Rajasthan's First Turtle Conservation Center: Dholpur



Rajasthan's First Turtle Conservation Center will be established on the banks of the Chambal River in Dholpur district.



### **Key Points:**

- Recently, the World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF) submitted a proposal in this regard to the Rajasthan Chief Wildlife Warden's Office.
- Previously, as part of a joint conservation effort between the Rajasthan Forest Department and TSA Foundation India, eggs of the endangered Batagur Tortoise species were successfully hatched and released into the Chambal River in the Dholpur National Chambal Gharial Sanctuary.

Currently, the Chambal River is home to species such as Batagur Tortoise, Batagur Dongoka, Turtle Tentoria, Hardella Theurgi, Chitra Indica, Nilssonia, Lesimus Puncta, Lesimus Andersoni, and others. Of these, the Batagur tortoise, Tentoria, and Nilssonia species are facing extinction.

### Rajasthan State Legal Services Authority (RALSA)



The Rajasthan State Legal Services
Authority conducted a 90-day
"Mediation for the Nation" campaign
from July 1 to September 30, 2025, to
resolve pending cases in the courts.



#### **Key Points:**

■ Directed by: National Legal Services
Authority (NALSA) and Mediation and
Conciliation Project Committee
(MCPC).



- Under this campaign, cases pending for years in the High Court and district and taluka courts were resolved through mediation.
- Under this campaign, 1,52,436 cases of various nature were referred to mediation centers from the High Court, district courts, and taluka courts in the state. Of these, 20,724 pending cases were resolved through mediation by mutual consent of the parties.
- Article 39A of the Indian Constitution: Provides for free legal aid to the poor and weaker sections of society to promote justice on the basis of equal opportunity.

#### **Facts for Prelims:**

■ The Rajasthan State Legal Services Authority (RALSA) was constituted by the Rajasthan State Government through a notification issued on July 7, 1998.

- The Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 was passed by Parliament, which came into effect on November 9, 1995.
- With the enactment of this Act, Legal Services Authorities were established at the national, state, and district levels, and Legal Services Committees were also formed at the Supreme Court, High Court, and Taluka levels.
- Executive Chairman of the Rajasthan State Legal Services Authority: Justice Sanjeev Prakash Sharma.
- Executive Chairman of the National Legal Services Authority: Justice Suryakant.

Rajasthan Groundwater (Conservation and Management)
Authority Act, 2024

- Why in News?
- Recently, the Governor approved the 'Rajasthan Groundwater (Conservation and Management) Authority Bill, 2024'.





### **Key Points:**

- On September 10, 2025, the 'Rajasthan Groundwater (Conservation and Management) Authority Bill, 2024' was passed by voice vote in the Assembly.
- According to the bill, the authority will be able to take action for acts such as construction of new groundwater extraction structures without permission, violation of authorization conditions, degrading groundwater quality, drilling for extraction without permission, and damaging water infrastructure.
- However, a license or No Objection Certificate (NOC) will not be required for digging tubewells and extracting water for public purposes, i.e., agricultural and domestic water.





- According to the Bill, the Authority will be able to impose penalties (fines) on any body or individual found guilty of violating the unauthorized activities.
- First offence: A fine of up to ₹50,000.
- Subsequent convictions will result in imprisonment of up to 6 months, or a fine of up to ₹1,00,000, or both.
- Note: Groundwater accounts for 85 percent of rural and 50 percent of urban water supply in India. It also supplies 62 percent of water used for irrigation. **Composition of the Authority:**
- The Rajasthan Groundwater (Conservation and Management) Authority will be established under the Act.
- Chaired by: A person who has held the position of Secretary to the State **Government or Chief Groundwater Engineer.**
- Members: (i) two members of the Legislative Assembly, (ii) representatives from departments such as groundwater, finance, agriculture, pollution control, forests, public health, and industry, and (iii) two subject experts.
- Each district will also have a District Groundwater and Management Committee, which will prepare district groundwater conservation and management plans.
- The Groundwater Authority will review the State Groundwater Conservation and Management Plan prepared by the State Groundwater Department. It will also recommend to the State Government the classification of the state into zones based on the quality and quantity of water levels.



### 4. The country's first modified BTPN rake is ready

- The Kota Wagon Repair Workshop of West Central Railway has prepared the country's first modified Bogie Tank Petrol and Naphtha (BTPN) rake.
- This rake will improve safety standards and effectively control leakage and theft. BTPN rakes are used to transport petroleum products such as diesel, petrol, kerosene, etc.

### 5. Army Gifts T-55 Tank to Shekhawati University

- Recently, the Indian Army gifted a T-55 tank and two cannons to Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Shekhawati University in Sikar.
- The T-55 tank is a Soviet-built main battle tank, inducted into the Indian Army in the 1960s.
- The T-55 tank played a significant role in the Indo-Pak wars of 1965 and 1971.

#### 6. Dr. Ruma Devi

Roadmap on Artificial Intelligence: NITI Aayog

- Why in News?
- NITI Aayog released a historic roadmap on Artificial Intelligence (AI) for inclusive social development.





■ Objective: To transform the livelihoods of 490 million unorganized sector workers in India by harnessing the potential of artificial intelligence and advanced technologies.

**Current Status of Unorganized Sector Workers in India:** 

- Highest Employment: Nearly 90% of the country's workforce is employed in the unorganized sector.
- Low Productivity: Their average productivity is around \$5 per hour, which is almost half the national average.





- Lack of Social Security Coverage: Only 48% of unorganized sector workers are receiving benefits from social security schemes.
  - **Key Challenges Facing Unorganized Sector Workers:**
- Unstable Financial Resources: Lack of regular remuneration, delays in wage payments, lack of contracts, and non-availability of many benefits on time.
- Market and demand access: Fragmented labor markets, lack of proof of employment, and low visibility on digital platforms.
- Lack of skills and technology adoption: These include outdated practices, lack of formal training, and a lack of worker data.
- Social security and occupational safety: These include challenges such as lack of workplace safety standards, lack of health insurance and pension benefits, and lack of compensation in case of accidents.
- Lack of productivity: Due to manual work, lack of mechanization, and lack of digital tools.

#### **NITI Aayog recommendations:**

- Mission Digital Shram Setu: A national mission should be launched to empower informal sector workers through AI.
- Inclusive AI framework: Multilingual, voice-first AI tools need to be developed to overcome literacy and language barriers.
- Multi-stakeholder engagement: Implementation of schemes at the local level should be done through state and community networks.
- Integration of existing digital schemes: AI should be integrated with platforms like e-Shram and Udyam to make the schemes effective.

### **Plutonium Management and Disposal Agreement**

#### Why in News?

The Russian Parliament has approved a proposal to withdraw from the Plutonium Management and Disposal Agreement (PMDA) with the United States.

### **Key Points:**

Russia suspended implementation of the agreement in 2016, citing US sanctions.

**Plutonium Management and Disposal Agreement** 

- This agreement was signed in 2000.
- It obliges both the US and Russia to dispose of at least 34 metric tons of weapons-grade plutonium each in a manner that cannot be reused.
- Plutonium: It is a radioactive material with atomic number 94. It has a high melting point. It is the heaviest naturally occurring element.

### **Indian Peacekeepers Honored**

### Why in News?

Indian peacekeepers in Abyei were honored for their dedicated service by the Acting Mission Chief of the United Nations Interim Security Force for Abyei (UNISFA), a disputed, oil-rich border region between Sudan and South Sudan.



### **Key Points:**

■ India has so far deployed 2.9 lakh troops in more than 50 missions. Currently, 5,000 Indian troops are serving in nine UN missions.

**India's Contribution to UN Peacekeeping:** 

■ Troop Contribution: India has a rich legacy of contributing to United Nations peacekeeping operations. Since the 1950s, India has deployed more than 290,000 peacekeepers in more than 50 missions worldwide, making it the largest contributor to UN peacekeeping efforts.

#### Casualties:

■ 180 Indian peacekeepers have made the supreme sacrifice while serving in UN peacekeeping missions.

#### **Training and Infrastructure:**

- The Indian Army has established the Centre for United Nations Peacekeeping (CUNPK) in New Delhi.
- This centre provides specialized training to over 12,000 soldiers annually in peacekeeping operations, as well as hosts national and international courses for prospective peacekeepers and trainers.

#### Women in Peacekeeping:

- India has deployed a female contingent to the United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and the United Nations Interim Security Force for Abyei, the second largest contingent of female soldiers after Liberia.
- India has also deployed female military police in the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force and female officers and military observers in various missions.

#### Other important points:

- The Abyei region is a border region between South Sudan and Sudan that was granted "special administrative status" by the 2004 Protocol on the Abyei Conflict Resolution (Abyei Protocol) in the Comprehensive Peace Agreement (CPA) that ended the Second Sudanese Civil War.
- The Indian Army will host the Conference of Heads of United Nations Troop Contributing Countries (UNTCC) in New Delhi from October 14 to 16, 2025. Senior military chiefs from over 30 major contributing countries to UN peacekeeping operations will participate in it.
- A preview event was held at the Manekshaw Centre, New Delhi on October 1, 2025.

### **UNESCO Director-General: Dr. Khaled El-Enany**

### Why in News?

■ Dr. Khaled El-Enany, Egypt's former Minister of Tourism and Antiquities, will become the first Arab Director-General of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).

#### **Kev Points:**

- Khaled will replace Audrey Azoulay of France after the final vote in November 2025.
- Khaled El-Enany will be UNESCO's first Arab and first Egyptian Director-General.
- He initiated several mega-tourism projects, such as the National Museum of Egyptian Civilization in Cairo and the restoration of the Jewish Temple.

#### **Other Key Points:**

United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO):

**UNESCO** is a member of the United Nations Sustainable Development Group (UNSDG).

#### History

- In 1942, during World War II, European countries facing the Axis powers convened the Conference of Allied Ministers of Education (CAME) in the United Kingdom.
- Based on the CAME proposal, a United Nations conference was held in London in November 1945 to establish an educational and cultural organization, and UNESCO was established on November 16, 1945.
- The first session of UNESCO's General Conference was held in Paris during November-December 1946.
- The first World Heritage Site included in UNESCO was the Galapagos Islands in Ecuador.
- India became a UNESCO member country in 1946.

**Electronic Bank Guarantees (e-BGs):** 

- It replaces the traditional process of issuing bank guarantees in the form of physical documents.
- It reduces the time between issuing bank guarantees and delivering them to beneficiaries.
- A bank guarantee is essentially a financial instrument. In this, a bank promises to a third party (beneficiary) that if their customer (applicant) fails to fulfill a contractual obligation, the bank will pay the beneficiary.











### **Global Electricity Mid-Year Insights 2025**

Why in News?

■ Renewable energy surpassed coal to become the world's largest electricity source in the first half of 2025, according to a report by energy think tank Ember.

#### **Key Points:**

- Fossil fuel production in major economies: Fossil fuel electricity production has declined in major economies like China and India. This is because the growth of clean energy sources there has exceeded the growth in electricity demand.
- **Emissions:** Emissions have declined despite a 2.6% increase in global electricity demand.
- CO2 emissions have declined by approximately 46 million tons in China and approximately 24 million tons in India. However, emissions have increased in the European Union (EU) and the United States (US).
- Growth in clean energy sources: Record growth has been recorded in solar energy (+25%) and wind energy (+29%), increasing the share of clean energy in total electricity sources.

### **Nobel Prize in Chemistry 2025**

Why in News?

■ The Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences announced the winners of the 2025 Nobel Prize in Chemistry.



### **Key Points:**

- The 2025 Nobel Prize in Chemistry has been awarded to Susumu Kitagawa, Richard Robson, and Omar Yaghi for their role in the development of the first metal-organic frameworks (MOFs).
- The research of these scientists has made possible the development of thousands of different metal-organic frameworks.

**Metal-organic frameworks (MOFs)** 

■ They are a form of molecular structure that encloses large spaces within small structures. These tiny structures can store large quantities of gases within a small space.





- A single gram of MOF material can contain so many pores that its internal surface area can be equal to that of a football field.
- These pores act as tiny molecular chambers that can trap, separate, transform, or transport gases, ions, and other molecules.
- In this way, metal organic frameworks are like molecular hotels, with countless doors programmed to admit or allow only certain substances.
- Metal organic framework structures are composed of metal ions linked by organic molecules, forming a three-dimensional network or mesh with large, pore spaces.
- The most distinctive feature of MOFs is their porosity. This allows them to trap and retain gas or liquid.
- By changing the building blocks used in MOFs, chemists can control the size and shape of their pores. This allows them to design them to capture and store specific substances.

**Uses of Metal Organic Frameworks (MOFs):** 

- Water harvesting: In desert-like environments, MOFs can capture water vapor from the atmosphere in their pores at night and then be used in drinking water.
- Pollutant removal: MOFs can filter harmful substances such as perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), and help degrade crude oil and antibiotics in polluted water.
- Industrial uses: They can also be used for extracting rare earth elements from wastewater, storing hydrogen, and capturing carbon dioxide.
- Healthcare: They can prove to be important in delivering medicines to the right places in the body, controlling highly toxic gases from the environment, and breaking down antibiotic residues by encapsulating enzymes.



- His 2003 novel, "Özszkröl hegy, dalol to, nyugatrol utak, kelétrol," is based on the search for a secret garden. Folyo' ('A mountain in the north, a lake in the south, paths in the west, a river in the east') is a mysterious story with powerful poetic passages that takes place southeast of Kyoto.
