

Approval for Kota-Bundi Greenfield Airport

Why in News?

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs chaired by the Prime Minister approved the construction of Kota-Bundi Greenfield Airport on August 19, 2025.



Key Points:

- Estimated cost: ₹1507.00 crores.
- **Proposal:** Introduced by Airports Authority of India (AAI).
- Kota, located on the banks of Chambal river, is known as the industrial capital of Rajasthan. Also, Kota is famous as an educational coaching hub of India.

Date: 20 August, 2025



- The Government of Rajasthan has transferred 440.06 hectares of land to AAI for the development of a Greenfield Airport suitable for handling A-321 type aircraft.
- The project involves construction of a terminal building spread over an area of 20,000 square meters which will be capable of handling 1000 passengers during peak hours (PHP) and will have an annual capacity of 2 million passengers per annum.
- The existing Kota airport is owned by the Airports Authority of India (AAI).

- **○** Why in News?
- Under the Swamitva Yojana of the Ministry of Panchayati Raj, digital mapping of 35,955 villages has been completed in Rajasthan.

Key Points:

- The top districts under the scheme include Jaipur, Jhalawar, Chittorgarh and Nagaur etc. New districts; such as Balotra, Beawar and Phalodi etc. have the least number of villages digitally mapped.
- Swamitva Yojana full name: Survey of Villages Aabadi and Mapping with Improved Technology in Village Areas.
- Launch of the scheme: By the Prime Minister on the occasion of Panchayati Raj Day on 24 April 2020.
- Objective: To provide the right to rural people to document their residential properties so that they can use their property for economic purposes.
- Implementation of the scheme: Jointly by Panchayati Raj Department, Survey of India Department and Revenue Department.
- Under the scheme, the Survey of India Department prepares a digital map of the inhabited areas of all the villages of the state through drones and submits it to the concerned Gram Panchayat.
- On the basis of the map, the concerned Gram Panchayat will issue the lease to the concerned person under the provisions of the Rajasthan Panchayati Raj Act, 1996.
- Out of a total of 36,352 surveyable villages in the state, drone survey work has been completed in 35,955 villages.
- According to Rajasthan Economic Review 2024-25, leases have been distributed to 6,85,935 land owners on the basis of ownership cards after drone survey in 10,765 villages on the basis of map received from Survey of India.

- The Rajasthan Sanskrit Education Department has decided to include Brahmi script in the Sanskrit textbook of class 7 in schools.

- After studying this script, students will be able to read and understand many ancient texts, manuscripts and inscriptions.
- The Sanskrit Education Department took this step on the recommendation of the curriculum development committee. This decision was taken after indepth study and deliberation under the leadership of the committee chairman Prof. Y.S. Ramesh.

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi had mentioned the 'Gyan Bharatam Yojana' from the Red Fort on Independence Day on August 15, 2025, to take it forward.
- Note: With the aim of promoting the Sanskrit language in the state, the Rajasthan government is planning to teach Sanskrit to children in preprimary classes as well. Children will be taught names in Sanskrit through pictures. This will be the first experiment in the country where Sanskrit books have been prepared for pre-primary classes.

Facts for Prelims:

Brahmi Script:

- Brahmi script is the earliest writing system developed in India after the Indus script. It is one of the most influential writing systems; all modern Indian scripts and many scripts found in Southeast and East Asia originate from Brahmi.
- The earliest evidence of the Brahmi script comes from the inscriptions of Ashoka, the third Mauryan emperor of Magadha, who ruled much of the Indian subcontinent from 268 to 232 BCE.

Aunta-Simaria Project

○ Why in News?

■ On August 22, 2025, the Prime Minister will inaugurate the Aunta-Simaria Project in Gaya, Bihar.



Key Points:

- The project consists of a nearly two kilometer long bridge over the Ganga river, which will provide direct connectivity between Mokama and Begusarai in Patna district.
- The bridge has been built parallel to the old 2-lane rail-cum-road bridge 'Rajendra Setu'.
- This new bridge will reduce the additional travel distance for heavy vehicles plying between the regions of North Bihar and South Bihar by up to 100 kilometers.
- **Foundation stone of the project:** By the Prime Minister in the year 2017.

Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment Bill, 2025

- **○** Why in News?
- The Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment Bill, 2025 was passed in the Rajya Sabha on August 19, 2025.



- **Solution Service Serv**
- The Lok Sabha has already passed this bill.
- This bill further amends the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957.
- Bill introduced: Coal and Mines Minister G Kishan Reddy.

Key provisions of the Bill:

- Leaseholders can apply to the state government to include other minerals in the existing lease, no additional amount is required to be paid for inclusion of critical and strategic minerals, and other specified minerals. These include minerals such as lithium, graphite, nickel, cobalt, gold and silver.
- National Mineral Exploration Trust: This Act establishes the National Mineral Exploration Trust to finance mineral exploration in the country.
- Economic Incentives: The Bill also provides funds for the development of mines and minerals by expanding the scope of the trust. Under the Act, captive mines are allowed to sell up to 50 per cent of the minerals produced in a year, after meeting the end-use requirements.
- Sale Limit: The Bill removes the limit on the sale of minerals.
- Establishment of Authority: The Bill provides for the establishment of an authority for the registration and regulation of mineral exchanges.

Other Important Points:

- Transparent allocation of mines has brought Rs 6 lakh 85 thousand crore to the states from the Centre.
- India is the second largest coal producer and the second largest coal consumer.
- The country's coal production has crossed one billion tonnes for the first time.
- The government has identified 24 critical minerals under the exploration of critical minerals.

Allocation: Rs 32 thousand crore.

Indian Institutes of Management (Amendment) Bill, 2025

- **○** Why in News?
- On August 19, 2025, the Lok Sabha has passed the Indian Institutes of Management (Amendment) Bill, 2025.



- **Solution Key Points:**
- Bill introduced: By Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan.
- The Bill will further amend the Indian Institutes of Management Act, 2017.
- Provisions: The Bill provides for the establishment of an Indian Institute of Management in Guwahati, Assam, along with a financial grant of Rs 550 crore has been allocated for IIM Guwahati.
- Currently, there are 21 IIMs functioning in the country.



- Sadbhavna Diwas is celebrated every year on 20 August in India with the aim of promoting peace, unity and harmony among different religions and communities.

- Objective: To develop peace and understanding among different religious, ethnic and cultural communities as well as encourage inclusiveness, secularism, tolerance and mutual respect.
- Sadbhavna Diwas is celebrated to commemorate the birth anniversary of former Prime Minister of India Rajiv Gandhi.

Date : 20 August, 2025



- **Beginning:** From 20 August 1992.
- First time organized: Sadbhavna Diwas was first celebrated in the year 1992 after the assassination of Rajiv Gandhi in the year 1991.

Other Important Points:

Rajiv Gandhi:

- Sixth and youngest Prime Minister of India.
- Tenure: He held the post of Prime Minister from the year 1984 to 1989.
- Contribution: Strengthening of Panchayati Raj through National Education Policy (1986), 73rd and 74th Amendments, promoting regional cooperation (e.g., SAARC) and establishment of youth-focused Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development.
- Rajiv Gandhi National Sadbhavana Award: Awarded to former member of Telangana Legislative Assembly Geeta Reddy in the year 2024.

Vice Presidential Candidates

- Why in News?
- After former Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar resigned from his post on July 21, 2025, recently the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) declared Maharashtra Governor C.P. Radhakrishnan as the Vice Presidential candidate, while the opposition (I.N.D.I.A.) named former Supreme Court judge B. Sudarshan Reddy as the Vice Presidential candidate.
- **Key Points:**
- Votes will be cast for the post of Vice President on September 9, 2025.
- According to Article 66 of the Constitution, the Vice President is elected by the members of the electoral college consisting of members of both the Houses of Parliament by means of a single transferable vote in accordance with the proportional representation system.
- In this process, voters select candidates in order of preference.
- The Election Commission of India has appointed the Secretary General of the Rajya Sabha as the Returning Officer for the upcoming Vice Presidential election. The decision is in keeping with established practice where the roles are rotated between the Secretary-Generals of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha.
- The appointments were made under Section 3 of the Presidential and Vice-Presidential Elections Act, 1952, in consultation with the Union Ministry of Law and Justice and with the concurrence of the Deputy Chairman, Rajya Sabha.

- It was a double delight for Rashmika (qualification score 582) as she teamed up with Vanshika Chaudhary (573) and Mohini Singh (565) to win the team gold medal of the event

Other Points:

- Earlier, two-time Olympic bronze medallist Manu Bhaker won another individual international medal by finishing third with 219.7 points in the final of the women's 10m air pistol event.
- India's performance so far: Five gold, two silver and four bronze medals
