Mineral Vehicle Tracking System (Implemented from January 1, 2026)



Why in News?

- The Rajasthan Mining Department has issued guidelines for implementing the Mineral Vehicle Tracking System across the state from January 1, 2026.



Key Points:

- According to the guidelines issued by the department, it is mandatory to install GPS-based Vehicle Location Tracking Devices (VLTDs) and Radio-Frequency Identification (RFID) tags on all mineral vehicles before January 1, 2026.
- Vehicles that do not comply with the rules will not be issued an 'e-Ravanna' for mineral transportation.
- **E-Ravanna:** E-Ravanna is an electronic system (app) launched by the Rajasthan government to bring transparency in mineral transportation, prevent royalty evasion, and address the problem of overloading. Since October 31, 2017, the issuance of manual (physical) challans for all mineral transportation has been completely banned, except in special cases for gravel and gypsum.
- **Note:** Rajasthan is the first state in the country to auction pre-embedded blocks. The process of obtaining necessary permissions before auctioning mineral blocks is called 'pre-embedded clearance'.

Facts for Prelims (Economic Survey – 2024-25)

Mining Sector in Rajasthan:

- Rajasthan is one of India's richest states in terms of mineral resources, with reserves of 81 types of minerals, of which 58 are mined.
- Rajasthan is the sole producer of lead and zinc ores, selenite, and wollastonite, while also leading the country in the production of silver, calcite, and gypsum.
- Rajasthan tops the national production of ball clay, phosphorite, ochre, steatite, feldspar, and fire clay.
- Rajasthan is a major producer of dimensional stones such as marble, sandstone, and granite, as well as cement-grade and steel-grade limestone.
- A revenue target of ₹9,500 crore has been set for the Department of Mines and Geology for the year 2024-25.

- **Released – December 4, 2024.**
- The Rajasthan Mineral Policy 2024, aims to promote sustainable, transparent, and responsible mineral development by leveraging the state's abundant mineral resources for economic development while ensuring environmental protection and community welfare.

Key Features:

- **Economic Development and Investment:** Promote mineral-based industries, attract investment, and increase the sector's contribution to the state's Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP).
- **Employment Generation:** To provide direct and indirect employment opportunities to over 10 million people by 2047.
- **Sustainability and ESG Compliance:** Implement zero-waste mining, environmental friendly technologies, and waste management strategies.
- **Technology Integration:** Ensuring transparency by adopting advanced exploration techniques, AI-based monitoring, and digital governance.
- **Illegal Mining Mitigation:** Preventing illegal activities using GPS-based tracking, geo-fencing, and real-time monitoring.

Targets:

1. Increase the mineral concession area from the current 0.68 percent to 1.0 percent by 2029-30 and 2.0 percent by 2046-47.
2. Increase the number of mineable minerals in the state from 58 to 70 by 2047.
3. Auction 50 large mineral blocks, starting with 5 blocks in 2025-26, by 2029-30.
4. Create 5 million direct and indirect jobs by 2029-30 and over 10 million by 2046-47.
5. Increase the mineral sector's contribution to the state's GSDP to 5 percent by 2029-30 and 8 percent by 2046-47.

Other important points:

Rajasthan State Mineral Exploration Trust (RSMET)

- **Formed** in 2020.
- **Objective:** To effectively manage and monitor activities related to the scientific exploration and mining of mineral deposits in Rajasthan, including the use of modern technology, research, development, skill development, and revenue generation.

Naunera Major and Parwan-Akawad Drinking Water Projects



Why in News?

- Recently, the state government issued work orders for the Naunera Major Drinking Water Project and the Parwan-Akawad Drinking Water Project under the Jal Jeevan Mission.



Key Points:

- The state government has set an ambitious target of completing both projects by August 2027.

Naunera Major Drinking Water Project:

- Beneficiary Districts:** Kota and Bundi. (749 villages and 6 towns)
- The project will include the construction of one intake pump house, three water treatment plants, 14 freshwater reservoirs, and 137 highwater reservoirs for Kota and Bundi.
- Additionally, a 58.45-kilometer-long raw water rising main pipeline will be laid for both districts.

Parwan-Akawad Drinking Water Project:

- Beneficiary Districts:** Jhalawar-Baran-Kota. (1402 villages, 276 hamlets)
- Under the project, two intake pump houses, two water treatment plants, 41 clean water reservoirs, and 276 high water reservoirs will be constructed for Kota and Jhalawar.
- Additionally, a total of 661 kilometers of main transmission pipeline will be laid for Baran-Kota-Jhalawar.

Facts for Prelims:

Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM)

- The Central Government launched the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) in August 2019 in partnership with States/Union Territories with the objective of providing tap water supply to every rural household in the country.
- Implementation:** Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation (Ministry of Jal Shakti).
- Implementation in Rajasthan:** In Rajasthan, the Public Health Engineering Department (PHED) is primarily responsible for implementing the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM). Water is the subject of state list.

- **Note:** Rajasthan has won 19 medals, including 15 gold, from the 22 National Lacrosse Championships held in the last three years.

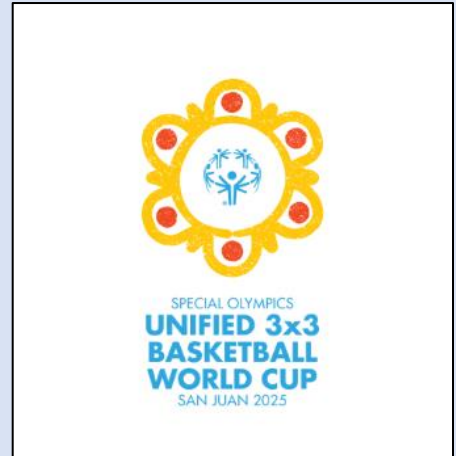

Vande Mataram



Why in News?

- India is celebrating the 150th anniversary of its national song, Vande Mataram.



Key Points:

- **Origin** – Vande Mataram was composed in Sanskrit by Bankim Chandra Chatterjee and first published in the novel Anandamath in 1882.
- Anandamath is set against the backdrop of the Bengal famine of 1769-73 and the Sanyasi Rebellion.
- It gained national recognition after being sung at the Indian National Congress session in 1896.
- In 1907, Madame Bhikaji Cama hoisted the tricolor flag for the first time outside India in Stuttgart, Berlin. Vande Mataram was inscribed on this flag.
- In 1906, an English daily, Vande Mataram, was launched under the editorship of Vipin Chandrapal.
- **National Song** - Its first two verses were adopted as the national song of India on January 24, 1950.

Thailand-Cambodia Conflict



Why in News?

- Thailand recently carried out airstrikes on Cambodian military bases.



Key Points:

- This territorial dispute stems from the 1907 border demarcation, by France during the colonial era.
- The center of the dispute is the Preah Vihear Temple, a culturally significant Khmer pilgrimage site dating back to the 11th-12th centuries.
- The International Court of Justice confirmed Cambodian sovereignty in 1962 and again in 2013, but Thailand has rejected these decisions.



Preah Vihear Temple-

- This is a Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Shiva, located in the Kangrek Mountains near the Thailand-Cambodia border in Cambodia.
- Status** - UNESCO World Heritage Site.

National Marine Fisheries Census, 2025



Why in News?

- Recently, the Minister of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying provided information in the Lok Sabha regarding the National Marine Fisheries Census, 2025.



Key Points:

- Launch:** November 3, 2025, at the Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI), Kochi.
- Nodal Agency:** ICAR - Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute.
- Operational Partner:** Fishery Survey of India (FSI)
- Operation:** This census is being conducted under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY).
- Census Duration:** November 3, 2025, to December 18, 2025 (45 days).
- Objective:** To create a comprehensive digital database of marine fishing communities, infrastructure, and socio-economic indicators, and to modernize fisheries management and improve the implementation of welfare schemes.

Features -

- This is India's first fully digitized fish census.
 - This census will cover approximately 4,000 marine fishing villages and 1.2 million fish farms located in 9 coastal states and 4 union territories.
- Two major mobile apps developed by CMERI are being used, ensuring accuracy, transparency, and efficiency.

Why in News?

- It has established itself as a premier platform for scientific exchange, innovation, outreach, and public engagement.

Soyuz MS-27 Spacecraft



Why in News?

- On December 9, 2025, the Soyuz MS-27 spacecraft successfully returned to Earth from the International Space Station (ISS).



Key Points:

- **Launch Vehicle:** Soyuz booster rocket (Russian rocket).
- **Launch Site:** Baikonur Cosmodrome, Kazakhstan.
- **Space agencies involved:** NASA and Roscosmos (Russia).
- **Mission:** Part of the 73rd long-duration mission to the ISS.

Crews involved:

1. **Jonathan Yong/Johnny Kim** – NASA
2. **Sergey Ryzhikov** – Russia
3. **Alexey Zubritsky** – Russia

Objectives:

- Its primary goal is to support ongoing scientific investigations and technology demonstration experiments on the ISS (International Space Station).
- Research conducted by the crew includes planned manned missions to the Moon and Mars.

- The government has approved the Export Promotion Mission to boost exports, especially for MSMEs and labor-intensive sectors.



Key Points:

Additional Information-

- The Finance Minister announced the Export Promotion Mission in the Union Budget 2025-26.
- **Timeframe** – 6 years – Financial Years 2025-26 to 20230-31
- **Associated Institutions** – Ministry of MSME, Department of Commerce, Ministry of Finance, Export Promotion Council, Industry Associations, State Governments.
- **Implementing Agency** – Directorate General of Foreign Trade
- **Two integrated sub-schemes** – Export Promotion and Export Direction.

- The Prime Minister has criticized the term Hindu Growth Rate. It linked India's slow economic growth in earlier decades to people's faith and identity.



Key Points:

HGR:-

- **Terminology:** Coined by Raj Krishna in 1978.
- **Timeframe:** Primarily used to describe India's slow economic growth from the 1950s to the 1980s.
- During this period, the country's GDP grew by approximately 3.5-4% annually.
- According to this term, this slow growth stems from the Hindu way of life, which implies a cultural habit of accepting fate or being content with little.
