Water supply projects based on the Hybrid Annuity Model (HAM)

■ Why in News?

■ Recently, the Public Health Engineering Department announced the launch of the Hybrid Annuity Model (HAM)-based water supply projects in Rajasthan for the first time.



Key Points:

■ This model will be implemented to complete five drinking water projects in the state under the Jal Jeevan Mission. HAM is a type of public-private partnership (PPP) project.





m Date : 24 October, 2025

- These projects will provide 420,000 household tap connections in 5,000 villages across Rajasthan under the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), benefiting approximately 2 million people in these project areas.
- **Estimated outlay: ₹18,879 crore.**
- Under HAM, the Public Health Engineering Department will invest 40 percent of the total capital cost, and the remaining 60 percent will be borne by the contractor. The contractor will receive their investment back in the form of annuity payments in 20 installments over a period of 10 years.
- This model will reduce the state government's initial financial requirements for water supply projects. The operation and maintenance of water supply projects will be provided by the project implementing contractor for 10 years.

■ Why in News?

■ Recently, the 'We Rise – Women Entrepreneurs Reimagining Inclusive and Sustainable Enterprises' initiative was launched by NITI Aayog and DP World.

Key Points:

- Launched by: It was launched under the aegis of the Award to Reward (ATR) initiative of the Women Entrepreneurship Platform (WEP).
- **Objective:** To help women entrepreneurs in India grow their businesses globally through business facilitation, mentoring, and strategic partnerships.
- Under this program, women-led micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) with high-growth potential across the country will be identified and prepared for global trade.
- Selected entrepreneurs will also be provided with the opportunity to showcase their products at Dubai's Bharat Mart (an international B2B and B2C marketplace located in the Jebel Ali Free Zone).

Women Entrepreneurship Platform:

- Development: Developed in 2018 as an aggregator platform at NITI Aayog, converted to a public-private partnership in 2022.
- Objective: It serves as a national aggregator to strengthen India's women entrepreneurship ecosystem and make women-led growth a reality.
- **Function:** WEP acts as an enabler, addressing six key ecosystem needs access to finance, market linkages, training and skills, mentorship and networking, compliance and legal support, and business development services.

Bathousim

- **₩** Why in News?
- The Bathou religion of the Bodo community in Assam will receive a separate code in the upcoming census.
- **Key Points:**

Bathou Religion:

- It is the traditional belief of the Bodos, the largest plains tribe in Assam.
- The word 'Bathou' is derived from the Bodo language, where 'ba' means 'five' and 'thou' means 'deep philosophical thought'.
- The belief system is based on five elements: Bar (Air), Dwi (water), Ha (Earth), Or (Fire), and Okhrang (Sky).

Bathousim Beliefs

- This community worships Brawrai Bathou as the supreme deity. In the Bodo language, the word 'Brawrai' refers to an 'elder' person in the context of power or knowledge.
- The Bathou religion is centered on the Sijou plant (Euphorbia splendens), which is planted in the Bathou altar at the center as a symbol of the Bathou religion of the Bodo people.
- This plant is a living symbol of Bathoubray, the supreme deity of the Bodo people.
- The Bodos, plant the Sijou tree on a high altar surrounded by a bamboo fence consisting of eighteen pairs of poles woven from five pieces of bamboo.

■ The five bamboo strips symbolize the five bonds of Bathou, namely (i) birth (ii) marriage or procreation, (iii) sorrow (iv) enthusiasm, and (v) death.

India and Food and Agriculture Organization Partnership: 80 Years Completed

♥ Why in News?

■ Recently, India and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) completed 80 years of their partnership on World Food Day, 2025.

Key Points:

Food and Agriculture Organization:

■ It is a specialized agency of the United Nations (UN) that leads international efforts to end hunger.





- Established: On October 1945 (the oldest permanent specialized agency of the UN).
- **Headquarters:** Rome, Italy.
- Members: 195 member states (194 countries and the European Union); India is a founding member of FAO.

Functions:

- FAO coordinates the efforts of governments and technical agencies in programs for agriculture, forestry, fisheries, and land and water resources development.
- It leads international efforts to combat hunger.
- It is a forum for negotiating agreements between developing and developed countries and a source of technical knowledge and information to support development.

Reports published by FAO:

- 1. State of the World's Forests (SOFO)
- 2. State of World Fisheries and Aquaculture (SOFIA)
- 3. State of Agricultural Commodity Markets (SOCO)
- 4. State of Food Security and Nutrition in the World (SOFI).

FAO and India's Relationship:

- Beginning: Since the establishment of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations in 1945.
- Partnership: FAO began its operations in India in 1948. It has an office in New Delhi. FAO's nodal ministry in India is the Ministry of Agriculture.
- The main objective of the Government of India is to double farmers' incomes by increasing efficiency and ensuring equity in a sustainable manner.

- Durbanization: Growing urban population and busy lifestyles are driving the demand for ready-to-eat, packaged and convenience foods, which is expected to cross ₹ 12 lakh crore by 2025.
- Impact: This situation opens up immense possibilities for product diversification and new brands.
- Health, wellness, and organic foods: Sustainability is driving demand for organic and plant-based products. The organic market is estimated to reach ₹75,000 crore by 2025, and consumers are willing to pay more.

Technology and Financial constraints for SMEs: Small and medium enterprises struggle with the high cost of modern machinery and limited access to credit.

Regulatory Complexity: India's food processing sector is grappling with multiple and overlapping regulations enforced by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI), the Agricultural and Processed Food **Products Export Development** Authority (APEDA), the Bureau of **Indian Standards (BIS), and state-level** agencies. This increases compliance and costs creates uncertainty, especially for small and medium enterprises (SMEs).

- **Technology and Innovation:** The adoption of automation, AI. robotics, and **smart** packaging is transforming efficiency and quality.
- **Impact:** This shift the **Indian food tech market opens** new opportunities global competition.
- Micro, Small, and Medium **Enterprises** (MSMEs) **Rural Employment: India has** million MSMEs. 63 contributing approximately 30 percent to GDP.
- **Impact:** It helps farmers move value chain and supports rural livelihoods.


- Lack of skilled workforce and research and development (R&D): The sector faces a skills gap, with millions of trained workers in food technology in demand. Low investment in research and development limits innovation and development of value-added products.
- Low share in global processed exports: Processed products comprise only 16 percent of India's agricultural exports, compared to 25 percent in the US and 49 percent in China. This clearly indicates that India's export potential has not yet been fully realized.
- Frequent quality-related rejections damage India's export credibility. The **European Union found contamination** in 527 products in 2024. Furthermore, the lack of harmonization between Indian and global standards further limits competitiveness in international markets.

- Recently, Tuvalu officially became the 90th member state of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN).



Key Points:

Tuvalu Islands:

Location: Tuvalu, formerly known as the Ellice Islands, is a Polynesian island nation located in the South Pacific Ocean, between Hawaii and Australia. It consists of nine islands, four of which are reef islands and five coral atolls.

- Independence: Tuvalu became independent from the United Kingdom in October 1978.
- Geographic Condition: There are no rivers. Tuvalu's climate is hot and rainy.
- **Characteristics:**
 - With a land area of 26 square kilometers, it is the fourth-smallest country in the world.
 - Except for the tiny Vatican City, Tuvalu has the fewest inhabitants of any independent nation.
- **Capital:** Funafuti
- Languages: Most people speak Tuvaluan. English is widely used.
- **Currency:** Tuvalu dollar (equivalent to the Australian dollar)

The indigenous antibiotic naphthromycin

- Why in News?
- Recently, India has developed its first indigenous antibiotic, naphthromycin, according to the Ministry of Science and Technology.
- **Key Points:**
- **Development:** It is an antibiotic developed in collaboration with the Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC).
- Trade Name: "Miknaf"
- **Treatment:** This innovation is designed to treat community-acquired bacterial pneumonia (CABP).
- It is effective against resistant respiratory infections, particularly useful for cancer patients and poorly controlled diabetes patients.
- **Effectiveness:** It targets both typical and atypical pathogens, offering a potent solution.

Features:

- It is the first molecule completely conceived, developed, and clinically validated in India.
- It is the country's first indigenously developed antibiotic aimed at combating antimicrobial resistance (AMR).

Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR):

This occurs when bacteria, viruses, fungi, and parasites no longer respond to antimicrobial drugs.





- As a result of drug resistance, antibiotics and other antimicrobial drugs become ineffective, making infections difficult or impossible to treat.
- AMR is a natural process driven by genetic changes in pathogens over time, its spread is significantly accelerated by human activities.

Pneumonia:

- This serious disease is caused by drug-resistant bacteria.
- The lungs are most commonly affected.
- It disproportionately affects children, the elderly, and individuals with weakened immune systems, such as those with diabetes or cancer.



Chandrayaan-2: Observed the effects of a solar flare on the Moon for the first time.

■ Why in News?

■ The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) announced that the CHACE-2 payload on the Chandrayaan-2 lunar orbiter has directly observed the impact of a solar coronal mass ejection (CME) on the Moon for the first time.



Key Points:

- The study, titled "Impact of a Coronal Mass Ejection on the Lunar Exosphere as Observed by CHACE-2 on the Chandrayaan-2 Orbiter," was published in Geophysical Research Letters on August 16th this year.
- This observation will help in understanding the lunar exosphere and thin atmosphere, and the effects of space weather on its surface.

Event:

- On May 10, 2024, the first evidence of a CME-induced increase in lunar exospheric pressure was recorded when solar radiation hit the Moon.
- A tenfold increase in the total number density of neutral atoms was observed, confirming long-predicted theoretical models.

Chandrayaan-2:

- Launched on: Chandrayaan-2 was launched on July 22, 2019, from Sriharikota using a GSLV-MK3-M1 rocket. It carried eight scientific instruments and successfully entered lunar orbit on August 20, 2019.
- Although contact with the Vikram lander was lost during the landing attempt on September 7, 2019, the orbiter is fully operational and continues to function in orbit around the Moon.
- ISRO reported that one of the payloads on Chandrayaan-2, the Chandra's Atmospheric Compositional Explorer 2 (CHACE-2), recorded the effects of solar coronal mass on the Moon's exosphere.

Chandra's Atmospheric Composition Explorer-2 (CHACE-2) Payload:

- CHACE-2 is a neutral gas mass spectrometer payload on the Chandrayaan-2 orbiter, developed by ISRO to study the structure and dynamics of the Moon's extremely thin atmosphere, known as the lunar exosphere.
- Objective: Its primary goal is to analyze the chemical composition, spatial and temporal variations, and density of the lunar exosphere in the mass range of 1-300 amu, as well as to detect water vapor and heavy molecules to understand lunar surface-exosphere interactions.

Key Features:

- 1. Successor to the CHACE (Chandrayaan-1) and MENCA (Mars Orbiter Mission) instruments.
- 2. Equipped to measure neutral gases and isotopic abundances on the Moon.
- 3. Provides real-time data on exosphere composition and variations.
- 4. Designed to detect noble gases such as argon-40 and study their spatial distribution.

Tanvi Sharma: Badminton

♥ Why in News?

■ Indian badminton player Tanvi Sharma won the silver medal in the women's singles event at the BWF World Junior Championships.

Key Points:

- Tanvi Sharma got defeated by secondseeded Anyapat Phichitpreechasak of Thailand in the women's singles final.
- Tanvi became the fifth Indian and third female shuttler to win a silver medal at the Junior World Championships.
- Note: Besides Tanvi, Saina Nehwal won the silver medal in 2006, Aparna Popat in 1996, Cyril Verma in 2015, and Shankar Muthusamy in 2022.
- Saina Nehwal is the only Indian to win a gold medal at this championship.

 Nehwal won the title in 2008.

Tanvi Sharma's Achievements:

- In 2021, Tanvi won her first national medal a bronze medal in the Under-15 singles category at the National Ranking Championships in Goa.
- In 2024, she won gold medals in both the Under-15 and Under-17 singles categories at the National Championships in Odisha.
