Mukhyamantri Mangala Pashu Bima Yojana:

- Keeping in mind the interests of the cattle rearers of the state, with a view to provide financial security/economic strengthening to the cattle rearers by insuring their invaluable livestock, it was announced by the state government in the budget for the financial year 2024-25. According to the scheme, it is proposed to provide insurance coverage by insuring 5-5 lakh milch cows/buffaloes, 5-5 lakh sheep/goats and 1 lakh camel breed animals (camels) in the state. This scheme will incur an expenditure of Rs. 400 crores.
- **Benefits of the scheme:** Risk of livestock of cow, buffalo, sheep, goat and camel rearing families of the state will be covered and financial support will be provided to the animal rearing families on accidental death of animals.

Support amount:

Status of cattle in the 20th livestock census:

- Total livestock in Rajasthan is 56.8 million. (decrease of 1.66%).
- Rajasthan ranks sixth in the country with an increase of 4.41% in cattle.
- The 21st livestock census was conducted all over India from October 25, 2024 to March 31, 2025, it includes counting of 15 species of domestic animals.

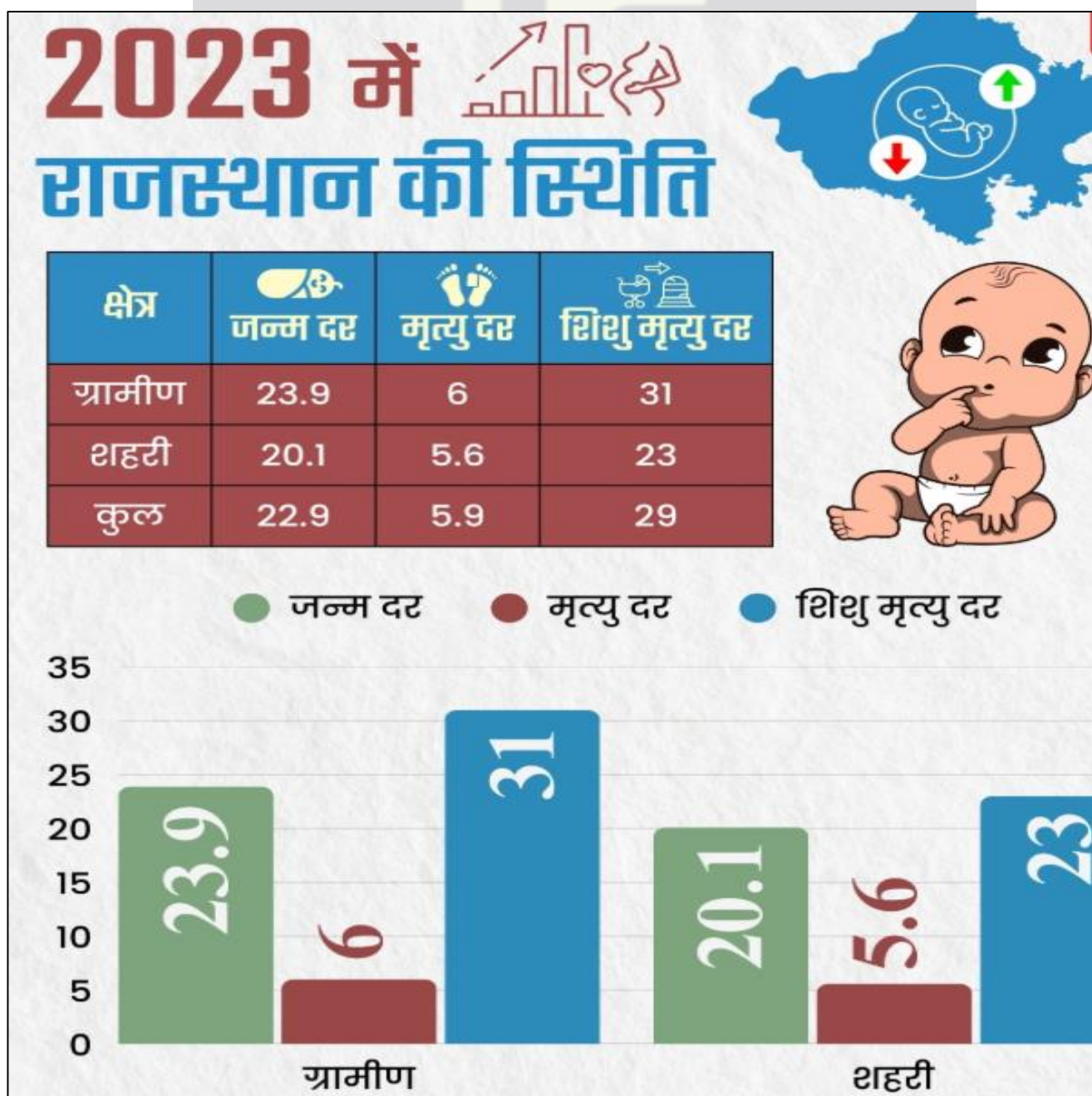

Maternal mortality rate in Rajasthan



Why in News?

- The latest data related to birth rate, death rate and infant mortality rate of the country and states has come out in the Sample Registration System (SRS) Statistics Report, 2023, released by the Office of the Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India.





Key Points:



- According to the report, the total mortality rate in India in the year 2022 was 6.8 percent per thousand population, which was 7.2 in rural areas and 6.0 in urban areas and in the year 2023, it declined and the total mortality rate was 6.4, of which 6.8 in rural areas and 5.7 in urban areas.

Maternal mortality rate in Rajasthan:

Indicator	Year 2022	Year 2023
Death Rate	6.2% (Rural: 6.3%, Urban: 5.9%)	5.9% (Rural: 6.0%, Urban: 5.6%)
Birth Rate	23.8% (Rural: 24.9%, Urban: 20.8%)	22.9% (Rural: 23.9%, Urban: 20.1%)
Infant Mortality Rate	30% (Rural: 31, Urban: 24)	29% (Rural: 31, Urban: 23)

- According to this report, Bihar leads the country with a birth rate of 25.8 percent, followed by Uttar Pradesh (23.6) and then Rajasthan (22.9).
- **Conclusion:** According to SRS Report, 2023, the birth rate in Rajasthan is above the national level and the state is ranked third, while in terms of mortality rate, Rajasthan is in a better position, as fewer deaths have been recorded here than the national average, but infant mortality rate is still a matter of concern, as it is higher than the national average and needs improvement especially in rural areas.

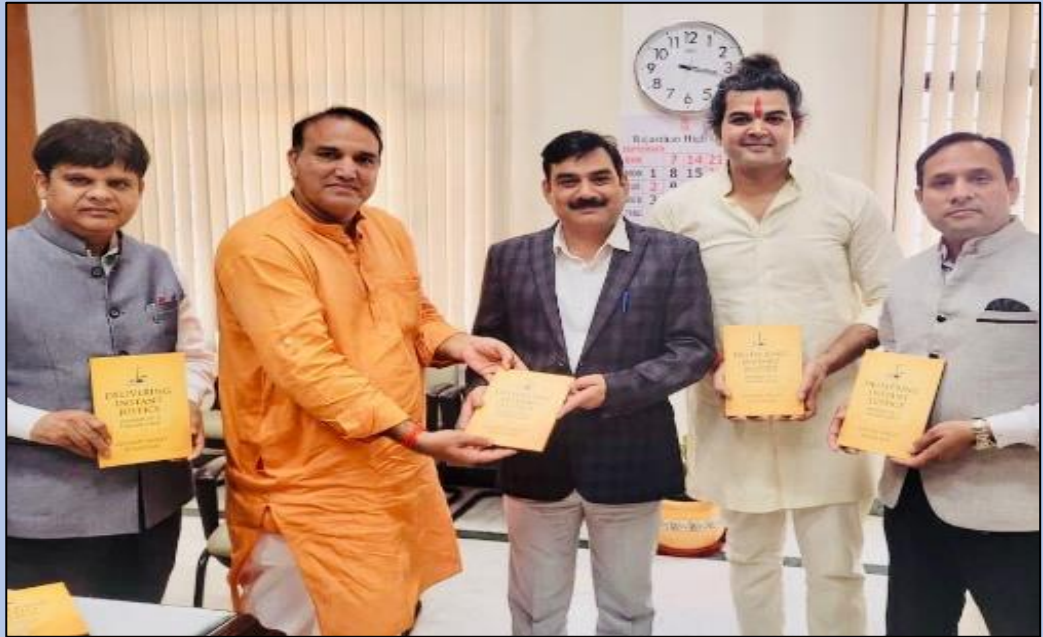
Second largest hanging bridge of Rajasthan

Russia: Kamchatka Peninsula: Famous Places



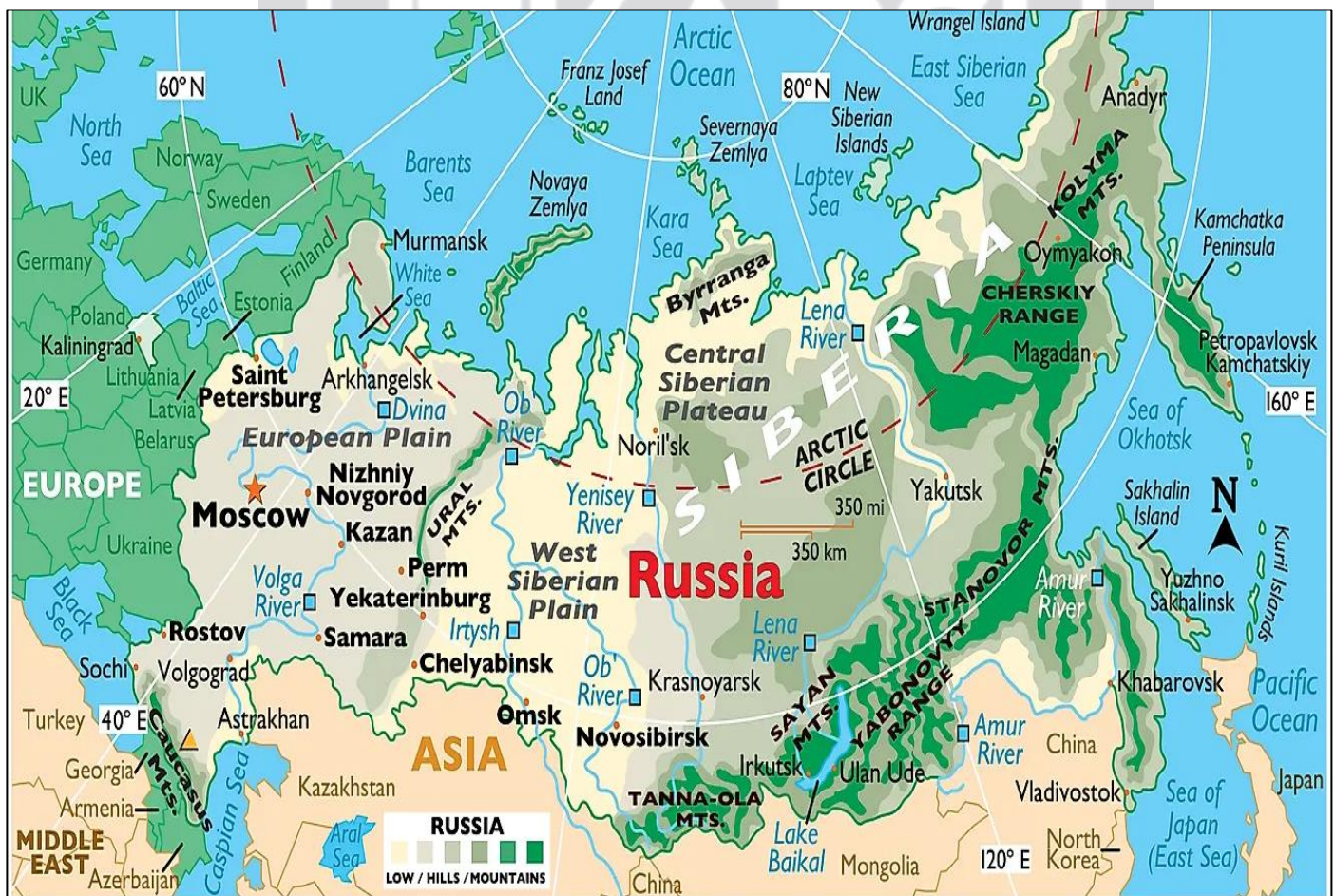
Why in News?

- An earthquake of magnitude 7.4 has struck Russia's Kamchatka Peninsula. A tsunami warning has been issued here after the earthquake.



Key Points:

- The Kamchatka Peninsula is located between the Bering Sea and the Pacific Ocean in the east and the Sea of Okhotsk in the west.
- Kamchatka in Russia, which is part of the Pacific 'Ring of Fire', has been the epicenter of seismic activity this year.

Geographical location

- **Capital:** Moscow
- Russia is spread across both continents, Asia and Europe. It is the largest country in the world by area.
- **Bordering countries:** Azerbaijan, Belarus, China, Estonia, Finland, Georgia, Kazakhstan, North Korea, Latvia, Lithuania, Mongolia, Norway, Poland and Ukraine.

Geographical features:

- **Mountain ranges:** Ural, Altai.
- **Highest peak:** Gora Elbrus (highest point in Europe).
- **Major rivers:** Yenisei-Angara, Amur, Irtysh, Lena.
- **Major lakes:** Baikal, Ladoga, Onega, Caspian Sea etc.

Approval for tiger translocation



Why in News?

- Eight tigers (three males and five females) from Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserve and Pench Tiger Reserve will be translocated to Sahyadri Tiger Reserve.



Key Points:

- The initiative aims to repopulate the tiger population in the northern Western Ghats.
- The ministry has approved the translocation under Section 12 of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
- Under the Act, prior permission from the central government is mandatory for translocation of Schedule-I animals and from the state government for any other wildlife.
- The MoEFCC has the power to cancel this permission if there is a security related incident.
- The National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) had already approved the translocation.

TIGER RESERVES OF INDIA

MARCH 2025



Sahyadri Tiger Reserve:

- **Establishment:** It was established in 2010, by merging Chandoli National Park and Koyna Wildlife Sanctuary.
- **Location:** It is located in the Sahyadri range of the Western Ghats, in Maharashtra. It is the northernmost habitat of tigers in the Western Ghats.
- The "Shivsagar" reservoir of the Koyna River and the "Vasant Sagar" reservoir of the Warana River are located here.
- **Vegetation:** Moist deciduous forest. Trees like Anjani, Jambhul, Pisa etc.
- **Fauna:** Wild dogs, leopards, gaur (Indian bison), sambar, four-horned antelope, mouse deer, giant squirrel, Indian long-billed vulture, endemic hornbill and Indian river tern etc. are found here.

India's non-fossil capacity



Why in News?

- According to the Union Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, India's non-fossil capacity will reach 251.5 GW by September 2025.
- This achievement puts India among the top countries with clean energy capacity and represents significant progress towards the 500 GW renewable energy target by 2030 set under the Paris Agreement.

'Gyan Bharatam Portal'



Why in News?

- The Prime Minister has launched the 'Gyan Bharatam Portal' for the conservation of manuscripts.



Key Points:

- This portal will help in digitizing India's manuscript heritage.
- The Gyan Bharatam Mission was announced in the Union Budget 2025-26. It aims to survey, document and conserve India's manuscript heritage.


Manuscript:

- These are handwritten works on paper, tree bark, cloth, metal, palm leaves or any other material that are at least 75 years old. They have scientific, historical or artistic significance.
- Lithographs and printed texts are not considered manuscripts. Lithograph is a technique in which pictures, letters etc. are engraved on stone and printed on paper.

Other initiatives for the conservation of manuscripts

- **National Manuscript Mission (NMM):** It was launched in 2003, by the Ministry of Tourism and Culture to explore and preserve manuscripts.
- **National Library of India, Kolkata:** Around 3600 historically important manuscripts are preserved here.
- **Asiatic Society of Bengal:** It was founded in 1784, by Sir William Jones. It now undertakes digitisation of ancient manuscripts.
