### Rajasthan Camel (Prohibition of Slaughter and Regulation of **Temporary Migration or Export) Act, 2015**

- Why in News?
- Recently, in a meeting chaired by Rajasthan's Animal Husbandry and Cow **Breeding** Minister Joraram Kumawat, guidelines were issued to the



Animal Husbandry Department to make rules for the 'Rajasthan Camel (Prohibition of Slaughter and Regulation of Temporary Migration or Export) Act, 2015'.

- **Main Point**
- Under the new guidelines, it will be easy for camel breeders to graze camels in other states, do dairy and agricultural work and take them to animal fairs.
- According to the new rules for the Act, 2015, along with the District Collector, now SDM can also be authorized as the competent officer for the transportation of camels.

#### **About the Act:**

- The Rajasthan Camel (Prohibition of Slaughter and Regulation of Temporary Migration or Export) Act, 2015 was made to stop the declining population of camels in the state and to protect them.
- The main provisions of this Act include a ban on the slaughter of camels, their export for meat and illegal transportation outside the state.

- The Act also regulates the temporary migration of camels.
- Main objective of the Act: To increase the population of camels in Rajasthan and ensure their conservation.
- The Act prohibits the slaughter of camels and provides for stringent punishment for its violation, which includes imprisonment of six months to three years and a fine of ₹5,000 to ₹25,000.

#### \* **Facts for Prelims:**

- Ustra Sanrakshan Yojana: With the aim of providing financial support to the state animal camel breeders, the incentive amount given under the Ustra Sanrakshan Yojana by the Animal Husbandry Department has been increased from ₹10,000 to ₹20,000.
- National Research Centre on Camel is located in Bikaner.

#### **Livestock in the State:**

- Under Livestock Census-2019, a total of 568.01 lakh livestock and 146.23 lakh poultry birds were recorded in the state.
- The state holds about 10.60% of the total livestock of the country.
- This includes 7.24% of the country's cattle, 12.47% buffaloes, 14% goats, 10.64% sheep and 84.43% camels.
- In the year 2022-23, the state contributed 14.44% milk production and 47.98% wool production to the national production.

#### Main Point

- **■** Members: 5 members.
- A special provision has been made in this commission that one member in the commission will be from the woman or transgender community which will ensure that the marginalized sections also get representation in the commission and their voice is also included in the policies.

**Key roles and functions of the commission:** 



#### Veer Praivar Sahayata Yojana 2025

- **♦** Why in News?
- Recently, the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA) announced the Veer Parivar Sahayata Yojana 2025.



- Main Point
- It is a national level legal aid scheme dedicated to soldiers, ex-servicemen and their dependents.
- The objective of this scheme is to provide free legal aid, advice and support to the army and paramilitary forces personnel and their families.
- This scheme will be applicable in all Indian states.
- The basis of this scheme is Article-39A.

#### **National Legal Services Authority (NALSA):**

- NALSA (National Legal Services Authority) is a statutory body.
- **Established:** In the year 1995.
- It was established under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987.
- NALSA monitors and evaluates legal aid programs.
- Its objective is to provide free and effective legal aid to eligible groups.
- These eligible groups include women, children, Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST).
- Apart from this, economically weaker sections (EWS), industrial workers, disabled and transgender persons are also covered.
- Providing assistance to all these is provided in Section 12.
- NALSA has a stratified structure.
- Legal service institutions have been established at all levels from taluk courts to the Supreme Court.

#### 2nd BIMSTEC Ports Conference

- **♦** Why in News?
- Recently, the second BIMSTEC (Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation) port conference was held in Visakhapatnam.



- Main Point
- This conference was chaired by India.
- Theme of the conference: Towards the future: Blue economy, innovation and sustainable partnership.
- Importance for India: It will promote India's leadership in maritime cooperation in the Bay of Bengal and promote Sagarmala goals under portled development and connectivity.
- It strengthens India's role in the Indo-Pacific region, especially by strengthening relations with BIMSTEC countries.

#### **BIMSTEC:**

- BIMSTEC is a regional organization established on June 6, 1997 through the **Bangkok Declaration.**
- Its objective is to promote economic and technical cooperation among the countries of the Bay of Bengal.
- The organization originally began as BIST-EC (Bangladesh, India, Sri Lanka, Thailand Economic Cooperation).
- It was renamed BIMST-EC after Myanmar joined in 1997.
- It was renamed BIMSTEC in 2004 when Nepal and Bhutan joined.
- During the third summit in 2014, the BIMSTEC Secretariat was established in Dhaka, Bangladesh.
- In the initial phase, BIMSTEC had six major cooperation areas trade, technology, energy, transport, tourism and fisheries.
- Agriculture, public health, counter-terrorism cooperation, environment and climate change were added to these areas in 2008.
- In 2021, the areas of cooperation were restructured for better coordination.
- Each member country was given leadership responsibility in specific areas.
- India leads the security pillar in BIMSTEC, which includes counterterrorism, transnational crime, disaster management and energy.



#### Fast Patrol Vessel 'Atal' launched

- **♦** Why in News?
- Recently, the Vasco da Gama-based Goa Shipyard Limited (GSL) launched the Fast Patrol Vessel (FPV) 'Atal' for the Indian Coast Guard with the aim of strengthening Indian coastal security.

#### Main Point

- This is the sixth vessel in the series of eight FPVs being built by GSL, which is fully indigenously designed and built. It symbolizes the country's commitment towards 'Atmanirbhar Bharat'.
- Fast Patrol Vessel 'Atal' (Yard 1275) is designed and built by Goa Shipyard Limited (GSL), a premier Defence Public Sector Undertaking (DPSU) under the Ministry of Defence.

#### **■** Features of FPV 'Atal':

- Length 52 meters, width 8 meters and displacement 320 tonnes, which enables it for fast and agile maritime operations.
- The ship is designed for coastal patrol, island security, offshore asset protection, anti-smuggling operations, anti-piracy missions and search and rescue operations.
- The state-of-the-art naval architecture developed by GSL provides it both speed and stability.
- From the national security point of view, 'Atal' strengthens India's maritime domain awareness and serves as the first line of coastal security amid increasing maritime threats.

### **NISAR Satellite**

- **○** Why in News?
- On July 30, 2025, Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and US space agency NASA jointly launched NISAR.

- Main Point
- **Full name:** NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar.
- This satellite is the world's first radar imaging satellite to systematically map the planet and detect microscopic surface movements using bi-frequency band synthetic aperture radar (L-band and S-band).
- Launch date: July 30, 2025 from Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota.
- Launch vehicle: ISRO's GSLV-F16 rocket (This is the first time GSLV will carry a satellite into a sun-synchronous orbit).
- Orbit: In sun-synchronous orbit at 747 km altitude (98.4° inclination)
- Mission duration: 3 years but can be operated up to 5 years depending on fuel and stability.
- Function: This satellite will observe the entire earth every 12 days and will help in giving warning of natural disasters like earthquakes, tsunamis, volcanoes and landslides.

#### **Objective:**

- To measure the earth's dynamic surfaces, changing ecosystems and icebergs.
- To obtain important information about biomass, natural disasters, sea level rise and groundwater.

#### Major equipment:

- **Equipment provided by NASA:** 
  - L-band radar, GPS system, solid-state recorder for data collection and storage, payload data subsystem.
  - Antenna: 12 meter wire mesh antenna, developed by NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL).
- Equipment provided by ISRO: S-band radar, GSLV launch vehicle, spacecraft and related launch services etc.

#### **Key features of the mission:**

- Dual SAR radar system: L-band and S-band radars will together produce high-quality, detailed and reliable images.
- Reflector antenna: NASA's largest antenna ever, which will focus the radar signal.
- All-weather capabilities: Capable of collecting data even in conditions like clouds and rain.
- 240 km wide imaging range: Can scan the entire earth's surface every 12 days. **Importance**
- Climate science: Will increase understanding about carbon sources and sinks from terrestrial ecosystems, especially forests.
- **India-US cooperation:** For the first time, the US and India have collaborated to develop hardware for an Earth-observation mission, which is important for international space cooperation.
- Earth Observation and Monitoring: NISAR will regularly monitor the Earth's ecosystem, surface dynamics and ice mass every 6 days for 3 years and provide critical data on biomass, natural hazards, sea level rise and groundwater.

- **Established:** By the United Nations General Assembly in the year 2015.
- This award is given to one woman and one man every 5 years.
- Purpose: To honor those individuals who have dedicated their lives in the service of humanity.
- Main areas:
  - Reconciliation
  - Social Cohesion
  - Community Development
- Award format: Winners are given a plaque containing a citation.
- **Feature:** The plaque contains a quote from Nelson Mandela.
- Cash prize: No cash prize is given in this award.
- Eligibility: United Nations employees are not eligible for this award.
- Till date, no Indian citizen has received this award.
