ilkhombek Obidjonov of Uzbekistan finished second. Jonathan Gavin Anthony of Karnataka won the bronze medal.

India's performance so far:

- India finished with two gold and three silver medals on the first day. Kapil Bainsala won the gold medal in Junior Men's Air Pistol while both Senior and Junior Men's teams won silver medals.
- Junior Men's Event: Kapil and Jonathan along with Vijay Tomar won the team silver medal by scoring a total of 1723 points. Korea won the gold with 1734 points and hosts Kazakhstan won the bronze medal.
- Senior Men's Event: Anmol Jain along with Aditya Malra and Saurabh Chaudhary won the team silver medal by scoring 1735 points.
