## 🦙 RAJASTHAN 🦀



First State in the Country to Auction Pre-Embedded Blocks - Rajasthan

#### $\bigcirc$ Why in News?

The Rajasthan Mines Department announced the start of the auction process for pre-embedded blocks of major minerals.

## **Key Points:**

- Thus, Rajasthan will be the first state in the country to auction pre-embedded blocks.
- Pre-embedded Clearance: The process of auctioning mineral blocks by obtaining necessary permissions in advance is called pre-embedded clearance.
- The Union Ministry of Mines has amended the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957, directing all states to prepare at least five blocks for auction with all the necessary permissions.
- The Rajasthan State Mineral Exploration Trust (RSMET) has been designated as the Project Monitoring Unit for these auctions.

**Facts for Prelims (Economic Survey – 2024-25)** 

#### **Mining Sector in Rajasthan:**

- Rajasthan is one of India's richest states in terms of mineral resources, with deposits of 81 types of minerals, of which 58 are mined.
- Rajasthan is the sole producer of lead and zinc ores, selenite, and wollastonite, and also leads the country in the production of silver, calcite, and gypsum.
- Rajasthan tops the national production of ball clay, phosphorite, ochre, steatite, feldspar, and fire clay.





- Rajasthan is a major producer of dimensional stones such as marble, sandstone, and granite, as well as cement-grade and steel-grade limestone.
- A revenue target of ₹9,500 crore has been set for the Department of Mines and Geology for the year 2024-25.

Rajasthan Mineral Policy - 2024

- Released on December 4, 2024.
- The Rajasthan Mineral Policy 2024 aims to promote sustainable, transparent, and responsible mineral development by leveraging the state's abundant mineral resources for economic growth while ensuring environmental protection and community welfare.

**Key Features:** 

- Economic Growth and Investment: It aims to promote mineral-based industries, attract investment, and increase the sector's contribution to the state's Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP).
- **Employment Generation:** It aims to provide direct and indirect employment opportunities to over 10 million people by 2047.
- Sustainability and ESG Compliance: It aims to implement zero-waste mining, environmentally friendly technologies, and waste management strategies.
- **Technology Integration:** It aims to ensure transparency by adopting advanced exploration techniques, AI-based monitoring, and digital governance.
- Illegal Mining Mitigation: It aims to prevent illegal activities using GPS-based tracking, geo-fencing, and real-time monitoring.

**Key Initiatives:** 

- **Increasing mineral extraction from 58 to 70 by 2047.**
- Auctioning 50 key mineral blocks with pre-determined approvals.





- Increasing the mining concession area to 2 percent of the state's total land area by 2047.
- Promoting strategic and critical minerals (such as lithium, rare earth elements) to support clean energy.
- Establishing a state mining company for value addition and research in mineral resources.

**Other Key Points:** 

**Rajasthan State Mineral Exploration Trust (RSMET)** 

- It was formed in 2020.
- Objective: To manage and monitor mining related activities, including scientific exploration and mining of mineral deposits in Rajasthan, utilizing modern technology, research and development, while improving skill development and revenue generation.

### **Drone Training for Indian Soldiers in Rajasthan**

#### Why in News?

■ Indian soldiers are being trained to fly drones at the Malaviya National Institute of Technology (MNIT) in Jaipur.



- This training is being provided at the MNIT Innovation and Incubation Center (MIIC), where the training is being provided by the Hogwarts School of Drones startup.
- This initiative aims to make drone operations a standard military capability across all branches of the Army.
- The Army Chief announced the creation of a drone platoon in each infantry battalion during the 26th Kargil Vijay Diwas (July 26, 2025).
- The Indian Army is rapidly inducting drones and anti-drone systems, with one such unit recently established in Likabali, Arunachal Pradesh.





#### **Facts for Prelims:**

#### **Imported Drones:**

- Heron Series: These Israeli-made drones form the backbone of the Indian Army's surveillance fleet, capable of long-range flights at high altitudes.
- MO-9B SeaGuardian: A high-altitude, long-endurance drone, primarily used for naval surveillance and maritime patrol, acquired from the US. **Indigenous Drones:**
- Tapas-BH (Rustom-2): A medium-altitude, long-endurance UAV developed by DRDO for reconnaissance and target acquisition.
- Nagastra-1: A man-portable loitering munition (suicide drone) for highprecision, GPS-enabled strikes on enemy targets.
- Rudrastra: A hybrid vertical take-off and landing (VTOL) tactical drone capable of carrying smart warheads for airburst explosions.
- Netra: A lightweight, autonomous drone developed by DRDO and IdeaForge for surveillance and reconnaissance, which can be deployed in various military and civilian applications.



Guidance Book on Mapping of Harmonized System of **Nomenclature (HSN) Codes** 

#### Why in News?

On September 20, 2025, the Union Minister of Commerce and Industry released the Guidance Book on Mapping of Harmonized System of Nomenclature (HSN) Codes, prepared by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), during the "Celebrating 10 Years of Make in India and Discussing Next Generation Reforms 2.0" event in New Delhi.

- This guidance book allocates 12,167 HSN codes to 31 ministries and departments of the Government of India.
- Objective: To promote the adoption of a data-driven approach for manufacturing development, investment promotion, and ease of doing business.
- It will also promote more effective trade negotiations, in line with national economic priorities and domain strengths.
- Content of the Book: The development of this guidance book has its roots in the observation of the persistent challenges arising during trade negotiations, import substitution efforts and addressing the concerns of the industry due to lack of definitive mapping of HSN codes.

India and Brazil: 'Maitri 2.0' Cross-Incubation Programme

### **♥** Why in News?

On September 22, 2025, the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) launched the second edition of the Brazil-India Agritech Cross-Incubation Programme (Maitri 2.0) in New Delhi.



#### **Key Points:**

- The Maitri 2.0 programme reflects the comprehensive Brazil-India strategic partnership, in line with the shared vision of the leaders of both countries for cooperation in agriculture, emerging technologies, and food and nutrition security.
- 'Maitri 2.0' aims to strengthen incubator relationships, exchange best practices, promote co-incubation, and open new opportunities for bilateral cooperation in sustainable agriculture, digital technologies, and value-chain development.
- It highlights the 77-year-old partnership between India and Brazil.
- ICAR has increased its patents from 74 in 1996 to over 1,800 annually, supported by incubation centers and over 5,000 licensing agreements.

#### **Other Highlights:**

- India and Brazil signed six important agreements during the state visit of the Prime Minister of India to Brazil.
- The Indian Prime Minister was also awarded Brazil's highest civilian honor i.e. the "Grand Collar of the National Order of the Southern Cross."

- Agreement on the Exchange and Protection of Confidential Information 1.
- 2. Agreement on Cooperation to Combat International Terrorism and **Transnational Organized Crime**
- Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between Brazil's 3. EMBRAPA and the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) for **Cooperation in Renewable Energy and Agricultural Research**
- 4. Memorandum of Understanding was signed on Large-Scale Exchange of **Digital Technologies to Promote Digital Transformation**
- 5. A Memorandum of Understanding on Intellectual Property was signed, and the establishment of a ministerial-level mechanism to monitor trade, commerce, and investment was also announced.
- Priority Areas for the next Decade: Defence and security, food and nutrition security, energy transition, and climate change.

#### **India-Brazil Relations:**

- Beginning: Relations between the two countries were established in 1948, and the two countries have been strategic partners since 2006.
- Global Cooperation: The two countries work together in groups such as BRICS, BASIC, G-20, G-4, IBSA, and on major international platforms such as the UN, WTO, UNESCO, and WIPO.
- Trade: Bilateral trade between the two countries reached US\$12.20 billion in 2024-25, with India in a trade surplus.
- Brazil is currently India's largest trading partner in South America.
- **Defense Cooperation:** A defence cooperation agreement was signed in 2006, under which a Joint Defence Committee (JDC) was established as an institutional mechanism to ensure regular cooperation.
- Renewable Energy: Brazil is a co-founding member of the Global Biofuels Alliance.
- Brazil ratified the International Solar Alliance (ISA) agreement in 2022.





# IMPORTANT DAYS

Sign Language Day: September 23





- Event: September 23, 2025, at the Dr. Ambedkar International Centre (DAIC), New Delhi.
- Organized by: Indian Sign Language Research and Training Centre (ISLRTC), an autonomous body under the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MOSJE), Central Government.
- Objective: To raise awareness about the importance of sign language in realizing the human rights of deaf people.
- Main Goal: To preserve sign languages and deaf culture as prerequisites for the realization of human rights of deaf people.
- **Theme:** "No Human Rights Without Sign Language Rights"
- Reason: September 23rd was chosen to commemorate the founding of the World Federation of the Deaf in 1951.





#### Key initiatives launched at the Sign Language Festival:

- 1. ISLRTC bi-annual newsletter – a platform for sharing research, training, and community achievements.
- 2. A six-month online ISL training program – accessible nationwide, bridging the urban-rural divide.
- **3.** 100 STEM vocabulary in ISL – for better understanding of advanced science and technology topics.
- 4. English language teaching program (with TEHC) – to improve English proficiency and employability.
- **5.** 3,189 ISL e-content videos – the largest digital repository of ISL resources for learners and teachers.
- ISL integration with the "Project Inclusion App" to promote inclusive **6.** education in mainstream classrooms.
- In this event, the winners of the 8th National Indian Sign Language 7. Competition, 2025 (held in 13 categories with participation from schools across the country) were honored.


#### **Other Important Points:**

- United Nations General Assembly declared September **International Sign Language Day.**
- The concept of International Sign Language Day was introduced by the World Federation of the Deaf (WFD), an organization representing the human rights of approximately 70 million deaf persons through its 135 national member associations.

- **Edition: 10th.**
- **Organizer:** Ministry of AYUSH.
- Special Focus: Focused on "Coordination in Cancer Treatment," "Digital Transformation of Ayurveda," and "Samhita to Dialogue."

- The Ministry of AYUSH launched several people-centric initiatives on Ayurveda Day 2025: these included awareness campaigns such as "Small Steps to Wellness" for students, "Gumarah Ko Raah Dikhaye" to counter false advertising, and "Ayurveda Diet for Obesity" to combat false advertising on obesity as well as programs on Ayurveda for plant and veterinary health.
