Shilpgram Festival – 2025 (Udaipur)



Why in News?

- On December 21, 2025, the Governor of Rajasthan and Chairman of the West Zone Cultural Centre, Udaipur, Haribhau Kisanrao Bagde, inaugurated the 'Shilpgram Festival-2025'.



Key Points:

- Venue:** Shilpgram, Udaipur.
- Organizer:** West Zone Cultural Centre, Udaipur, under the Ministry of Culture, Government of India.
- Theme:** 'Lok Ke Rang – Lok Ke Sang.'
- The festival will be held from December 21 to 30, 2025.
- During the inauguration ceremony of the 'Shilpgram Festival', the Governor presented the 'Dr. Komal Kothari Memorial Lifetime Achievement Award' to two individuals. Each recipient received a silver plaque and a cash prize of ₹2.51 lakh.

Award Recipients:

- **Ramnath Chaudhary (Jaipur):** Ramnath Chaudhary, a resident of Padampura in Jaipur, is the only artist in the world who plays the Algoja (a Rajasthani folk instrument) with his nose. The Algoja is the state musical instrument of Rajasthan.
- **Dr. Niranjan Vallabhbhai Rajyaguru (Rajkot, Gujarat):** He has conducted fieldwork on folk and devotional music, creating 700 hours of sound recordings.

Facts for Prelims:

West Zone Cultural Centre, Udaipur

- **Establishment:** Between 1985 and 1987.
- **Chairman:** Governor of Rajasthan.
- **Headquarters:** Bagore Ki Haveli, Udaipur.
- **Objective:** To preserve the cultural diversity of Western India through performing arts, visual arts, folk arts, traditional arts, and tribal arts.
- The West Zone Cultural Centre was the first center in India to establish a 'Shilpgram' (crafts village).
- This center organizes the 'Shilpgram Festival' every year in the last week of December at Shilpgram in Udaipur.

State's First Inter-State Tiger Relocation



Why in News?

- On December 21, 2025, the 'state's first inter-state tiger relocation' was successfully completed from Pench Tiger Reserve in Madhya Pradesh to Ramgarh Vishdhari Tiger Reserve in Rajasthan.



Key Points:

- **Objective:** To introduce genetic diversity in the tiger reserve and reduce the risk of inbreeding.
- **Transportation:** By Indian Air Force MI-17 helicopter.
- This is only the second time in India that an inter-state tiger translocation has been attempted. The first inter-state tiger translocation was attempted in 2018, which was unsuccessful. In that attempt, one male and one female tiger were brought from Kanha Tiger Reserve and Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve (Madhya Pradesh) respectively to Satkosia Tiger Reserve (Odisha).

Ramgarh Vishdhari Tiger Reserve:

- **Location:** Situated in Bundi district, extending to Kota and Bhilwara.
- It is located in the ancient Aravalli hills, with seasonal rivers like Mej, Ramgarh, and Khari flowing through it.
- It was declared the fourth tiger reserve of Rajasthan in 2022, after Ranthambore, Sariska, and Mukundra Hills Tiger Reserves. Facts for Prelims:

Key Points:

- **Venue:** Harish Chandra Mathur Rajasthan State Institute of Public Administration (HCM RIPA), Jaipur.
- The Chief Minister interacted with 60 Lakhpati Didis during the program.
- The Government of Rajasthan has trained 19.45 lakh women in the state and created more than 12 lakh Lakhpati Didis for the respect, safety, and empowerment of women. (Source - DIPR)
- **Mission Panch Ratna:** The objective of Mission Panch Ratna is to provide better market access for products made by women of Self-Help Groups (SHGs) in Rajasthan and to provide opportunities for SHG members in various service sectors. Panch Ratna includes - physical store sales, government procurement, online sales, export promotion, and opportunities in the service sector.

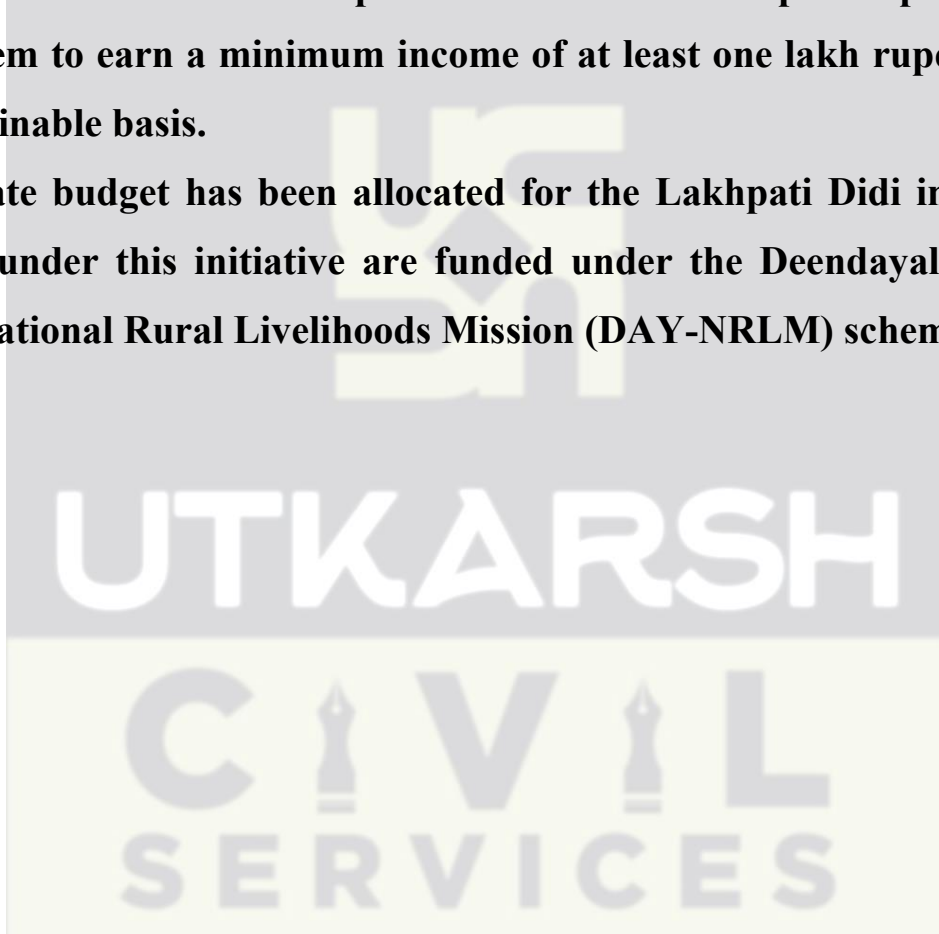

Lakhpati Didi Scheme:

- **Launched:** In 2023.
- **Concerned Ministry:** Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India.
- **Objective of the scheme:** To empower women of Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and enable them to earn a minimum income of at least one lakh rupees per year on a sustainable basis.
- No separate budget has been allocated for the Lakhpati Didi initiative. All activities under this initiative are funded under the Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM) scheme.

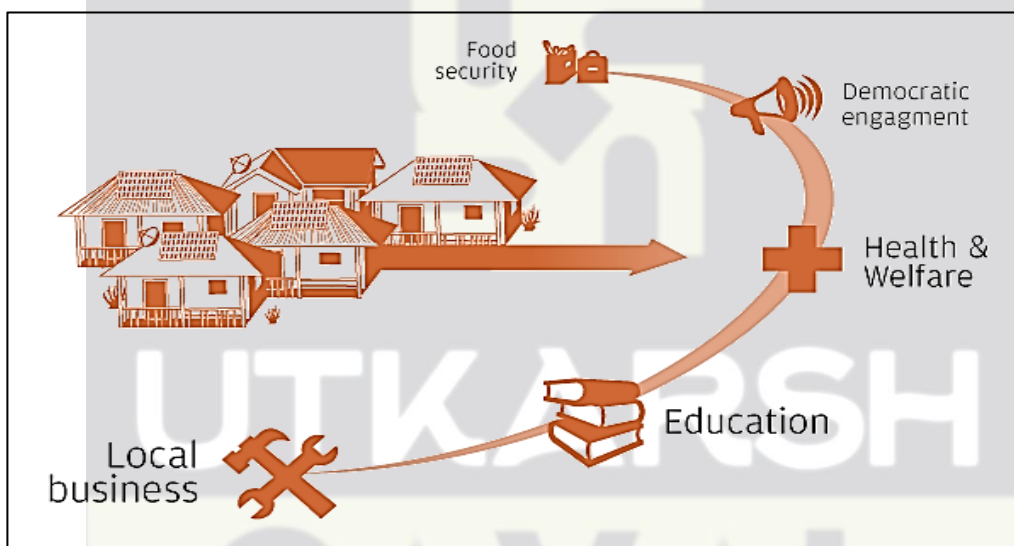


'Smart Village Initiative' Launched from Sawai Pura Village in Pali



Why in News?

Key Points:

- This initiative is a significant step towards the holistic and sustainable development of rural India, in line with the vision of 'Developed India@2047'.



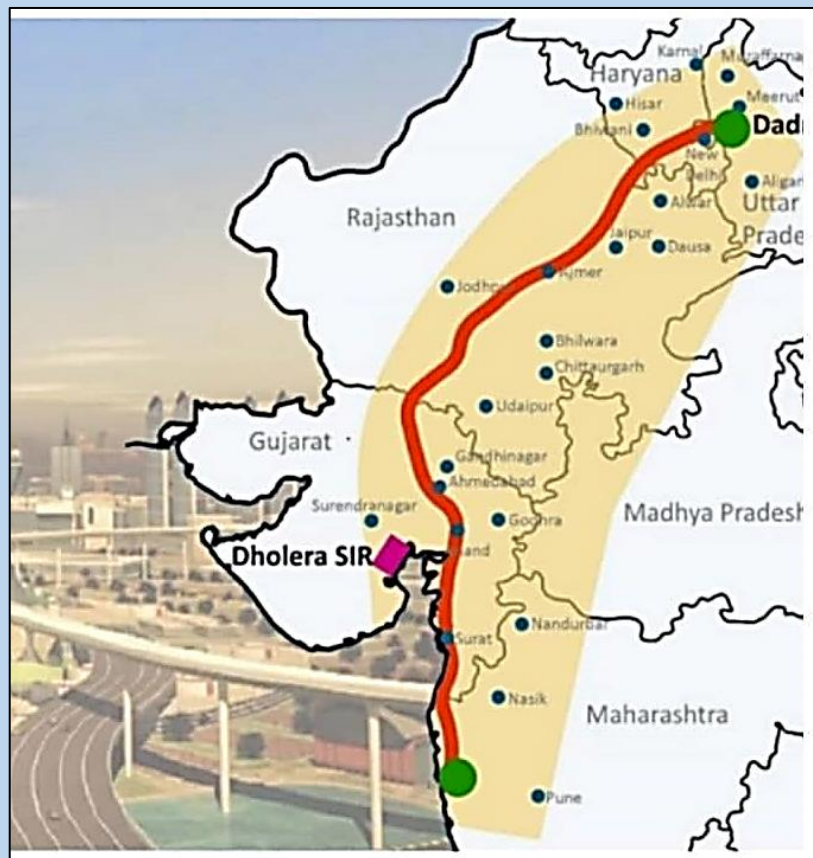

Prime Minister's Visits to Jordan, Ethiopia, and Oman



Why in News?

- From December 15 to 17, 2025, the Indian Prime Minister undertook official visits to Jordan, Ethiopia, and Oman.



Key Points:

- **Objective of the visit:** To strengthen India's bilateral relations with strategic partners in West Asia and Africa.
- **Jordan Visit:** From December 15 to 16, 2025, at the invitation of King Abdullah II of Jordan.
- 2025 marks the 75th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between India and Jordan (relations established: 1950).
- Jordan is one of India's largest suppliers of phosphate and potash fertilizers.
- Jordan has been providing visa-on-arrival to Indian tourists since 2009 and e-visa since 2023.

Major Outcomes and Agreements:

1. Agreement between Petra and Ellora.
2. Renewal of the Cultural Exchange Program for 2025-2029.
3. India is Jordan's third largest trading partner. Both countries aim to increase mutual trade to over US\$5 billion in the next 5 years (Bilateral trade in 2024: US\$2.3 billion).

- **Official Name:** Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan.
- **Capital:** Amman
- **Location:** Jordan is located in the Middle East and is bordered by Syria, Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Israel, and Palestine.
- **Dead Sea:** The lowest point on Earth, famous for its extremely saline water.
- **Ethiopia Visit:** From December 16 to 17, 2025, at the invitation of the Prime Minister of Ethiopia, Dr. Abiy Ahmed Ali.
- The Prime Minister's two-day bilateral visit to Ethiopia was his first official visit.
- Prime Minister Modi was awarded Ethiopia's highest state honor, the 'Great Honor Medal of Ethiopia'.
- Total India-Ethiopia trade in FY 2024-25 was US\$ 550.19 million (Indian exports US\$ 476.81 million and imports US\$ 73.38 million).

Key Points:

- **Winner:** An Indian team named Photonics Odyssey has won NASA's Satellite Internet Concept International Space Apps Challenge, 2025.
- According to NASA Space Apps, the winning team members are Manish D., M.K., Prashant G., Rajalingam N., Rashi M., and Shakti R.
- **Reason/Contribution:** Photonics Odyssey proposed an independent, phased satellite internet infrastructure to expand broadband access in remote areas and received the award for it.
- **Introduction:** Launched in 2012, the International Space Apps Challenge is NASA's annual global hackathon that aims to engage citizens worldwide in solving real-world problems using the agency's open data.
- The project aims to connect over 70 million people in India to broadband communication while reducing reliance on ground infrastructure.

Supreme Court's Decision: Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR)

Why in News?

- The Supreme Court, in its judgment in the case of M.K. Ranjitsinh and others vs. Union of India, held that environmental and ecological considerations must be inherently included in Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), recognizing that CSR spending on environmental protection is not charity but a constitutional obligation under Article 51A(g).



Key Points:

- **Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR):** It is a management framework that integrates social and environmental concerns into business operations and interactions with stakeholders, reflecting a long-term commitment to societal well-being.

- The concept of CSR in India was first introduced in 2009, through voluntary guidelines by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs and later refined in 2011, in the National Voluntary Guidelines on Social, Environmental and Economic Responsibilities.
- **CSR Eligibility Criteria (Section 135, Companies Act, 2013):** CSR was made mandatory in India through the Companies Act, 2013, making India the first country in the world to legislate on CSR spending.
- The CSR provisions apply to companies that meet any one of the following conditions in the preceding financial year:
 - **Net worth:** ₹500 crore or more
 - **Turnover:** ₹1,000 crore or more
 - **Net profit:** ₹5 crore or more
- Such companies are required to spend at least 2 percent of their average net profit of the preceding three years on CSR activities.

Dark Eagle Hypersonic Missile System



Why in News?

- Recently, the US Army and Navy completed an integrated test of the Dark Eagle Long-Range Hypersonic Weapon (LRHW).



Key Points:

- **Introduction:** It is a non-nuclear, ground-launched hypersonic missile weapon system.
- **Development:** By Lockheed Martin and Northrop Grumman.

Features:

- It consists of a mobile ground-based battery equipped with four Transporter Erector Launchers (TELs), each TEL capable of launching two missiles, thus allowing for a total of eight missiles to be launched.
- **Maximum speed:** Mach 17
- Each hypersonic missile is powered by a solid-fueled two-stage rocket booster.

- The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) ship 'Amulya', the third vessel in the series of eight new generation Adamyah-class fast patrol vessels, was commissioned in Goa on December 19, 2025.



Key Points:

- **Meaning of Amulya:** 'Priceless'
- **Designer and Manufacturer:** Goa Shipyard Limited (GSL)

Key Features: 60% Indigenization

1. **Propulsion:** Two advanced 3000 kW diesel engines
2. **Speed:** Up to 27 knots
3. **Operational Range:** 1,500 nautical miles

PESA Festival, 2025



Why in News?

- A two-day 'PESA Festival' is being organized by the Ministry of Panchayati Raj in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh, from December 23 to 24, 2025, as a celebration of folk culture on the anniversary of the enactment of the Panchayats (Extension to Scheduled Areas) Act, 1996 (PESA).

Key Points:

- **PESA Day:** December 24
 - Special Gram Sabhas will also be organized on December 24 in all ten PESA states, with the main objective of strengthening community participation, conserving natural resources, protecting traditional customs, expanding livelihood opportunities, and promoting social justice.
- PESA Act, 1996:**
- According to the 73rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 1992, the provisions relating to Panchayats in Part IX of the Indian Constitution do not apply to the areas covered under the Fifth Schedule.
 - Under Article 243M(4)(B) of the Constitution of India, Parliament enacted the “Provisions of the Panchayats (Extension to Scheduled Areas) Act, 1996” (also known as the PESA Act) to extend the provisions of Part IX of the Constitution to Scheduled Areas with certain exceptions and modifications.
 - **Enacted:** December 24, 1996
 - Scheduled Areas are those areas declared by the Hon'ble President. Article 244(1) of the Constitution and the Fifth Schedule contain provisions relating to these areas. Since these areas are mentioned in the Fifth Schedule of the Constitution, they are also called Fifth Schedule Areas.
 - Currently, areas covered under the Fifth Schedule are notified in 10 states, including Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Rajasthan, and Telangana.
 - **Committees established under the Act:** Several committees are working to monitor the effective implementation of the PESA Act, such as:
 1. Peace and Conflict Resolution Committee
 2. Forest Resource Planning and Control Committee
 3. Cooperation Mother Committee (Mothers' Support Committee)

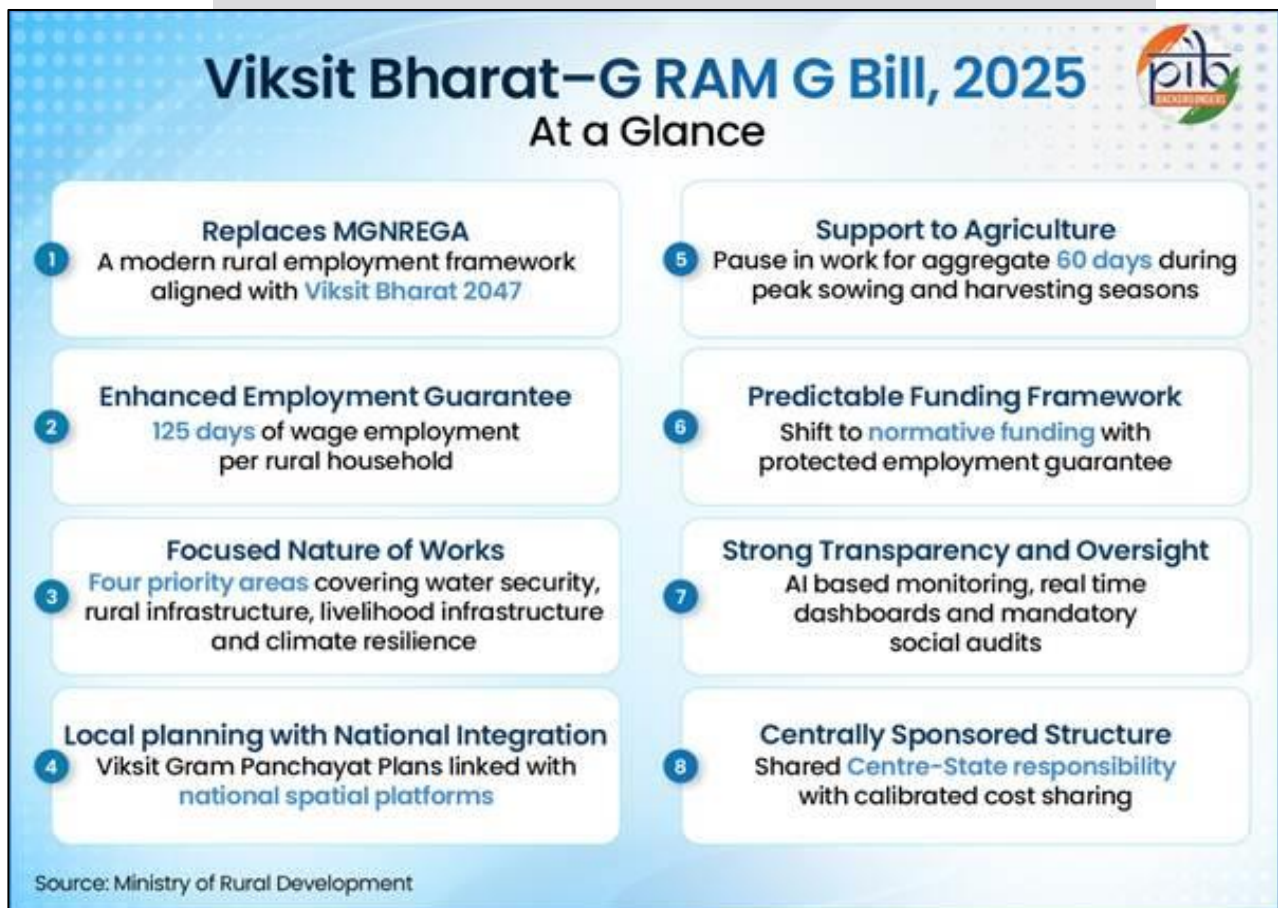

Developed India - G Ram Ji Act, 2025



Why in News?

- The 'Developed India – Guarantee for Employment and Livelihood Mission (Rural) Bill, 2025', passed by Parliament, has been approved by the President of India.



Key Points:

- Rural poverty has seen a sharp decline from 25.7 percent in 2011–12 to approximately 5 percent in 2023–24, reducing the need for MGNREGA as a crisis-mitigation program and highlighting the need for a shift towards productivity-based employment.
- This law replaces the nearly two-decade-old Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), 2005.

Key Provisions:

- **Statutory Wage Employment Guarantee:** Provides a legal guarantee of 125 days of wage employment per financial year to adult members of every rural household willing to do unskilled manual work.
- **Conditional and Non-Universal Coverage:** Unlike the universal coverage of MGNREGA, employment under this bill will be available only in rural areas notified by the Central Government, making the guarantee conditional rather than nationwide.
- **Bottom-Up Planning through VGPPs:** Mandates the creation of Developed Gram Panchayat Plans (VGPPs) using spatial technology, which will be consolidated at the block, district, and state levels and integrated with PM Gati Shakti for coordinated infrastructure planning.
- **Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) Structure:** The cost-sharing pattern has been revised to 60:40 for most states (instead of the earlier 10% state share under MGNREGA), significantly increasing the financial burden on the states. The 90:10 pattern will remain unchanged for the North-Eastern and Himalayan states/union territories.
- **Facilitation during agricultural seasons:** This bill empowers states to suspend the program for a maximum of 60 days in a financial year during peak sowing and harvesting seasons, ensuring the availability of agricultural labor for farming activities.
- **Unemployment allowance provision:** Mandates the payment of unemployment allowance by state governments if employment is not provided within 15 days of demanding work.

Why in News?

- The birth anniversary of Srinivasa Ramanujan (1887–1920) is celebrated every year on December 22 as National Mathematics Day (NMD).



Key Points:

- **Proclaimed in:** 2011
- **National Mathematics Year:** 2012

Some major mathematical theories and concepts that originated in India:

1. The decimal number system
2. The concept of zero
3. Early ideas of negative numbers

- **Prominent mathematicians of ancient Indian history:** Aryabhata, Brahmagupta, Varahamihira, and Bhaskaracharya II made significant contributions to the fields of arithmetic, algebra, geometry, and trigonometry.

National Farmers' Day, 2025: December 23

Choudhary Charan Singh was born on Dec 23, 1902

FARMERS' LEADER

Became 5th prime minister of India in 1979

His birthday is celebrated as **KISAN DIWAS** across the country

Abolished Zamindari from U P through the Zamindari Abolition Act, 1950 & brought about the Land holding Act, 1960

In 1938, introduced the **Agriculture Produce Market Bill** to protect the interest of farmers from the greed of traders

Authored several books including *Abolition of Zamindari, Co-operative Farming X-rayed & India's Poverty & its Solution*

- Promoted decentralization, grassroots governance, and local economic autonomy.
- Gave the Department of Rural Development the status of a ministry and played a crucial role in the establishment of NABARD.
- Advocated for Minimum Support Price (MSP), introduced the Consolidation of Holdings Act (1953) and the Uttar Pradesh Zamindari and Land Reforms Act (1952) to benefit the landless.
- Proposed the Agricultural Produce (Grading and Marketing) Act (1938), building agricultural market infrastructure.
- In 2024, the government posthumously awarded him the prestigious Bharat Ratna along with four other recipients: Karpoori Thakur, Mankombu Sambasivan (MS) Swaminathan, Pamulaparthi Venkata (P. V.) Narasimha Rao, and Lal Krishna Advani.
