Amendment to Free Uniform Scheme

Why in News?

■ Recently, the 'Free Uniform Scheme' was amended by the 'Rajasthan School Education Council'.

Key Points:

- As per the amendment, the uniform amount previously provided by the Education Department to General and OBC category students up to class 8 has been discontinued.
- Also, 1.2 million girls from classes 9th to 12th have been excluded from this scheme.
- As per the new provisions, the uniform amount will be transferred to the accounts of all girls from classes 1st to 8th and SC-ST and BPL boys through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT).
- **Amount:** All girls from classes 1st to 8th and SC, ST and BPL students will receive ₹600 for uniforms.





■ Report: The UN chief outlined proposals for radical changes to the structure of the United Nations, the way its institutions cooperate, and its operations.

The UN presented proposals to strengthen functioning across the following three pillars:



- Objective: To inform Member States' deliberations on ways to strengthen the United Nations system and ensure all reforms are carried out in accordance with applicable rules and procedures, including the UN Charter.
- The report emphasizes the need for synergy, reduced duplication of tasks, and more effective cooperation.

Proposals made in this report for key areas:

Security	establishing centers of excellence for peacebuilding and women, etc.

Other key points:

UN80 Initiative:

- The UN80 Initiative is a plan to undertake necessary reforms across the entire United Nations system.
- Objective: To make the organization more effective and efficient, streamline operations, and make it relevant to a changing world.

It is divided into three workstreams:

First

 Focus on improving internal efficiency and effectiveness.

Second

 To review and examine the mandate documents that define the functions of the United Nations Secretariat.

Third

 Implement structural changes and program reforms across the entire United Nations system.

United Nations Security Council:

- **Established:** 1945 by the United Nations Charter.
- It is one of the six principal organs of the United Nations.
- The UNSC has 15 members: 5 permanent members (P5) + 10 non-permanent members (elected for 2-year terms).
- 5 permanent members: United States, Russian Federation, France, China, and the United Kingdom.
- India has served as a non-permanent member of the UNSC 8 times.


Strategic Mutual Defense Agreement

Why in News?

■ Pakistan and Saudi Arabia signed the Strategic Mutual Defense Agreement.

Key Points:

- Objective: To develop various aspects of defense cooperation between the two countries and strengthen joint deterrence against any aggression.
- According to the agreement, any aggression against either country will be considered an aggression against both.







Impact:

- Regional security: For Saudi Arabia, this strengthens security against threats related to Iran, Yemen's Houthi rebels, and Israel.
- Nuclear war: The agreement also involves Pakistan giving up its nuclear security to Saudi Arabia, further raising concerns of nuclear war.
- **Strategic shift:** This reduces the traditional role of the United States in the region, as America's ally, Israel, is attacking Gaza and other regional neighbors.
 - o China could exploit the strategic vacuum created in the region to expand its influence.
- Implications for India: In light of India's retaliatory actions against crossborder terrorism, Pakistan could use this agreement as a strategic deterrent in the event of a future military conflict with India.

India-Saudi Arabia Relations

- The strategic partnership between the two countries was formalized through the Riyadh Declaration in 2010.
- **Economic:** India is Saudi Arabia's second-largest trading partner, while Saudi Arabia is India's fifth-largest.
 - o Bilateral trade was \$42.98 billion in 2023, and India remained a net importer.
 - o About 6.7% of total remittances to India in 2024 came from Saudi Arabia.
- **Energy Partnership:** Saudi Arabia is India's third-largest crude oil supplier.

Chabahar Port

Why in News?

■ The US administration announced the withdrawal of the sanctions waiver granted to the India-developed Chabahar Port in Iran.

Key Points:

■ The US had exempted the Chabahar Port project from sanctions imposed on Iran in 2018.

Chabahar Port:

- It is a deepwater port located in Iran's Sistan-Baluchistan province. It is located on the Gulf of Oman.
- It is the closest Iranian port to India. It provides India access to landlocked Afghanistan and other Central Asian countries without going through Pakistan.
- In 2024, India signed a contract granting the state-owned company India Ports Global Limited (IPGL), rights develop and operate the port for 10 years.
- Furthermore, the port is also part of the proposed International North-South Transport Corridor (INSTC). This corridor connects India to Europe, Russia, Central Asia, and more.

High Seas Treaty

Why in News?

The 60th ratification (60 countries) paves the way for the High Seas Treaty to enter into force.

Key Points:

The High Seas Treaty was adopted by the Intergovernmental Conference on Marine Biological Diversity in Areas Beyond National Jurisdiction (BBNJ) in 2023.

High Seas Treaty:

- Formal name: 'Agreement on the Conservation and Sustainable Use of Marine Biological Diversity in Areas Beyond National Jurisdiction' (BBNJ) Convention).
- It is a legally binding treaty.
- It was adopted under the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS) on the Conservation of Marine Biological Diversity in Areas **Beyond National Jurisdiction.**
 - o It is the third implementing agreement of UNCLOS. The other two agreements are the 1994 Convention on the Implementation of UNCLOS and the 1995 United Nations Fisheries Stocks Convention.
- High Seas: This is the maritime area that is beyond the jurisdiction of any country. It is a global commons that all countries can use for legitimate international purposes, such as navigation, overflight, laying of undersea cables and pipelines, etc.

India and the High Seas Treaty

- In 2024, the Union Cabinet approved the signing of the High Seas Treaty.
- **Implementing Ministry: Ministry of Earth Sciences.**





H-1B Visa



■ The US President has signed a provision imposing an annual fee of \$100,000 on H-1B visa applications.

Key Points:

H-1B Visa:

- This is a non-immigrant visa in the United States that allows skilled workers to work temporarily.
- These typically include IT, engineering, and medical professions. They require a bachelor's degree or equivalent experience.
- **Sponsorship:** This visa requires sponsorship from employers (companies).
- Validity: It is initially valid for 3 years. However, it can be extended to 6 years.
- Annual limit: 65,000 visas are issued each year, with an additional 20,000 visas available for advanced-degree holders.



Make in India Completes Decade



■ On September 20, 2025, the Union Minister of Commerce and Industry released a Make in India commemorative coin in New Delhi to mark the completion of a decade of the Make in India initiative.

Key Points:

Achievements of the Scheme:

- 1. Foreign Direct Investment: Between 2014 and 2024, India received US\$667 billion in foreign direct investment, representing nearly two-thirds of all investments since liberalization.
- 2. Ease of Doing Business: The country has also made significant progress in terms of ease of doing business, rising from 142nd in 2014 to 63rd in the World Bank's Doing Business Report 2020.
- 3. Merchandise Exports: Merchandise exports reached US\$437.42 billion in FY 2024-25, establishing India as an important player in global trade.
- 4. Startup Ecosystem: India's startup ecosystem has grown to over 180,000 DPIIT-recognized startups, making it the third largest globally after the US and China.
- 5. Note: Over 17.6 lakh jobs are expected to be created with 118 unicorns by 2025.
- 6. Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme: The Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme, with an outlay of Rs 1.97 lakh crore across 14 sectors, has attracted investments worth approximately Rs 1.88 lakh crore, creating over 12 lakh direct and indirect jobs.
- 7. Expanding India's Industrial Capabilities:
- 8. India has become the world's second-largest mobile phone manufacturer, producing 99 percent of its smartphones domestically.
- 9. Defense Exports: Key defense platforms such as the Dhanush artillery gun system, the Arjun main battle tank (MBT), the Tejas light combat aircraft (LCA), and several submarines have been developed and are being exported to many countries.





- 10. Prioritizing High-Value Manufacturing and Research and Development: As a result, India's ranking in the Global Innovation Index has improved by 42 places since 2015. Currently, India ranks 39th on this index. This improvement reflects India's global competitiveness.
- 11. Boosting India's Manufacturing Competitiveness: Currently, India has one of the lowest tax rates among Asian countries. This has increased India's economic attractiveness globally.
- 12. Steps towards sustainable development: For example, the National Green Hydrogen Mission will create over 600,000 jobs. Furthermore, it will reduce dependence on natural gas and ammonia imports, resulting in savings of ₹1 lakh crore.

Other key points:

Make in India Initiative:

- Launched: September 25, 2014
- Objective: To transform India into a global hub for manufacturing, foreign investment, design, and innovation.

Other objectives:

- 1. To increase the growth rate of Indian industry to 12-14 percent per year.
- 2. To create 100 million jobs in the industrial sector by 2022.
- 3. To increase the share of the manufacturing sector in India's GDP to 25 percent by 2022. This target has now been revised to 2025.
- Objective: 'Vocal for Local'.

Pillars of "Make in India":

1. New Processes: Under this, ease of doing business has been recognized as the most important component for promoting entrepreneurship.





- 2. New Infrastructure: It emphasizes the development of industrial corridors and smart cities and the integration of cutting-edge technology and high-speed communication facilities to develop world-class infrastructure.
- 3. New Sectors: Foreign direct investment has been allowed in defense production, insurance, medical devices, manufacturing, and railway infrastructure.
- 4. New Mindset: The role of the government has been defined as a facilitator rather than a regulator.

Key Initiatives Launched to Promote 'Make in India'

- 1. Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) Schemes: PLI schemes have been announced with a budget of ₹1.97 lakh crore for 14 key sectors to enhance India's manufacturing capabilities and exports from India.
- 2. PM GatiShakti: Achieving the goal of Atmanirbhar Bharat and a \$5 trillion economy by 2025 through multimodal and last-mile connectivity infrastructure.
- 3. Semiconductor Ecosystem Development: The Semicon India Programme (2021) has been approved with an outlay of ₹76,000 crore to promote the development of a sustainable semiconductor and display ecosystem.
- 4. National Logistics Policy (2022): Promoting economic growth and competitiveness through an integrated, efficient, and sustainable logistics network by leveraging advanced technology and best practices.
- 5. Start-up India: Launched to support entrepreneurs, build a strong start-up ecosystem, and transform India into a job-generating nation.
- 6. Tax Reforms: The implementation of GST has unified the country's tax structure, reducing production costs, and increasing overall efficiency and productivity.

India AI Mission

■ The Union Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) has announced that 500 data labs will be set up across the country under the India AI Mission.

India AI Mission:

- Initial: Launched by MeitY in 2024.
- Goal: To promote AI innovation by ensuring universal access to computing, enhancing data quality, and developing indigenous AI capabilities.
- Implementing Agency: IndiaAI, an autonomous business division under MeitY.



India's Logistics Cost Mechanism



On September 20, 2025, in New Delhi to mark the completion of a decade of "Make in India," the Union Minister of Commerce and Industry released a report on estimating logistics costs in India.





Key Points:

- According to the current estimate prepared by NCAER for DPIIT, logistics costs in India are estimated to be approximately 7.97 percent of total GDP.
- For the first time, a comprehensive and scientifically derived estimate of logistics costs in India will be obtained using a mixed methodology combining secondary data with nationwide surveys.
- This initiative follows the mandate of the National Logistics Policy (2022) to establish uniform framework for measuring logistics costs and standardizing them in line with global practices.





- The report provides a comprehensive overview of logistics costs across multiple transport modes, product categories, and firm sizes.
- Estimates over the past five years indicate that the growth rate of logistics costs is gradually slowing compared to non-service production.
- This improvement can be attributed to initiatives such as the Pradhan Mantri Gatishakti National Master Plan, Dedicated Freight Corridors, Bharatmala Project, Sagarmala Project, Integrated Check Posts, Development of Unified Logistics Interface Platform (ULIP), and Logistics Efficiency Enhancement Programme (LEAP).

Exercise

First bilateral exercise between India and Greece



■ On September 18, 2025, the first bilateral maritime exercise between the Indian Navy and the Hellenic Navy of Greece concluded in the Mediterranean Sea.



Key Points:

The exercise was conducted in two phases:

First port phase: September 13-17, 2025 at Salamis Naval Base.



Second sea phase: September 17 and 18, 2025

- The Indian Navy was represented by the guided missile stealth frigate INS Trikand.
- Harbour Phase: Personnel from both navies engaged in cross-deck visits, professional interactions among crews, and a pre-sail conference held on board the Elli class frigate HS Themistocles of the Hellenic Navy, aimed at promoting mutual understanding and synergy.
- Sea Phase: Complex maritime maneuvers and tactical exercises were conducted between units of both navies, including VBSS operations, replenishment procedures at sea, joint anti-submarine warfare, coordinated gun firing, and cross-deck helicopter operations, enhancing interoperability.
