

Decisions of Rajasthan Cabinet Meeting



■ The following important decisions were taken in the Cabinet and Council of Ministers meeting held under the chairmanship of the Chief Minister on August 31, 2025.



Key Points:

Decisions:


- 1. Chief Minister Free Electricity Scheme: PM Suryaghar 150 Unit Free Electricity Scheme will be implemented in the state.
- This decision will benefit 1 crore 4 lakh registered consumers of domestic category and by connecting to solar energy, they will now get the benefit of free electricity up to 150 units instead of 100 units per month.

- It is noteworthy that in the budget of the year 2025-26, the state government had made an important announcement to provide 150 units of free electricity per month by installing roof top solar panels, leveraging the PM Suryaghar Free Electricity Scheme with the intention of giving more benefits to the registered beneficiaries of the Chief Minister Free Electricity Scheme.
- **Average monthly consumption more than 150 units:**
 - If the average monthly consumption is more than 150 units, then free solar panels of 1.1 kW capacity will be installed on the roof of their house under this scheme.
 - For this, every such consumer will get financial assistance of Rs 33,000 per plant from the Government of India under the Pradhan Mantri Surya Ghar Free Electricity Scheme. At the same time, additional financial assistance of Rs 17,000 per plant will be given by the state government.
 - This will make the panel of 1.1 kW capacity completely free and the monthly electricity bill of the consumer will become zero on monthly consumption up to 150 units. At the same time, 3,000 MW additional solar energy capacity will be created by installing roof top plants in about 27 lakh families.
- Average monthly consumption less than 150 units:
 - Under the category of average monthly consumption less than 150 units, in the first category, for such 11 lakh beneficiary families of Mukhyamantri Free Electricity Scheme, who have a roof available on the roof of their house to install free roof top solar plant, free solar plants of 1.1 kW capacity will be installed by the distribution companies through their selected vendors.





- In the second category, for such remaining registered consumers, discoms will install community solar plants and, through virtual net metering on these plants, such consumers will get 150 units of free electricity per month in the form of electricity received from these community solar plants.
- 2. 2 lakh street lights instead of 1 lakh in urban bodies: In view of the increase in population as well as expansion of residential area in the urban areas of the state, it was announced in the budget of the year 2025-26 to install one lakh LED street lights on the roads. The number of urban bodies has increased from 282 to 312 and 2 lakh new street lights will be installed in place of old lights in many urban bodies.
- Amendment in Sewerage and Waste Water Policy-2016: To prevent 3. environmental pollution and health related side effects caused by polluted water, the cabinet has approved the amendment in the Sewerage and Waste Water Policy-2016 in the state.
- In the revised policy, HAM model has been adopted in accordance with Namami Gange projects. In this, 40 percent of the total project cost will be given to the private partner in equal installments on completion of work and the remaining 60 percent amount will be given during the operationmaintenance time period.
- Rajasthan Prohibition of Unlawful Conversion of Religion Bill, 2025: 4. Rajasthan Prohibition of Unlawful Conversion of Religion Bill-2025 will be introduced in the Assembly to prevent attempts of conversion by inducement or fraud.

- 5. Approval of service rules of Rajasthan Staff Selection Board: Rajasthan Staff Selection Board was constituted in the year 2014 for recruitment to the posts of ministerial and subordinate service cadre of various departments of the state government.
- In the cabinet meeting, new service rules for the officers and employees of the board, Rajasthan Staff Selection Board (Gazetted Staff) Service Rules, 2025 and Rajasthan Staff Selection Board (Ministerial and Subordinate Services) Rules, 2025 were made and amendments were approved in Rajasthan Subordinate and Ministerial Services (Common Eligibility Test) Rules, 2022.

Towards inclusive tribal empowerment and preservation of India's rich linguistic diversity, the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India has launched the beta version of India's first AI-powered translator for tribal languages - "Adi Vaani".




Key Points:

Adi Vaani is designed to bridge the communication gap between tribal and non-tribal communities, while also protecting endangered tribal languages using advanced Artificial Intelligence (AI).

Other Important Points:

Adi Vaani:

- Adi Vaani is an artificial intelligence (AI) based translation tool that lays the foundation of language models for tribal languages.
- Development: Developed under the leadership of IIT Delhi in partnership with BITS Pilani, IIT Hyderabad, IIT Nava Raipur and Tribal Research Institutes (TRIs) from five states.

Objectives:

- Enable real-time translation (text and speech) between Hindi/English and tribal languages.
- Provide interactive language learning for students and early learners.
- Digitally preserve folklore, oral traditions and cultural heritage.
- Promote digital literacy, healthcare communication and citizen inclusion in tribal communities.
- Generate awareness about government schemes and important speeches. **Methodology and Features:**
- AI Language Models: Sophisticated deployment of models like No Language Left Behind (NLLB) and IndicTrans 2 for low-resource tribal languages.
- Community Participation: TRIs, experts and community are involved in data collection, validation and iterative development.
- Functional Toolkits: Text-to-Text, Text-to-Speech, Speech-to-Text, Speechto-Speech translation.
- Optical Character Recognition (OCR) for digitization of manuscripts and primers.
- Bilingual Dictionaries and Curated Repositories.
- Significance: This initiative strengthens India's constitutional values of cultural diversity and equality while advancing flagship national missions such as Digital India, Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat, Adi Karmayogi Abhiyaan, Dharti Aaba Janjati Gram Utkarsh Abhiyaan and Pradhan Mantri Janman Nigam.

Linguistic Landscape of India:

- According to the Census of India, 2011, there are 461 tribal languages and 71 specific tribal mother tongues spoken by Scheduled Tribes in India.
- Out of these, 81 languages are sensitive and 42 are critically endangered.





Updated Golden Visa Program: Oman

Why in News?

■ On August 31, 2025, Oman launched the new Golden Visa program, which will establish Oman as a global investment hub.



Key Points:

- The initiative is in line with the Vision 2040 goals of diversifying the economy and reducing dependence on oil revenues.
- The updated program offers five or ten-year renewable residence permits for foreign investors, entrepreneurs, retirees and skilled professionals, allowing them and their families to live, work and study in Oman without a local sponsor.





- Announced: By the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Investment Promotion, Oman.
- Visa: Under this program, investors will get a renewable residence permit for 5 or 10 years. This program can be obtained through real estate, company ownership or capital investment.
- Ten-year visa: This visa is available with a minimum investment of 500,000 OMR (US\$1.3 million) or starting a business employing at least 50 Omanis.
- Five-year visa: This visa is available with an investment limit of 250,000 OMR (US\$650,000).
- A five-year retirement visa is available for applicants with a fixed monthly income of 4,000 OMR or more.

15th India-Japan Annual Summit, 2025



From 29 to 30 August 2025, at the invitation of Prime Minister of Japan Ishiba Shigeru, the Prime Minister of India paid an official



visit to Japan to attend the 15th India-Japan Annual Summit, 2025.

Key Points:

- On 29 August 2025, the Indian Prime Minister was formally accorded a Guard of Honour.
- The visit is in line with the special events marking the 75th anniversary of India-Japan diplomatic relations in the year 2027.
- The year 2025 has been declared as the "India-Japan Science, Technology and Innovation Exchange" year, which is also the 40th anniversary of science and technology cooperation.

Daruma Dolls:

■ The Indian Prime Minister was presented a Daruma doll by Seishi Hirose, the head priest of Shorinzan Daruma-ji Temple in Takasaki-Gunma.

In Japanese culture, Daruma dolls are considered a symbol of good luck and fortune. Takasaki city in Gunma is the birthplace of the famous Daruma dolls. The Daruma tradition in Japan is based on the legacy of Bodhidharma, an Indian monk from Kanchipuram. He is known in Japan as Daruma Daishi.



Outcome: The two countries adopted a "Joint Vision for the Next Decade" along with several agreements covering economic, security, technological and cultural cooperation.

BioE3 Cell and First National Biofoundry Network:

Under this, BioE3 Cell and First National Biofoundry Network were launched, which includes 6 institutes, which will help in concept development, promoting indigenous biomanufacturing and creating employment opportunities.

Launch of BioE3 Challenge:

- It is a nationwide call for young innovators under the theme "Design of Microorganisms, Molecules and More".
- The challenge will be announced on the first of every month starting from October, 2025.
- Each of the top 10 winning solutions will receive a cash prize of ₹1 lakh along with recognition and mentoring support. Additionally, 100 selected awardees will receive up to ₹25 lakh in two installments through BIRAC.
- **BioE3 Policy:** India's first biotechnology policy.
- Union Cabinet approval: On August 24, 2024.
- **Implementation:** Department of Biotechnology (DBT).
- Target: US\$300 billion by 2030.
- Objective: To drive economic growth, environmental sustainability and job creation in India.







- According to the Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, a target has been set to increase the global share of sports manufacturing from 1 percent to 25 percent by the year 2036.
