- Recently, the Rajasthan government announced to change the name of the erstwhile 'Indira Priyadarshini Award' to 'Padmakshi Award Scheme'.
- Main Point
- The amount provided under this scheme has also been reduced.

Eligibility for the scheme:

This award is given to the girl students securing first position at district level in the board examination of class 8, 10 and 12 (separately in all three faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce) and to the girl students of 08 categories securing first position at state level in class 8, Praveshika and Senior Upadhyay examination of Sanskrit education.

- Apart from this, girls securing first position at state level in 8 categories of class 10 and 12 (vocational education) in Rajasthan Board of Secondary Education Examination and girls passing class 12 (science faculty) of Swami Vivekanand Government Model School with more than 09 CGPA can also get benefits under this scheme.
- 08 Categories: General, Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Other Backward Class, Minority Class, Extremely Backward Class, BPL and Disabled Class (Divyang)
- It is mandatory for the girl student to get minimum 60 percent marks in the examinations.
- The caste/category filled by the girl student in the application form submitted for the board examination will be considered final.
- The girl student should be studying regularly in the next class.
 Other important points:
- **Related Department: Secondary Education Department.**
- **Scheme Start: Year 2010-11 (Revised 05.03.2019)**
- **Funded:** 100% by the State Government.
- **Type of Scheme: Individual.**
- In 2017-18, the Vasundhara Raje government changed the name of the 'Indira Priyadarshini Award' scheme to 'Padmakshi Award Scheme', but the Ashok Gehlot government restored its old name in the year 2019.
- Under this scheme, the entire expenditure of the prize money is borne by the Balika Shiksha Foundation.



The country's first high-speed trial test track

○ Why in News?

■ Recently, for the first time in the history of Indian Railways, the most powerful electric engine of 9000 horsepower was tested on a high-speed trial test track.



Main Point

- This trial was conducted on the newly built country's first high-speed trial test track on the Jaipur-Jodhpur railway line.
- The 9000 horsepower engine manufactured at the locomotive factory in Dahod, Gujarat was recently flagged off by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

 The country's first high-speed trial test track:
 - The country's most might speed that test track.
- This 64 km long track from Gudha to Mithdi on the Jaipur-Jodhpur rail section is the country's first high-speed test track.
- It comes under Jodhpur Railway Division, where there are four railway stations; Gudha, Jabdinagar, Nava and Mithdi.
- Trains can run at a speed of more than 220 km per hour on this track.

 Europe's highest peak Mount Elbrus with the help of the



Largest single-piece 3D printed rocket engine

- **○** Why in News?
- Indian space-tech startup
 'Agnikul Cosmos' has built
 the world's largest singlepiece 3D printed rocket
 engine.



- Main Point
- The company has prepared it from 'Inconel Superalloy', which is capable of withstanding high heat, corrosion and pressure.
- Inconel Superalloy: Inconel is a nickel-chromium-based superalloy often utilized in extereme environments where components are subjected to high temperature, pressure or mechanical loads.
- Traditional rocket engines have hundreds of parts. Failure of any one of these can cause the entire engine to fail. Agnikul's new engine solves this problem.
- From the entry of fuel to the exit of the plume, it is completely printed as an integrated component without any welds, joints or fasteners.
- Liquid oxygen and refined kerosene are the propellants of the engine, which uses electric motors in place of traditional gas generators and turbopumps for precise thrust control, making it a cleaner and more controllable option.

World Lion Day: 10 August

- **♦** Why in News?
- On August 10, 2025, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change in collaboration with the Department of Forest and Environment, Government of Gujarat organized a national celebration of World Lion Day at Barda Wildlife Sanctuary, Gujarat.



- Main Point
- The number of lions in Gujarat has increased by 32 percent since 2020, from 674 in 2020 to 891 in 2025, as per the May 2025 lion population projections.
- Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change launched a ₹180 crore wildlife conservation initiative.

■ This year marks the 10th World Lion Day, founded in 2013 by Derek and Beverly Joubert with the aim of raising awareness about the challenges faced by lions in the wild.

- Main Point

- History: The first World Sanskrit Day was celebrated in the year 1969.
 Sanskrit Language:
- Origin: About 3500 years ago in India.
- Oldest language in the world: Sanskrit is considered to be one of the oldest languages in the world.
- It is an Indo-Aryan language and is also known as the mother of most of the languages of India.
- Constitutional language: Sanskrit language is one of the 22 official languages included in the Eighth Schedule of the Indian Constitution.
- Classical language: It is included in 11 classical languages.
- In the year 2010, Sanskrit was declared as the second official language of Uttarakhand.
- UNESCO Recognition: UNESCO has recognized Sanskrit as the purest, richest and scientific language of the world.

- The event provided valuable ranking points to athletes aspiring to qualify for the upcoming World Athletics Championships in Tokyo.

Canada Tennis Open 2025

- **○** Why in News?
- Canadian teenager Victoria Mboko (18 years old) defeated four Grand Slam winner Naomi Osaka (Japan) in Montreal to win the women's singles tennis title at the Canadian Open.



Main Point

Women's Title: Victoria Mboko

- **■** This is Victoria's first WTA Tour title.
- Earlier, Victoria defeated Coco Gauff, Sofia Kenin and Elina Rybakina, who have been Grand Slam winners, in the same tournament.

Date: 11 August, 2025



- Victoria has become the first Canadian in the Open Era to defeat four former
 Grand Slam winners at the same WTA event.
- Victoria is the third player to win a domestic tournament in the Open Era.

 Earlier, Faye Urban (year 1969) and Biryaka Andreescu (year 2019) won.
- She became the second lowest ranked player to win a Tier I 'WTA 1000' title since the format was introduced in 1990.
- Victoria was ranked 333rd in the world rankings at the start of the year. Now she will come down to 34th.

Men's title: Ben Shelton

- In the men's category, American Ben Shelton won his first ATP Masters 1000 title by defeating Russia's Karen Khachanov in the final.
- **22**-year-old Shelton became the youngest American after Andy Roddick to achieve this feat.

Grand Slam tournaments:

1. Australian Open:

- Held in January, played on hard courts.
- Held annually in Melbourne, this tournament is the first Grand Slam tennis tournament of the year.
