

Exercise 'Ajeya Warrior-25'



The eighth edition of the India-UK joint military exercise "Ajeya Warrior-25" has commenced from November 17, 2025, at the Foreign Training Node, Mahajan Field Firing Range, Rajasthan.



- Duration: From November 17 to 30, 2025, at the Foreign Training Node, Mahajan Field Firing Range, Rajasthan.
- **Indian Army Representation:** Soldiers of the Sikh Regiment.
- Focus: Conducted under the United Nations mandate, this exercise focuses on counter-terrorism operations in semi-urban areas.



Date: 20 November, 2025

- This exercise is conducted under the mandate of the United Nations, specifically in accordance with Chapter VII of the United Nations Charter, which deals with peacekeeping duties related to threats to the peace, breaches of the peace, and counter-terrorism scenarios.
- The aim of this exercise is to exchange best practices, enhance tactical proficiency and develop coordinated response for managing complex operations in challenging conditions.
- Training includes simulation-based scenarios, brigade-level mission planning and field exercises involving real-life counter-terrorism situations.
- Held bi-annually since 2011, Ajeya Warrior has evolved into a major engagement between the Indian Army and the British Army.

Cabinet Meeting

Why in News?

The cabinet meeting held at the CMO under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma took major decisions related to the state's youth, expatriate Rajasthanis, industry, and the energy sector.

- Approved the formation of the National and International Overseas Rajasthani Affairs Department and the Rajasthan Global Capability Center **Policy 2025.**
- Approved the formation of a joint venture company between RPUNL and Singareni Collieries.
- 200 Global Capability Centers will open by 2030. **Key Decisions:**
- 1. 30% subsidy on project cost, up to a maximum of ₹10 crore.
- 50% concession on land/lease cost (maximum ₹1 crore). 2.
- 3. 30% payroll subsidy on employee salaries for the first three years.
- Rental assistance for GCCs operating on leases, 50% for the first three years 4. and 25% for the next two years.
- 5. Reimbursement of 50% of training costs (up to a maximum of ₹2.5 crore).
- 6. To provide 50% assistance on environmentally friendly innovation, patent, and copyright costs.
- 7. Stamp duty and electricity charges will also be waived. 588 hectares of land allocated for solar projects:
- Approval given for the allocation of 161.45 hectares of land in Karanisar, Bikaner, and 356.25 hectares of land in Kharnai, Chittorgarh for solar energy. 70.6 hectares of land allocated in Sokhru, Barmer for a 765 kV substation.

Sickle Cell Disease: First Indigenous CRISPR Gene Therapy

Why in News?

The Minister of Science and Technology has launched the country's first indigenous CRISPR-based gene therapy for sickle cell disease.



- Name of Therapy: Called Birsa 101, this therapy is dedicated to Bhagwan Birsa Munda, whose 150th birth anniversary is celebrated on November 15, 2025.
- **Developed by: CSIR-Institute of Genomics and Integrative Biology (IGIB)**
- This technology works like a "precision genetic surgery." It is not only capable of curing sickle cell disease but could also transform the way many genetic disorders are treated.







- Objective: To monitor and compare climate mitigation efforts and increase transparency in global climate policies.
- The CCPI uses a standardized framework to compare the climate performance of 63 countries and the European Union, which account for more than 90 percent of global greenhouse gas emissions.

Climate mitigation performance is evaluated in four categories: greenhouse gas emissions, renewable energy, energy use, and climate policy.







India's Performance:

- India ranked 23rd in this year's CCPI and is among the middle-performing countries. The country ranked medium in terms of greenhouse gas emissions, climate policy, and energy use, and low in terms of renewable energy.
- As of September 2025, India's total solar rooftop capacity was 20.8 gigawatts, an increase of nearly 9 gigawatts over the previous year, representing approximately 17 percent of total solar installations.
- India's updated NDC commits to achieve 50 percent non-fossil capacity by 2030 and a 45 percent emission-intensity reduction compared to 2005, but experts say the net-zero target for 2070 is not in line with the 1.5°C goals.
- Despite strong long-term climate commitments, coal dependence remains a constraint.

- Background: The Rashtriya Gokul Mission (RGM), launched in December 2014, focuses on the scientific conservation and development of indigenous bovine breeds. Since 2021, the Department has been awarding the National Gopal Ratna Awards (NGRA) annually to encourage milk-producing dairy cooperatives/MPCs/FPOs, and artificial insemination farmers, technicians (AITs).
- Awards: The National Gopal Ratna Awards-2025 will consist of a certificate of merit, a memento and monetary award in the first two categories i.e. Best Dairy Farmer and Best Farmer and Dairy Cooperative/Milk Producer Company/Dairy Farmer Producer.

- Why in News?
- The Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, will organize World Fisheries Day 2025 on November 21, 2025, at Sushma Swaraj Bhawan in New Delhi.



- This year's theme is "Transforming India's Water Economy: Adding Value to Seafood Exports."
- It underlines the country's commitment to develop aquatic products from marine and riparian water sources into high-value, globally competitive products.
- Objective: To establish a centralized digital traceability system (source, processing point, and point of sale) for fisheries and aquaculture to ensure compliance with domestic and international regulations, promote food safety, enhance sustainability, and improve market access.
