- **Venue:** Jaipur Exhibition and Convention Center (JECC), Sitapura.

- **Organizers:** Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) and Department of Information Technology and Communication, Rajasthan.
- **Note:** During the conference, Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma launched the 'National AI Literacy Program', 'Rajasthan AI-ML Policy-2026', 'iStart Learning Management System', 'Rajasthan AVGC-XR Portal', and 'Rajasthan AI Portal'.
- These initiatives will promote Artificial Intelligence (AI)-based education, startups, research, skill development, and digital governance in the state. They will also foster innovation and entrepreneurship in emerging areas of information technology in the state.

MoUs with Google, IIT Delhi, and NLU Jodhpur:

- On January 6, 2026, the Government of Rajasthan signed important Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with Google, IIT Delhi, and NLU Jodhpur.
- With the support of Google, governance will be made more effective through AI-ML-based pilot projects in sectors such as health, agriculture, transport, and citizen services.
- In collaboration with National Law University, Jodhpur, capacity building will be undertaken for government officials, startups, and professionals, promoting trustworthy, responsible, and ethical AI in the state.
- The partnership with IIT Delhi will strengthen the AI Center of Excellence, research, skilling, hackathons, startup mentoring, and industry-academia-government collaboration.
- **Note:** The Government of Rajasthan also signed an MoU with the Skill Development Network (Wadhvani Foundation).

Rajasthan AI-ML Policy – 2026 Launched



Why in News?

- Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma launched the 'Rajasthan AI-ML Policy – 2026' on January 6, 2026, during the 'Rajasthan Regional AI Impact Conference – 2026' in Jaipur.



Key Points:

- Full Name:** Rajasthan Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning (AI-ML) Policy - 2026

- **Announcement:** This policy was announced in the Rajasthan Budget 2025-26.
- **Approval:** Approved by the Rajasthan Cabinet on December 30, 2025.
- **Objective:** To make public service delivery faster, more transparent, and citizen-centric through the responsible, ethical, and secure use of Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning, to increase administrative efficiency, and to encourage innovation-based economic development.
- Developing Rajasthan as a hub for Information Technology (IT) and Information Technology Enabled Services (ITES) is also among the primary objectives of this policy.
- This policy will ensure the expansion of e-governance, keeping in mind the increasing importance of information technology in service delivery.
- **Provisions:** Under this policy, special emphasis has been placed on making AI systems transparent, accountable, fair, and privacy-protected, as well as on reducing bias in AI systems, ensuring data security, and clarity in the decision-making process.
- The policy also provides for clear procedures for reporting and resolving cybercrimes related to AI.
- This policy includes provisions for promoting AI education in schools, ITIs, polytechnic institutions, and colleges.
- **Note:** The policy includes a provision for the establishment of an 'Artificial Intelligence Center of Excellence'.
- Under the policy, each department will identify the possibilities of using AI in its respective field, and an AI nodal officer will be appointed.

Sikar District Ranks First in the First Phase of the 'Mukhyamantri Jal Swavalamban Abhiyan 2.0'



Why in News?

- In the first phase of the 'Mukhyamantri Jal Swavalamban Abhiyan 2.0', launched in February 2024, Sikar district secured the first position across the state.



Key Points:

- **First phase target:** To construct 1,10,000 water harvesting structures in more than 5,000 villages of the state.

- In Sikar, 136 villages across 65 Gram Panchayats in 12 blocks have been included under this scheme. According to the progress report as of December 31, 2025, Sikar completed 4820 works against the target of 4513, achieving 107 percent progress, which is the highest in Rajasthan.

Mukhyamantri Jal Swavalamban Abhiyan 2.0 (MJSA 2.0)


- **Announcement:** In the Rajasthan Budget 2024-25.
- **Launch:** By the state government in February 2024.
- **Objective:** To ensure maximum rainwater harvesting, water conservation, and judicious use of available water resources in Rajasthan.
- Under this campaign, the construction of new check dams, farm ponds, mini percolation tanks (MPT), sub-surface barriers (SSB), and the repair of old water harvesting structures are undertaken.
- During the period 2024 to 2028, it is proposed to construct 5,00,000 water harvesting and water conservation structures in 20,000 villages of the state under MJSA 2.0.

Other Important Points:

Mukhyamantri Jal Swavalamban Abhiyan (MJSA)

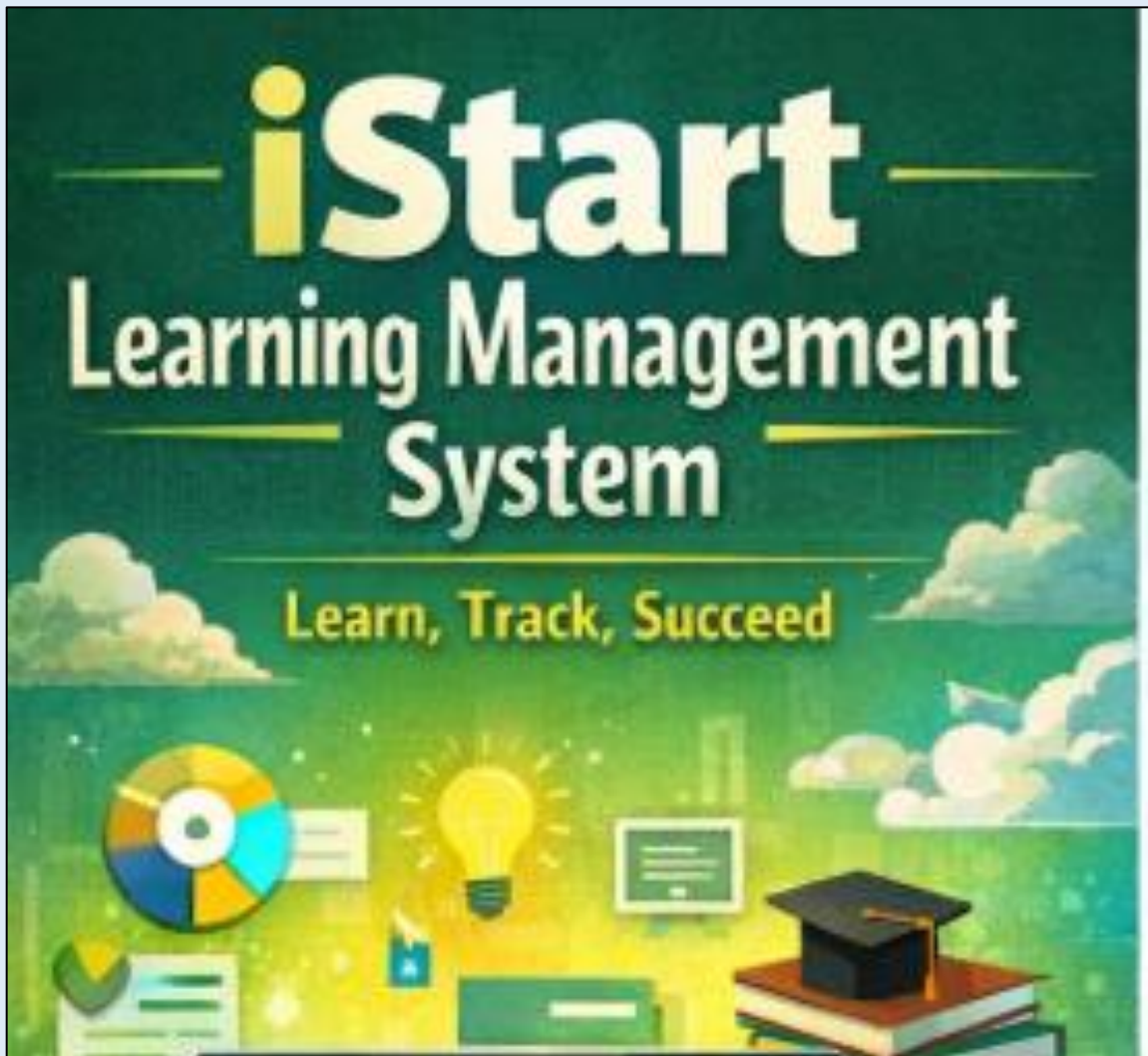
- **Launch:** This campaign was launched on January 27, 2016, from Gardan Khedi village in Jhalawar district.
- **Objective:** To meet the minimum water requirements in rural areas, ensure water availability during droughts, and address problems arising from water scarcity. The year 2016 was marked as the 'Water Revolution Year'.
- **Note:** According to a report by the Ministry of Jal Shakti (Water Resources), 29 districts of Rajasthan are among the total of 193 districts across the country facing severe water depletion. Rajasthan ranks second in this report, after Uttar Pradesh (38 districts).

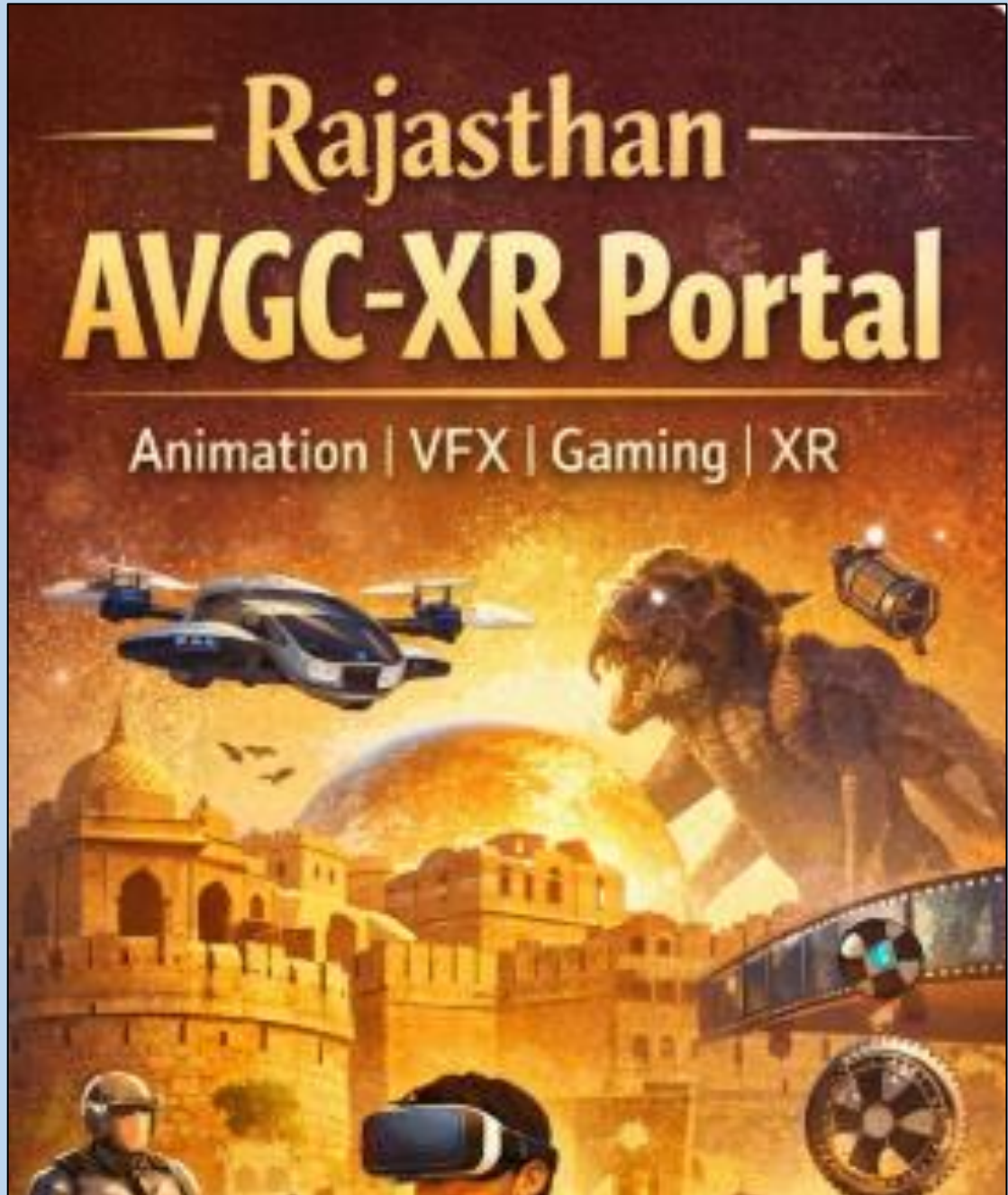
iStart Learning Management System

- **Third Place:** VIT Bhopal University. (Prize: ₹25,000)



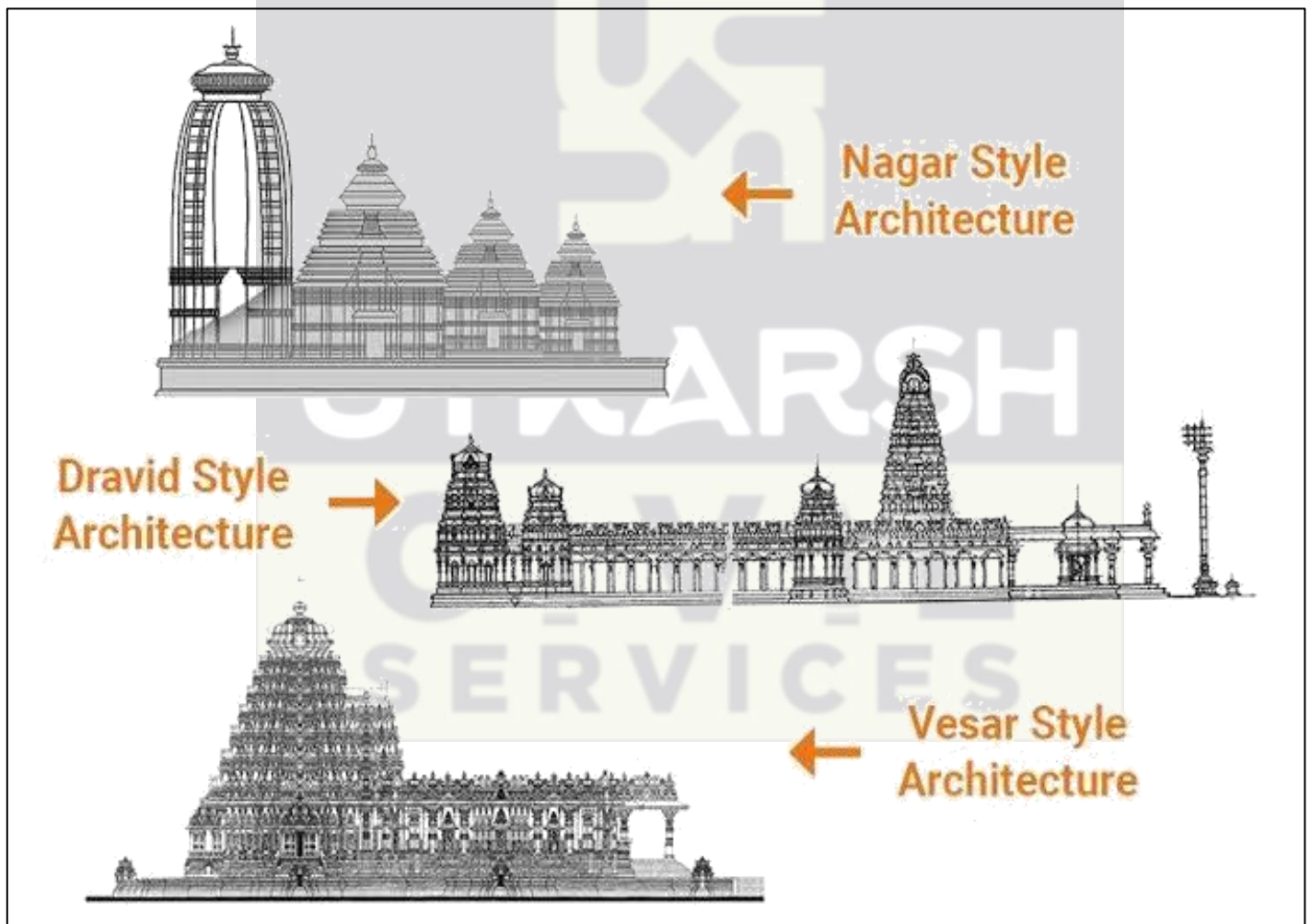


Somnath Temple

Somnath Temple Additional Information-

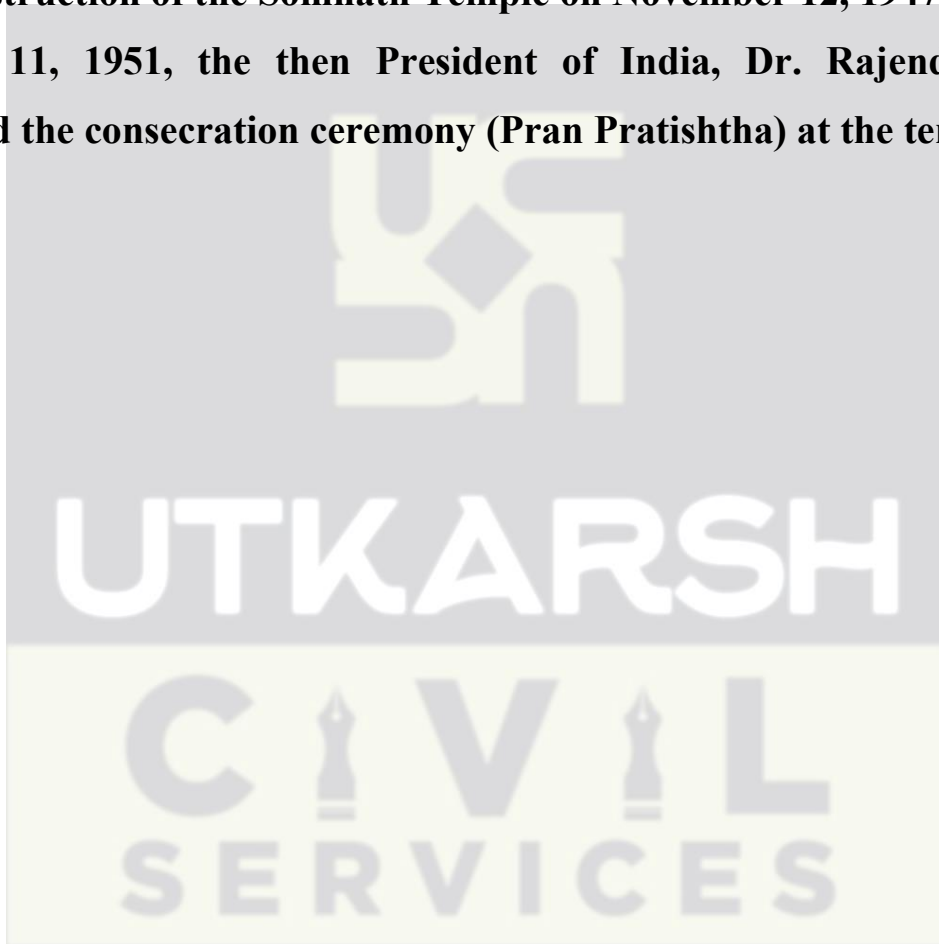
- **Location:** Situated on the seashore at Prabhas Patan near Veraval in the Saurashtra region of Gujarat.

- **Significance:** One of the 12 Jyotirlingas of Lord Shiva is located in Somnath.
- **History:** It was first attacked by Mahmud of Ghazni in the 11th century. This is also mentioned by Al-Biruni.
- **Reconstruction:** The then Deputy Prime Minister Vallabhbhai Patel ordered the reconstruction of the Somnath Temple on November 12, 1947.
- On May 11, 1951, the then President of India, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, performed the consecration ceremony (Pran Pratishtha) at the temple.



Kushan Dynasty



Why in News?

- Archaeologists have discovered rare Kushan-era coins and decorative jewels from a UNESCO World Heritage site near Taxila in present-day Pakistan.
- These discoveries include precious jewels such as lapis lazuli.





Key Points:

Additional Information – Kushan Dynasty

- **Reign:** From the 1st century BCE to the 3rd century CE.
- **Origin:** Believed to have originated from the Yuezhi tribe of Central Asia. Kanishka I was the greatest Kushan ruler, who patronized Buddhism and organized the Fourth Buddhist Council.
- **Administration:** The Kushan Empire was divided into satrapies (provinces). This indicates a decentralized system of governance.
- **Empire Expansion:** Extended across northwestern India (Gandhara, Kashmir), the Mathura region, and through the Ganga-Yamuna Doab to parts of eastern Uttar Pradesh and Bihar.
- **Economy:** The Kushans issued a large number of gold coins. This indicates a strong currency-based economy and extensive trade relations.

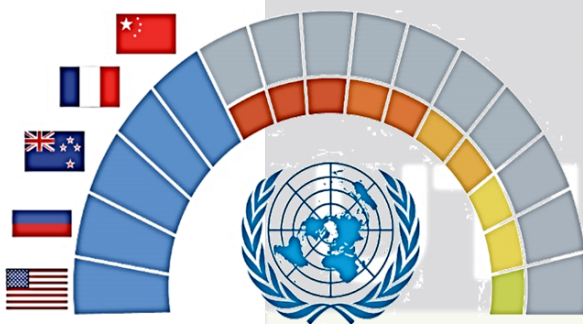
United Nations Security Council – UNSC

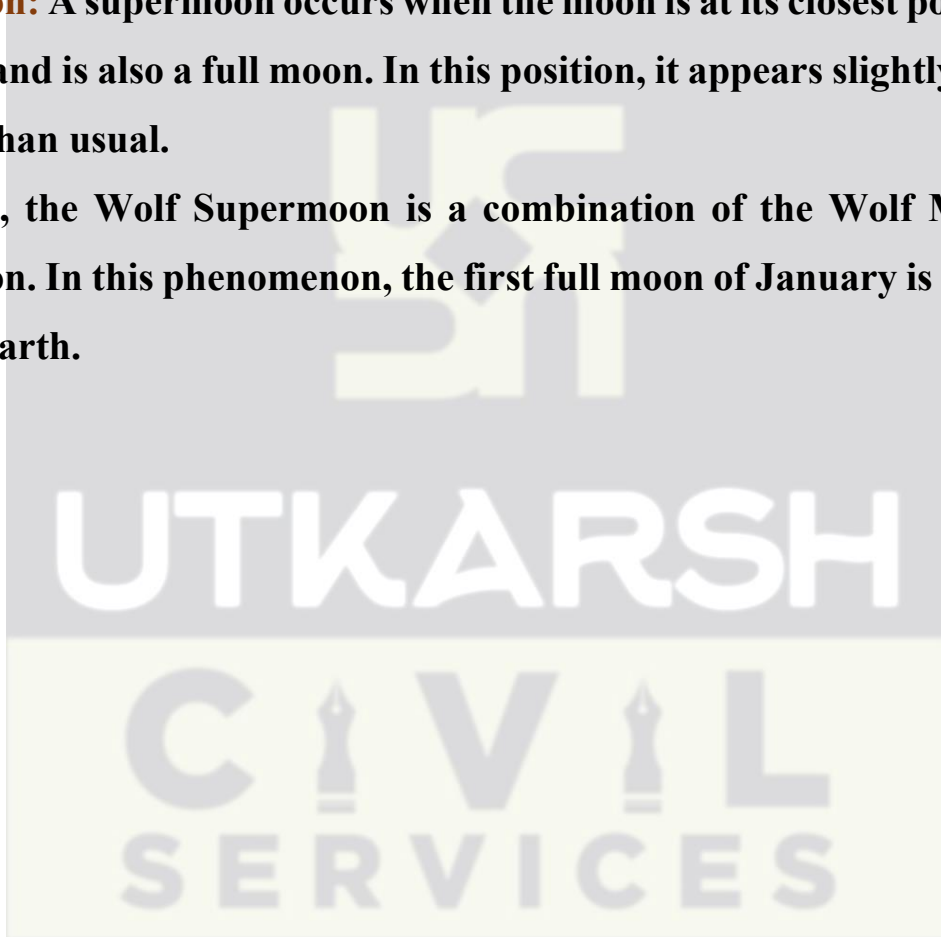

- **Wolf Supermoon:** This is the traditional name for the first full moon of the month.
- **Supermoon:** A supermoon occurs when the moon is at its closest point to Earth (perigee) and is also a full moon. In this position, it appears slightly larger and brighter than usual.
- Therefore, the Wolf Supermoon is a combination of the Wolf Moon and a Supermoon. In this phenomenon, the first full moon of January is at its closest point to Earth.

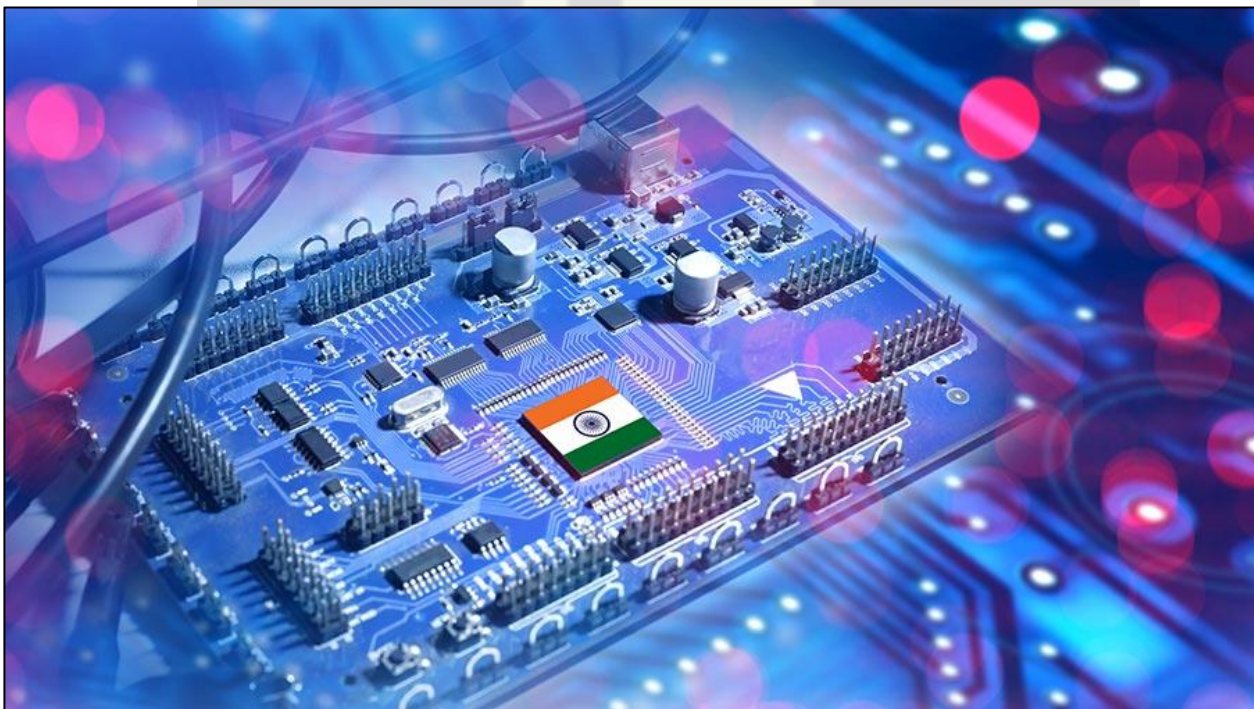


Design Linked Incentive Scheme – DLI

Key Points:

DLI Scheme:

- **Launch:** Launched in 2021, under the Semicon India Program.
- **Nodal Ministry:** Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology.
- **Implementing Agency:** C-DAC – Centre for Development of Advanced Computing.
- **Objective:** To create a robust and self-reliant chip design ecosystem by providing financial incentives and advanced design infrastructure to domestic startups and MSMEs.
