

- Under this scheme, students are encouraged to submit their best original ideas or innovative proposals. Selected students receive an incentive of ₹10,000 for creating a scientific model of their ideas.
- The INSPIRE scheme (Innovation in Science Pursuit for Inspired Research) was launched by the Department of Science and Technology (DST) in 2008.

- Significance of the festival: This festival promotes reverence for nature, sustainability, inclusiveness, and community spirit.



- People of this community live in Upper Assam, especially in the Tinsukia, Dibrugarh, and Sivasagar districts.



- Why in News?
- Mega Tinkering Day 2025, a flagship initiative under NITI Aayog's Atal Innovation Mission, has made it to the prestigious India Book of Records and Asia Book of Records.









Key Points:

- Official confirmation and formal announcement of this record: September 15,
 2025
- Reason: This is a new record for the maximum number of students participating in a tinkering activity in a single day.
- On August 12, 2025, 473,350 students from 9,467 Atal Tinkering Lab (ATL) schools came together to create a solution for a clean India and built their own DIY vacuum cleaner through a live, step-by-step online session.
- Since its inception, the Atal Innovation Mission has established over 10,000 Atal Tinkering Labs across the country, creating a national-level network where students gain hands-on experience in technologies such as 3D printing, robotics, the Internet of Things (IoT), and electronics.








Green Strategic Partnership



Kuno National Park (KNP)



A cheetah died in a conflict with a leopard in Kuno National Park. This is the first such incident since cheetahs were introduced from Namibia in 2022.

Key Points:

Kuno National Park (KNP):

- This park is named after the Kuno River, a tributary of the Chambal River.
- Location: It is located in the Vindhya mountain ranges in Sheopur district of Madhya Pradesh.
- It was first declared a wildlife sanctuary and later a national park.
- It is famous for the reintroduction project of Asiatic lions and leopards.
- Flora: Trees such as Kardai, Salai, and Khair are mainly found here.



HSBC Report: India's IT Sector to Grow by 6-7% by 2027



According to a report by HSBC Global Investment Research, India's IT sector is expected to grow at a rate of 6-7 percent in the financial year 2026-27.



Key Points:

- IT sector revenue will grow by 5-6 percent in the next financial year (FY26). However, this increase in project volume, i.e., workload, could be 8-10 percent.
- The increasing use of artificial intelligence (AI) has put pressure on traditional IT contracts, but companies' increasing spending on technology is balancing this challenge.
- The report also states that as AI agents transform into "multi-agent systems" and companies are forced to redesign their software architecture and infrastructure, new opportunities will arise for Indian IT companies.
- HSBC also clarified that advanced "agentic AI" systems will not completely rePlace IT services.

India is the world's third-largest automobile market

Why in News?

- Recently, India's automobile market surpassed Japan to become the world's third-largest.
- At the Save International 2025 Value Summit held in New Delhi, the Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways expressed ambitious future plans to establish India as a global leader in automobile manufacturing, green mobility, and infrastructure innovation.



Key Points:

- Goal: To reach the top spot in the next five years.
- India's two-wheeler sector exports more than 50 percent of its production.
- India has launched electric vehicles, hydrogen fuel, and hydrogen trucks as alternative fuels to address clean transportation.
- India has the world's second-largest road network.

■ Globally, India is the largest manufacturer of three-wheelers, one of the top 2 manufacturers of two-wheelers in the world, one of the top 4 manufacturers of passenger vehicles, and one of the top 5 manufacturers of commercial vehicles in the world.

Other important points:

- Government of India's efforts: The automobile sector contributes approximately 6 percent to India's national GDP.
- 1. GST rate: GST on electric vehicles reduced from 12 percent to 5 percent.
- 2. Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for Automobile and Auto
 Component Industry in India (PLI-Auto): September 23, 2021
- 3. Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of (Hybrid and) Electric Vehicles in India (FAME India) Scheme Phase-II: The government implemented this scheme from April 1, 2019, for a period of five years, with a total budgetary support of ₹11,500 crore.
- 4. PM Electric Drive Revolution in Innovation Vehicle Promotion (PM e-Drive)
 Scheme: This scheme, with an outlay of ₹10,900 crore, was notified on
 September 29, 2024. It is a two-year scheme aimed at supporting electric
 vehicles, including e-2Ws, e-3Ws, e-trucks, e-buses, e-ambulances, upgrading
 EV public charging stations and vehicle testing agencies.
- 5. The Ministry of Power has released guidelines and standards for EV charging infrastructure titled "Guidelines for Setting up and Operation of Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure 2024" on September 17, 2024.

India's First PM MITRA Park: Madhya Pradesh

- Why in News?
- On September 17, 2025, the Prime Minister laid the foundation stone for the country's first PM MITRA Park in Bhainsola village, Dhar district, Madhya Pradesh, under the PM Mitra Yojana.
- During this, the Swasth Nari, Sashakt Parivar, and Poshan Abhiyaan were launched through a single click and the Suman Sakhi chatbot was inaugurated.

- Implementation: Each Park will be operated in a public-private partnership (PPP) mode by a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV).
- Competitive Incentive Support (CIS): To encourage speedy implementation, CIS up to ₹ 300 crore per park will also be provided to the units in PM MITRA Parks.

Global Innovation Index (GII)

- Why in News?
- The World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) has released the Global Innovation Index (GII) 2025.

Key Points:

- The GII measures the innovation performance of 139 countries worldwide, based on investment patterns, technological progress, adoption rates, and socio-economic impacts.
- The index was launched in 2007 and is recognized by the United Nations General Assembly as an authoritative reference for science, technology, and innovation (STI) policies.
- Theme of the GII 2025: This year's report is titled "Innovation at a Crossroads," highlighting the growing innovation in technologies like artificial intelligence (AI) and slowing investment growth.

Key Points of the GII 2025:

- **India:** India's rank in the index has currently fallen to 38th.
 - o India has outperformed expectations for its growth level for the 15th consecutive year.
- **Innovative Economies:** Switzerland tops the index, followed by Sweden, the United States, South Korea, and Singapore.

- Top Innovation Clusters: Shenzhen-Hong Kong-Guangzhou (China and Hong Kong), followed by Tokyo-Yokohama (Japan), and San Jose-San Francisco (United States).

- Challenges for India: India imports 85% of its crude oil and 45% of its natural gas needs. A shortage of these could lead to an oil and gas crisis in the country. **Policy Suggestions for India:**
- India should import from multiple sources, increase its strategic oil reserves, accelerate domestic oil and gas exploration, and emphasize the adoption of clean energy options such as green hydrogen and biofuels.
