

Why in News?

On demand exam system launched in Rajasthan

Why in News?

■ On the occasion of National Teachers' Day, 'On Demand Exam System' was launched from Jaipur by Chief Minister Bhajanlal Sharma.



- Under this, those students who fail in board or supplementary examination will get an opportunity to pass the same year.
- Rajasthan is the first state in the country to implement such a system. Students who fail in 10th and 12th in 75 boards of the country will be able to participate in this examination.
- In the initial phase of this system, the examination will be conducted in the DIET of Jaipur, Udaipur and Bikaner divisions in October 2025. At the same time, examination centers will be set up in 41 districts of the state in the coming session.

The largest breeding colony of vultures in South-East
Asia: Mukundra

Why in News?

■ The largest breeding colony of vultures in South-East Asia is located in Mukundra Hills in Kota.

Key Points:

Till now 7 species of vultures have been identified in this area and currently there are more than 1500 Indian vultures in the Chambal region.



- These species of vultures breed in the ravines of Chambal. Vultures are called natural scavengers, because they eat dead animals around forests and population.
- At present, Diclofenac is the main factor responsible for the decreasing number of vultures.

Facts for Prelims:

Diclofenac:

- Diclofenac is a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAIDS). The drug was banned for veterinary use by the Government of India in 2006 but is still widely used across the country.
- The drug is responsible for the decline (99 per cent) in vulture populations across Asia.
- A study led by the Indian Veterinary Research Institute (IVRI) found that diclofenac is converted to nicotine when injected into water buffaloes, similar to results seen in domestic cattle.

Other important points:

- India is also a signatory to the Convention on Migratory Species Multi-species Action Plan for the Conservation of African-Eurasian Vultures, which recognises non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDS) as a major threat to vultures in India.
- The Indian Veterinary Research Institute (IVRI) Izatnagar, Uttar Pradesh (established in 1889) is one of the premier research institutes dedicated to livestock research and development.

9 species of vultures in India:

- Oriental White Backed, Long Billed, Slender-Billed, Eurasian Griffon, Red Headed or Asian King Vulture, Himalayan, Egyptian, Bearded and Cinereous.
- According to the vulture census conducted by Bird Life International, the vulture population in the country declined from 40,000 in 2003 to 18,645 in 2015.
- Vulture Action Plan- 2020-2025: Approval for the conservation of vultures by the National Board for Wildlife (NBWL), under which the drugs used in the treatment of cattle which are becoming poisonous for vultures will be banned by the Drug Controller General of India.
- The action plan also provides for the establishment of vulture conservation and breeding centers in Uttar Pradesh, Tripura, Maharashtra, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu.
- The Vulture Action Plan 2020-2025 also mentions Aceclofenac as 'toxic', asking the Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) to ban its veterinary use along with other drugs like Nimesulide and Ketoprofen.
- **International Vulture Awareness Day: International Vulture Awareness Day** is observed every year on the first Saturday of September. The first International Vulture Awareness Day was observed in September, 2009.

Give Up Campaign under NFSA



■ Recently, the Rajasthan Food and Civil Supplies

Department announced the extension of the Give Up

Campaign till October 31, 2025.



- The 'Give-Up Campaign' in Rajasthan encourages beneficiaries under the National Food Security Scheme (NFSA) to voluntarily opt out of the scheme and give an eligible person a chance in their place, so that there can be a better distribution of resources.
- This campaign started on November 1, 2024.
- So far, about 31 lakh ineligible people have voluntarily given up food security in the Give Up Campaign. Due to the vacancies created by this and not getting e-KYC done, about 60 lakh new eligible beneficiaries have been connected with food security.
- These new beneficiaries are getting the benefit of 5 kg free wheat per month along with 12 domestic gas cylinders per family per year at Rs 450 under the Chief Minister's Cooking Gas Subsidy Scheme, free registration of the family and free treatment up to Rs 25 lakh under the Chief Minister's Ayushman Arogya Yojana and free accident insurance cover of up to Rs 10 lakh for the family under the Chief Minister's Ayushman Accident Insurance Scheme.

Facts for Prelims:

National Food Security Act (NFSA) 2013:

In terms of food grains, it was started by the Government of India in the year 2013 as the world's largest public welfare scheme to ensure food security of 75 percent of the rural population and 50 percent of the urban population of the country through the National Food Security Act.

Under NFSA, food grains are made available through the following means:

- Antyodaya Anna Yojana: It covers the poorest population. Under this, 35 kg of food grains are made available per family per month.
- Priority Families (PHH): Families included under the PHH category are provided 5 kg foodgrains per person per month.



Incentive Scheme for Promotion of Critical Mineral Recycling



■ Recently, the Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister approved an incentive scheme of Rs. 1500 crore for developing recycling capacity in the country for separation and production of critical minerals from secondary sources.

Key Points:

- The scheme is a part of the National Critical Minerals Mission (NCMM).
- Objective: To promote domestic capacity and supply chain resilience of critical minerals.
- Scheme Duration: Financial Year 2025-26 to 2030-31 (6 years).
- Target Sector: E-waste, lithium-ion battery (LIB) scrap, other scrap.

 Provisions of the Scheme:
- Eligible feedstock includes e-waste, lithium-ion battery (LIB) scrap, and scrap other than e-waste and LIB scrap.
- The scheme will apply to investments in new units as well as capacity expansion and modernisation and diversification of existing units.
- **■** The scheme will provide incentives for the recycling value chain.
- Maximum limit of incentives:
 - o Large units: Maximum ₹50 crore (including ₹10 crore OPEX cap).
 - o Small units: Maximum ₹25 crore (including ₹5 crore OPEX cap).

Subsidy structure:

- 1. Capex Subsidy: Will include 20 per cent capex subsidy on plant and machinery, equipment and associated utilities for starting production within the specified time frame.
- The subsidy rate will reduce if production starts after the specified time frame.
- 2. Opex Subsidy: Based on sales over the base year (FY 2025–26).
- Year 2: 40% subsidy on eligible operating expenses.
- Year 5: Remaining 60% subsidy on achieving the set sales target.
- Note: OPEX incentive period: FY 2026–27 to FY 2030–31.
- Significance: An investment of about Rs 8 thousand crore will come and about 70 thousand direct and indirect jobs will be created.

Other important points:

National Critical Mineral Mission (NCMM)

- Start: January, 2025
- **Duration:** 2024-25 to 2030-31 (7 years).
- Operation: Being led by the Geological Survey of India (GSI) and operated in coordination with the Ministry of Mines.



■ India's first Vulture Knowledge Portal was launched in Assam on the occasion of International Vulture Awareness Day on September 2, 2025.



- Development of Portal: Developed under the leadership of V Foundation India in collaboration with the Department of Zoology, Guwahati University, Assam Bird Monitoring Network, LASA Foundation, Suraksha Samiti and other conservation activists.
- Objective: Launched for the conservation of slender-billed vultures in Guwahati, Assam, focusing on carcass poisoning and diclofenac.
- Features: Will provide scientific data on 9 species of vultures existing in India and their conservation status.
- Language of the portal: Assamese





Other important points:

- Species of vultures in India: 9; Slender-billed Vulture, White-tailed Vulture, Red-headed Vulture, Himalayan Griffon Vulture, Egyptian Vulture, Cinereous Vulture, Indian Vulture, Bearded Vulture, Eurasian Griffon Vulture.

Thailand's new Prime Minister: Anutin Charnvirakul

Why in News?

Parliament of Thailand elected Bhumjaithai Party leader and former Health Minister Anutin Charnvirakul as the new Prime Minister of Thailand.



- Anutin was Thailand's Health Minister during Covid and was called the 'Cannabis King' due to his support for decriminalizing marijuana in the year 2022.

- UNESCO World Heritage: In 2008, Cambodia declared Prasat Ta Muen/Preah Vihar Temple as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, due to which Thailand opposed it.
- Construction: In the 12th century by Udayadityavarman II, the ruler of the Khmer Empire.

Features:

- **■** This temple is dedicated to Lord Shiva.
- This rectangular temple is mainly made of laterite (a type of durable red clay) and sandstone.
- It has a square main prasat, which is made of sandstone and laterite. To its right is the library surrounded by laterite walls.

- Honours: He was awarded knighthood in 1931 and Bharat Ratna posthumously in 1984.
