Dugong Conservation Reserve



The International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) has passed a resolution to recognize India's first Dugong Conservation Reserve at the **IUCN World Conservation Congress 2025. This reserve is located in Palk Bay** (Tamil Nadu).



Key Points:

Dugong Conservation Reserve:

- It was established in 2022 by the Tamil Nadu government under the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972.
- It covers an area of 448.34 square kilometers in the northern part of Palk Bay.
- Seagrass ecosystems cover more than 12,250 hectares.
- Seagrass also supports many other marine species and plays an important role in carbon sequestration.

Dugong (Sea Cow):

- It is the only marine herbivorous mammal that is completely dependent on seagrass.
- In India, in addition to the Palk Bay (where it is most abundant), it is found in the Gulf of Mannar, Gulf of Kutch, etc.
- **IUCN Red List Status: Vulnerable.**
- Listed in Schedule I of the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972.







Atal Innovation Mission (AIM)

Why in News?

The Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), NITI Aayog, and the Central Government have launched the ATL Sarathi and Frontier Regions Program in collaboration with the University of Kashmir.

Key Points:

■ Under the Frontier Regions Program, 500 new Atal Tinkering Labs (ATLs) will be established in Jammu and Kashmir.

Atal Innovation Mission (AIM):

- Launched by NITI Aayog in 2016.
- Objective: To promote a culture of innovation and entrepreneurship.
 About Atal Tinkering Labs (ATLs):
- These are state-of-the-art labs set up in schools under the Atal Innovation Mission.
- Objective: To promote innovation among children in grades 6 to 12 across the country through 21st-century tools and technologies such as the Internet of Things, 3D printing, etc.

WTO Agreement on Fisheries Subsidies

Why in News?

This agreement was adopted at the 12th WTO Ministerial Conference (2022). The agreement entered into force after two-thirds of WTO member countries formally accepted it.

Key Points:

WTO Agreement on Fisheries Subsidies:

- It puts into effect binding rules to curb harmful subsidies.
- It is the WTO's first multilateral agreement with environmental sustainability at its core.
- It will help in achieving Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 14.
- Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 14: To Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas, and marine resources.
- India did not join the agreement to ensure subsidy protection, livelihood security, and food security for small-scale fishermen.
- WTO Fisheries Fund: It was established to assist developing and least developed member countries in implementing the agreement. This fund is supported by voluntary contributions from WTO members.
- The agreement provides special and differential treatment to developing countries.

Environmental Accounting on Forests, 2025 Report

- Why in News?
- This report is released by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI). This is the 8th consecutive edition of the report on environmental accounting.
- **Key Points:**
- This is the first dedicated report on forest accounting. It is based on the United Nations System of Environmental Economic Accounting (SEEA) Framework. Key Points of the Report:

Physical Asset Account:

- Forest cover (2010-11 to 2021-22): It has increased by 17,444.61 sq km (22.50%). The total forest area has now reached 7.15 lakh sq km, which is 21.76% of India's geographical area.
- States with the highest increase: Kerala, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu.
- States with the highest increase in Recorded Forest Area (RFA): Uttarakhand (6.3%), Odisha (1.97%), and Jharkhand (1.9%).

United Nations System of Environmental-Economic Accounting (SEEA):

- It was developed in 2012 by the United Nations, the European Commission, and the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO).
- What is SEEA: SEEA is an international statistical standard that integrates economic and environmental data. Its aim is to understand the contribution of the environment to the economy and the impact of the economy on the environment.
- The SEEA framework was first adopted by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) in 2018.

Children in India, 2025 Report

Why in News?

■ Recently, the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) released the fourth issue of the Children in India, 2025 Report.

Key Points:

This report provides details on children's education, health, nutrition, protection, etc., to guide evidence-based policies to improve children's rights and well-being.

Key points of the report:

- Infant Mortality Rate (IMR): Reduced from 44 in 2011 to 25 in 2023.
- Infant Mortality Rate (IMR): in the number of deaths of children under one year of age per 1,000 live births.
- Under-5 Mortality Rate (U5MR): Reduced from 30 in 2022 to 29 in 2023.
- Under-5 mortality rate (U5MR) reflects the probability of death before the age of 5 per 1,000 children born in a particular year or period.
- Birth rate: Decreased to 18.4 per 1,000 population in 2023. It is 20.3 in rural areas and 14.9 in urban areas.

Dropout rate (2022-23 to 2024-25):

- **■ Preparatory stage:** Decreased from 8.7% to 2.3%.
- Middle level: Decreased from 8.1% to 3.5%.
- Secondary level: Decreased from 13.8% to 8.2%.
- Child marriage rate decreased from 26.8% in 2015-16 to 23.3% in 2019-21.
- The total number of children adopted increased from 3,927 (2017-18) to 4,515 (2024-25).
- Gender parity at all levels of education has been achieved in 2024-25.

1.	Drone Wall: European Union Following the sighting of suspected Russian drones in Denmark, the European Union has taken steps towards building a 'Drone Wall'. Drone Wall: It is an AI-based multi-layered drone-defence system called
	 AirShield. It is an anti-drone platform. ■ It is designed to combat high-speed, weaponized unmanned aerial vehicles. ■ It provides early warning, real-time threat detection, and intelligence against drone intrusions, GPS jamming, and other unconventional attacks.
2.	Agni-Prime Missile ■ DRDO and the Strategic Forces Command (SFC) successfully test-fired the medium-range Agni-Prime missile from a mobile launcher system installed on a moving train. ■ This is the first futuristic missile system of its kind to be launched from a moving train and can operate on the rail network. Agni-Prime Missile: ■ It is a state-of-the-art, two-stage, solid-fuel, canister-launched ballistic missile developed by DRDO. It is the newest missile in the Agni series. ■ Range: Up to 2000 kilometers. It can carry both conventional and nuclear warheads.

Article 304: Supreme Court

- Citing Article 304(a) of the Constitution, the Supreme Court has held that the tax system cannot be used to discriminate against goods originating from other states.
- States can determine taxes in such a way that the tax burden is equal on goods coming from outside and goods manufactured within the state.

Article 304(a):

- A state or union territory can impose taxes on goods coming from other states or union territories.
- However, it should not discriminate between imported goods and similar goods manufactured locally.
