

## Facts for Prelims:

### Kanhaiyalal Sethia

- The literary figure Kanhaiyalal Sethia, the creator of the popular song 'Dharti Dhoran Ri' and the immortal popular song 'Pathal aur Pithal', was born on September 11, 1919, in Sujangarh (Churu).
- His first poetry collection 'Vanphool' was published in 1941. Due to his poetry collection 'Agniveena' (1942), which was full of patriotism and nationalism, he was accused of sedition.
- He was also active in the Quit India Movement and in 1945, as a prominent worker of the Bikaner Praja Parishad, he opposed feudalism and awakened the farming community through his poem 'Kun Zameen Ro Dhani'.
- He struggled to include Abu in Rajasthan during the integration of Rajasthan.
- Sethia also made tireless efforts to get constitutional recognition for the Rajasthani language.

### Awards:

- Awarded by the Central Sahitya Akademi, New Delhi in 1976 for his work 'Leeltans'.
- Murti Devi Award in 1988 for 'Nirgranth'.
- Awarded the Suryamall Meesan Award for 'Sabda' and the Tantia Award for 'Satvadi' in 1987.
- He was awarded the Padma Shri in 2004 and the Rajasthan Ratna award (posthumously) in 2012.
- **Died:** November 1, 2008, in Kolkata.

## In the News: Kumbhalgarh Wildlife Sanctuary

### Why in News?


- Recently, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change declared a 1-kilometer area surrounding the Kumbhalgarh Wildlife Sanctuary as an Eco-Sensitive Zone (ESZ).

### Key Points:

- According to the new rules, industrial and commercial activities have been banned in 94 villages located in the 243 square kilometer area adjacent to the sanctuary's boundary.
- The Kumbhalgarh Sanctuary is spread across Rajsamand, Pali, and Udaipur districts and is the catchment area of the Banas and Luni river systems.
- Objective:** To ensure the protection of the rare flora and fauna of this region and maintain the ecological balance.

### Eco-Sensitive Zone (ESZ):

- To manage and conserve biodiversity in protected areas, the Central Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change notifies the area near protected areas as 'Eco-Sensitive Zones (ESZs)'.
- The Ministry notifies ESZs under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, based on proposals and recommendations from the state government.

- **Concept:** The concept of Eco-Sensitive Zones (ESZs) was conceived during the meeting of the Indian Board for Wildlife held in January 2002, when the Wildlife Conservation Strategy, 2002 was adopted.
- **Regulation of ESZs:** By the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC).

## Objectives:

- To conserve the eco-sensitive zone and prevent environmental degradation caused by anthropogenic activities.
- To create a barrier or shock absorber for the special ecosystem.

## Facts for Prelims:

- **Kumbhalgarh Tiger Reserve (proposed):** Proposed as the sixth Tiger Reserve of Rajasthan, it will include areas of Rajsamand and Udaipur districts.
- **Kumbhalgarh Festival:** Organized by the Rajasthan Tourism Department at Kumbhalgarh Fort in Rajsamand from December 1 to 3, 2026.

### Sajjangarh Wildlife Sanctuary:

- **Location:** Located near Sajjangarh Palace in Udaipur, also known as the 'Monsoon Palace'.


- During the 28th Conference of Speakers and Presiding Officers of Commonwealth Parliaments (CSPOC) held in New Delhi, representatives from various countries recently visited Jaipur for a two-day trip.

## NATIONAL

### Kondagai Inland Lake

#### Why in News?

- A new study has revealed one of the most comprehensive climate records of peninsular India, preserved beneath the unassuming Kondagai inland lake located on the outskirts of Sivaganga, Tamil Nadu.
- Multi-proxy lake records have been scarce in the interior parts of Tamil Nadu, while this region is highly sensitive to the Northeast Monsoon.



#### Key Points:

- **Researchers:** Birbal Sahni Institute of Palaeosciences (BSIP), Department of Science and Technology.

## Research Site: Kondagai Lake:

- Located in Keeladi, Tamil Nadu.
- An archaeological site famous for evidence of a sophisticated urban civilization of the Sangam period.
- It likely dates back to the 6th century BCE (or earlier).

## Research:

- This lake, situated amidst ancient settlements, offers a rare opportunity to understand past monsoon variability, ecosystem responses, and their relationship with human development.
- Using a combination of techniques such as stable isotope analysis, pollen studies, particle size measurements, and radiocarbon dating on 32 collected samples, researchers reconstructed past rainfall, vegetation, lake levels, and flood events with exceptional accuracy.
- Published in the journal *Holocene*, this first high-resolution, multi-proxy reconstruction of climate and lake-ecosystem dynamics from the inland region of Tamil Nadu during the North Holocene period has identified 3 distinct climate phases over the last approximately 4500 years. It has documented the 4.2 thousand years ago arid event, the 3.2 thousand years ago arid phase, and the Roman Warm Period, and established their direct links to monsoon variability, lake hydrology, and human activities in the region.

## Significance:

1. This helps in strengthening regional climate predictions and anticipating future events such as droughts and extreme rainfall.
2. This can improve monsoon forecasting models in climate-sensitive regions like Tamil Nadu.
3. It will strengthen water resource management in drought-prone districts such as Sivaganga and Madurai.
4. By identifying ancient flood deposits, local sediment transport, and phases of land instability, this study contributes to risk mapping and disaster preparedness.
5. Information on past fluctuations in lake water levels, sediment transport, and hydrological changes provides guidance for sustainable reservoir restoration and groundwater recharge planning, tank rehabilitation, and climate-resilient agriculture and water use.



### Counter-Terrorism Measures: ASEAN



#### Why in News?

- The 16th meeting of the ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting Plus (ADMM Plus) Expert Working Group on Counter-Terrorism, focusing on counter-terrorism measures and preparedness, was held in New Delhi from January 14 to 16, 2026.



#### Key Points:

##### 16th Expert Working Group Meeting:

- Co-chaired by: India and Malaysia.
- This is the third meeting of the current cycle from 2024 to 2027.
- 11 ASEAN member states (Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Vietnam, Singapore, Thailand, and Timor-Leste)
- 7 Dialogue Partner countries (Australia, New Zealand, South Korea, Japan, China, the USA, and Russia) participated.
- ADMM Plus is a practical cooperation platform among the defense establishments of the participating countries.
- This cooperation currently focuses on 7 areas:
  1. Maritime Security
  2. Counter-Terrorism
  3. Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief
  4. Peacekeeping Operations
  5. Military Medicine
  6. Humanitarian Mine Action
  7. Cyber Security
- **Tabletop Exercise on Responding to Disaster Situations or Hybrid Threats:** Malaysia will host the tabletop exercise during the next meeting of the Expert Working Group in 2026, followed by India conducting a field training exercise in 2027.

## The Rise of a Third Global Strategic Pole

### Why in News?

- In an era of declining Russian influence and increasing US assertiveness, and amidst a period of unpredictability, the concept of a "third pole" in global geopolitics has gained prominence.

### Key Points:

- This concept refers to a strategic alignment between India, Germany, France (and by extension, Europe), and other middle powers.
- **Multipolar World Order:** This third global power center could give rise to a multipolar world order. This world order would be based on shared values of strategic autonomy, economic openness, technological cooperation, democratic norms, and rules-based global governance.

### How India can benefit from the third global pole:

1. **Diversification of strategic partnerships,** i.e., reducing dependence on any single power bloc.
2. **Economic resilience:** Shaping the global economic structure in collaboration with the European Union, South-South economic cooperation, and other middle powers.
3. **Strengthening industrial ecosystems:** Through co-production in defense, technology, and other supply chains.
4. **A voice in global governance:** Pressuring for the reform of the United Nations Security Council, the World Trade Organization, the International Monetary Fund, and the World Bank.
5. **Supporting the leadership of the Global South** in areas such as climate finance, debt relief, and developmental justice.

## Chabahar Port



### Why in News?

- Amidst the pressure being exerted by the US on Iran, India is considering options to maintain its presence at Iran's Chabahar port.



### Key Points:

#### Additional Information:

- It is located on the coast of the Gulf of Oman in Iran's Sistan and Baluchestan province.
- It is Iran's only deep-sea port that is directly connected to the Indian Ocean.
- The Chabahar port project has two main terminals – Shahid Beheshti and Shahid Kalantari.
- This port is an integral part of the International North-South Transport Corridor (INSTC).
- INSTC is a multi-modal corridor. It connects India to Russia and Europe via Iran and the Caspian Sea.

## GEOGRAPHY

### IMD and Mission Mausam

#### Why in News?

- The India Meteorological Department (IMD) celebrated its 151st Foundation Day with the deployment of 200 automatic weather stations in four major metropolitan cities. This initiative is in line with Mission Mausam.

#### Key Points:

##### Mission Mausam:

- This is a multi-pronged initiative to promote science, research, and services related to weather and climate in India.

##### Implementation:

- India Meteorological Department (IMD)
- Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM - Pune)
- National Centre for Medium Range Weather Forecasting (NCMRWF - Noida)

##### India Meteorological Department:

- **Established:** 1875
- **Ministry:** Ministry of Earth Sciences
- **Headquarters:** New Delhi
- **Function:** To forecast weather-related information and issue warnings against severe weather events.



## ECONOMIC SCENARIO



### Startup India Initiative



#### Why in News?

- The National Startup India Mission completed a decade on January 16, 2026.



#### Key Points:

- **Launch:** January 16, 2016 (National Startup Day; January 16).
- **Implementation:** By the Startup India team under the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT).
- **Objective:** To accelerate economic growth by promoting innovation and entrepreneurship and enabling investment, thereby creating employment.  
Providing support throughout the entire cycle from idea generation → incubation → funding → mentorship → scaling.

## Key Supporting Pillars:

- 1. Fund of Funds for Startups (FFS):** An FFS of ₹10,000 crore has been created to boost domestic venture capital, managed by the Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI).
- 2. Startup Ranking:** Evaluates states and union territories based on startup-friendly policies and their implementation.
- 3. Startup India Hub:** A digital platform that connects startups with investors, mentors, incubators, academic institutions, corporates, and government bodies.
- 4. Startup India Seed Fund Scheme (SISFS):** This is a ₹945 crore fund that provides financial assistance for early-stage requirements such as proof of concept, prototyping, and market entry.
- 5. Credit Guarantee Scheme for Startups:** Operated by the National Credit Guarantee Trustee Company (NCGTC), which provides collateral-free loans to startups through eligible financial institutions.

## Achievements of the Digital India Mission (as of December 2025):

- 1. Startups:** Approximately 44,000 startups were registered in 2025.
  - There are over 2 lakh DPIIT-recognized startups.
- 2. Startup Hubs:** Major hubs include Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Mumbai, and Delhi, but now approximately 50% of startups are emerging from Tier II and Tier III cities, indicating the decentralization of startups.
- 3. Unicorns (startups valued at \$1 billion or more):** From 4 unicorns in 2014, the number has grown to over 120 by 2025, with a combined valuation of US\$350 billion.


## Challenges faced by startups in India:

- 1. Lack of infrastructure (poor connectivity, demand > supply, high logistics costs)**
- 2. Insufficient research and innovation (consumer-centric bias, underdeveloped technological sectors like AI, electric vehicles, and semiconductors)**
- 3. Lack of financial resources (funding shortage, competition, early-stage failures)**

## Reserve Bank – Integrated Ombudsman Scheme (RB-IOS) – 2026

### Why in News?

- The Reserve Bank of India has released the Reserve Bank – Integrated Ombudsman Scheme (RB-IOS) – 2026. This revised scheme is designed to address customer grievances related to services provided by RBI-regulated entities. It will come into effect from July 1, 2026.



### Key Points:

#### Main Features of the Scheme:

- **Objective:** To establish a quick, cost-effective, and alternative grievance redressal mechanism against RBI-regulated entities.
- **RBI Ombudsman:** The RBI may appoint one or more of its officers as RBI Ombudsman and RBI Deputy Ombudsman. Their appointment will generally be for a period of 3 years.
- The RBI will establish a Centralized Receipt and Processing Centre (CRPC) for receiving and processing complaints.

#### Powers of the Ombudsman:

- There is no limit on the amount of dispute that can be brought before the RBI Ombudsman.
- The Ombudsman has the power to award compensation up to ₹30 lakh.
- **Appeal:** The regulated entity or the complainant can file an appeal against the decision before the Appellate Authority within 30 days.

- Recently, Praveen Vashistha (Bihar cadre, 1991 batch) was appointed as a Vigilance Commissioner in the Central Vigilance Commission and took oath on January 16, 2026.

- **Establishment:** As an executive resolution of the Government of India in 1964.
- **Status:** Granted statutory status by the Central Vigilance Commission Act, 2003.
- **Historical Background:** Based on the recommendations of the Santhanam Committee (1962-64).
- **Structure:** 1 Chairperson (Central Vigilance Commissioner) + 2 Members (Other Vigilance Commissioners)

## Judges: Supreme Court

### Why in News?

- The Supreme Court upheld the decision of the Lok Sabha Speaker to constitute an inquiry committee to investigate the removal of Justice Yashwant Varma from office.



### Key Points:

- The Court observed that the rejection of a motion against a judge in one House (Lok Sabha or Rajya Sabha) does not preclude the other House from proceeding with the inquiry and constituting an inquiry committee.

### Removal of Judges: Constitutional Provisions:

- **Articles 124 and 218:** Relate to the removal of judges of the Supreme Court and High Courts, respectively.
- **Grounds for Removal:** Proved misbehavior and incapacity – although these terms are not defined in the Constitution.
- **Procedure:** This is governed by the Judges (Inquiry) Act, 1968.
- **Note:** The term impeachment is not mentioned in the Constitution for the removal of judges.

- Recently, the Global Risks Report 2026, released by the World Economic Forum (WEF), has identified cybersecurity as the most serious risk for India.

- NOTE:** Goeconomic confrontation: The strategic use of economic tools such as trade restrictions, investment controls, and technology restrictions by states to advance geopolitical interests and constrain rivals, leading to a weakening of multilateralism and a rise in protectionism.
- NOTE:** Long-term (over the next 10 years) climate-related risks will dominate, with extreme weather events, biodiversity loss, and critical changes to Earth systems at the forefront.

**Other risks for India:** inadequate public services and social protection, economic slowdown, state-based armed conflict, etc.

2. India needs robust digital security, inclusive growth, and resilient public service delivery.
