

## Successful Test of the 'Strela 10M Air Defense System'

### Why in News?

- Recently, the Indian Army's Konark Corps successfully tested the 'Strela 10M Air Defense System' at the Pokhran Field Firing Range.



### Key Points:

- The Strela-10M (9K35 Strela-10) is a Soviet-developed highly maneuverable and short-range surface-to-air missile system.
- It is primarily designed to destroy low-flying threats such as helicopters, fighter aircraft, and drones.
- The system uses infrared seeker technology. It detects heat from the engine of an aircraft or drone, destroying it mid-air.
- The system is deployed on the MT-LB tracked armored vehicle, allowing it to easily maneuver in difficult terrain, such as desert dunes and rough terrain.

### Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj's Birth Anniversary

#### Why in News?

- The Union Home Minister paid tribute to Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, on his birth anniversary (February 19) and established Hindavi Swaraj.



#### Key Points:

#### Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj:

- **Born:** February 19, 1630, at Shivneri Fort, Pune, Maharashtra.
- **Early Life:** First displayed his military prowess in 1645, successfully capturing Torna Fort and Kondana Fort under Bijapur.
- **Titles:** Chhatrapati, Shakyakarta, Kshatriya Kulwant, and Haindev Dharmodhhak.
- **Death:** April 3, 1680

## ■ Revenue Administration:

- **Ryotwari System:** Shivaji abolished the Jagirdari system and replaced it with the Ryotwari system and changed the status of hereditary revenue officials known as Deshmukh, Deshpande, Patil, and Kulkarni.
- **Chauth and Sardeshmukhi:** Chauth was one-fourth of the total revenue collected from non-Maratha areas in exchange for protection from Maratha attacks, and Sardeshmukhi was 10 percent of the revenue, which was levied as an additional tax.

## Other important points:

- **Maratha Military Landscape:** The Maratha Military Landscape of India (12 forts) i.e. 'Maratha Military Forts' has been included in the UNESCO World Heritage List as India's 44th UNESCO Heritage Site.
- **Forts included:** Shivneri Hill Fort, Rajgad Hill Fort (first political base of Hind Swaraj), Raigad Hill (second capital and site of the Golden Throne), Vijaydurg Coastal Fort (Gibraltar of the East), Khanderi Island Fort, Sindhudurg Island Fort and Suvarnadurg etc.



- In 2026, World Day of Social Justice was celebrated under the theme "Renewed Commitment to Social Development and Social Justice."




#### Key Points:

- **Background:** The International Labour Organization (ILO) unanimously adopted the ILO Declaration on Social Justice for a Fair Globalization on June 10, 2008.
- It builds on the Philadelphia Declaration of 1944, the Copenhagen Declaration of 1995, and the Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work of 1998.

### Board of Peace

#### Why in News?

- India participated as an observer country in the meeting of the Board of Peace on Gaza, formed by Donald Trump.

#### Key Points:

- Established:** January 2026
- Origin:** It originates from US President Trump's "20-Point Peace Plan for Gaza."
  - This plan was endorsed by the United Nations Security Council through Resolution 2803.
- Objective:** To transform Gaza into a demilitarized and economically stable zone.
- Membership:** It is chaired by the US President. It has an Executive Board of selected global leaders. Its membership is invitation-based.
  - It includes permanent members with fixed tenures and paying fees.

## India-UK Offshore Wind Taskforce

### Why in News?

- India and the United Kingdom launched the India-UK Offshore Wind Taskforce.

### Key Points:

- Formation:** To provide strategic leadership and coordination for the development of the offshore wind energy ecosystem in India, under Vision 2035 and the Fourth India-UK Energy Dialogue.
- Objective:** To intensify cooperation on offshore wind energy projects under the Clean Energy Partnership.
- Key Areas:** Ecosystem planning, market structure, seabed leasing framework and revenue certainty mechanisms.

### Report on Soil Health Degradation in India

#### Why in News?

- This report was released by the Indian Council for Research on International Economic Relations (ICRIER).
- Title of the report: 'Soil Remediation in India: For Improved Crop Health and Human Nutrition'.

#### Key Points:

##### Primary Causes of Soil Degradation

- **Distorted Fertilizer Policy:** Highly subsidized urea (a source of nitrogen) receives over 80% subsidy, while subsidies for phosphorus (P) and potassium (K) are significantly lower. This price difference encourages farmers to overuse nitrogen.
- **Faulty Agricultural Practices:** Intensive tillage, prolonged waterlogging in paddy cultivation, heavy reliance on single-crop farming/monocropping, and burning of crop residues deplete the soil's natural carbon and damage its structure.
- **Widespread Soil Erosion:** Approximately 5.3 billion tons of topsoil is lost annually in India due to water and wind erosion. This leads to the loss of 5.4–8.4 million tons of primary nutrients annually.

## Soil Health Status in India

- **Nitrogen Deficiency:** Nearly 95% of Indian soils lack sufficient nitrogen, the most important primary nutrient for plant growth.
- **Low Organic Carbon:** 75% of Indian soils have soil organic carbon levels below the minimum required limit of 0.75%. This carbon deficiency weakens soil fertility and water-holding capacity.
- **Phosphorus and Potassium Deficiency:** Only 45% of soils have adequate phosphorus. Only 32% of soils have adequate potassium levels.
- **Micronutrient Deficiency:** Nearly half of India's soils are severely deficient in essential micronutrients such as sulfur, boron, and zinc.

### VoicERA and Bhashini

#### Why in News?

- VoicERA was launched at the India AI Impact Summit 2026, on the Bhashini National Language Infrastructure.

#### Key Points:

##### VoicERA

- It is an open-source, end-to-end voice AI stack.
- Developer:** Digital India Bhashini Division.
  - This division operates under the Digital India Corporation of the Union Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY).
- Function:** To serve as a national implementation platform for multilingual voice and language AI.
  - It will expand Bhashini's capabilities beyond translation and language technologies to real-time speech systems, conversation-based AI, and multilingual telephony for more people.

##### Bhashini

- BHASHINI is an AI-powered language translation platform. It increases workforce participation (especially in non-English speaking regions) by bridging literacy, language, and digital gaps.
- Objective:** To make language and technology accessible to all.

## Gas Turbine Engine

### Why in News?


- The Defence Minister visited DRDO's Gas Turbine Research Establishment in Bengaluru and reviewed ongoing indigenous military gas turbine projects, including afterburner testing of the Kaveri engine.

### Key Points:

#### Gas Turbine Engine

- A gas-turbine engine is an internal combustion engine that uses air and fuel to generate electricity by rotating a turbine.
- It consists of a compressor, combustion chamber, and turbine, where air is compressed, fuel is burned at constant pressure, and excess air cools the gases before reaching the turbine.
- Gas turbines are used in aviation (jet propulsion), electrical power generation, and to drive compressors for pipelines.
- The first successful gas turbine was built in Paris in 1903.

- The 'Bharat GI' was recently unveiled at the India AI Impact Summit.

### Key Points:

#### Bharat GI

- It is a major national initiative to showcase India's Unique Geographical Indication (GI) products globally.
- **Initiator:** Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) under the Union Ministry of Commerce and Industry.

## Bio-AI Mulankur

### Why in News?

- Recently, the Union Minister of Science and Technology announced that the government will establish "Bio-AI Mulankur Hubs."

### Key Points:


#### Bio-AI Mulankur Hubs

- Objective:** To develop integrated and closed-loop research platforms where AI-based predictions and laboratory validation work together in a single framework.
- Key sectors:** Genomics diagnostics, biomolecular design, synthetic biology, Ayurveda-based research.
  - All these are in line with the Bio E3 (Biotechnology for Environment, Economy and Employment) policy.
- Implementing Agency:** Department of Biotechnology (DBT) and Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC), Government of India.

## Tetanus and Adult Diphtheria (TD) Vaccine

### Why in News?

- The Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare launched the Tetanus and Adult Diphtheria (TD) Vaccine on February 21, 2026, at the Central Research Institute (CRI), Kasauli, Himachal Pradesh.



### Key Points:

- **Need:** Widespread vaccination of children with DPT group vaccines has significantly reduced diphtheria and tetanus cases in many countries. However, antibody levels may decline over time, especially in diphtheria cases, necessitating a booster dose. In light of this, in 2006, the World Health Organization (WHO) recommended that countries transition from the tetanus toxoid (TT) vaccine to the DT vaccine.
- The National Technical Advisory Group on Immunization (NTAGI), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, has also recommended transitioning from the TT vaccine to the TD vaccine in India's immunization program for all ages, including pregnant women.

- **Objective:** The introduction of the Td vaccine aims to strengthen protection in adolescents and adults and reduce morbidity and mortality associated with vaccine-preventable diseases.
  - **Commercial Production:** Central Drugs Laboratory, Kasauli, Himachal Pradesh
  - **Supply:** Following the launch of the DT vaccine, CRI will supply 5.5 million doses to the Universal Immunization Program (UIP) by April 2026.
  - **Vaccine Composition:** The Td vaccine (Tetanus and Adult Diphtheria Vaccine – Absorbed, Reduced D-antigen Material) provides protection against both tetanus and diphtheria. It is made by combining purified diphtheria toxoid and purified tetanus toxoid. The antigens are adsorbed onto aluminum phosphate, which acts as an adjuvant, and thiomersal is added as a preservative.
- Other important points:**
- **TD vaccine:** The tetanus-diphtheria (TD) vaccine is an injection that provides protection against two diseases – tetanus and diphtheria. It is usually used as a booster shot to provide continued protection after the initial vaccination in childhood.

## Diphtheria

is an infectious bacterial disease. It causes a thick, crusty coating to form in the throat, which can obstruct breathing. Complications of diphtheria include heart failure, paralysis, and even death.

## Tetanus

Tetanus is a bacterial infection that can enter the body through a dirty wound or injury. Tetanus infection, sometimes called jaw stiffness, causes painful muscle stiffness throughout the body.


- **Three Pillars:** The India AI Impact Summit 2026, is guided by three fundamental pillars. These pillars outline the basic principles guiding global cooperation in AI.

## Seven Circles (Working Groups):



1. **Human Capital:** This cycle focuses on building an equitable AI reskilling ecosystem through targeted skills development.
2. **Inclusion for Social Empowerment:** This cycle focuses on ensuring inclusive participation through shared AI solutions and scalable models.

3. **Safe and Trusted AI:** This cycle focuses on translating global principles of responsible AI into practical and interoperable safety and governance frameworks.
  4. **Resilience, Innovation, and Efficiency:** This cycle focuses on addressing the environmental and resource challenges posed by large-scale AI systems that could exacerbate the global AI divide.
  5. **Science:** This cycle focuses on addressing the environmental and resource challenges posed by large-scale AI systems that could exacerbate the global AI divide.
  6. **Democratization of AI Resources:** This cycle envisions a global AI ecosystem where everyone has equitable and affordable access to the fundamental tools for AI development.
  7. **AI for Economic Growth and Social Well-Being:** This round explores ways to harness the potential of AI for truly inclusive development, as well as identify and support high-impact use cases that can serve as role models of AI for both economic progress and social good.
- **Three Global Impact Challenges:** Key highlights of the Summit include three Global Impact Challenges—AI for ALL, AI by HER, and YUVAi—as follows:
1. **AI for ALL:** The Global Impact Challenge aims to identify AI solutions with large-scale impact. It is being implemented by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, and the Digital India Language Division, in partnership with Startup India.
  2. **AI by HER:** The Global Impact Challenge aims to foster women-led innovation in AI. It is being organized in collaboration with the Women Entrepreneurship Platform of NITI Aayog.
  3. **YUVAi:** The Global Youth Challenge aims to encourage young innovators to develop AI solutions to address real problems. This challenge, open to youth aged 13–21, is being conducted in collaboration with My India and the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology.

  - iv. **A – Accessible and Inclusive:** AI should act as a multiplier for societal benefits, not as a monopoly concentrated in a few hands.
  - v. **V – Lawful and Legal Systems:** AI systems and their applications should be lawful, verifiable, and trustworthy.
- 5. **Pax Silica Initiative:** On the fifth day of the India AI Impact Summit 2026, India formally joined the Pax Silica alliance, a significant milestone towards strengthening strategic technology and supply chain cooperation between India and the United States.
  - o **Launch:** This is a US-led strategic initiative launched in December 2025, to build a secure, resilient, and innovation-driven silicon supply chain.
  - o **Objective:** To reduce China's dominance and counter coercive dependency in critical minerals, energy sources, semiconductors, advanced manufacturing, AI infrastructure, and logistics.
  - o **Members:** Pax Silica's member countries included Australia, Greece, Israel, Japan, Qatar, the Republic of South Korea, Singapore, the United Arab Emirates, and the United Kingdom.

## Other Key Points:

### Current AI Ecosystem in India:

- More than 6 million people are employed in the technology and AI ecosystem. It is estimated that the AI-skilled workforce in India will exceed 1.25 million by 2027, reflecting strong demand in the fields of data science, AI engineering, and analytics.
- There are approximately 1.8 lakh startups in the country, and approximately 89% of new startups launched last year used AI in their products or services.
- India scores 2.45/4 on the NASSCOM AI Adoption Index, indicating that 87% of enterprises are actively using AI solutions.
- Leading sectors in AI adoption are: industrial and automotive, consumer goods and retail, banking, financial services and insurance, and healthcare. Together, these sectors contribute approximately 60% of the total value of AI.
